# Military School Proposed 55 Miles East of Columbia

A few alumni of Virginia Military Institute propose to re-establish a traditional

all-male military academy near Shelbyville, TN, 55 miles east of Columbia.

The organizing group, headed by Mike Guthrie, has signed a contract on the property and is

presently working on financing. Mike is a Class of '77 VMI graduate.

### **Southern Military Institute**

The new institute is called the Southern Military Institute and will be a 4-year college modeled after VMI. SMI will also seek to preserve elements of the southern traditions that once were part VMI and of The Citadel, as well as some of those of West Point.

The Shelbyville location is a hilly, wooded property that includes a bluff along the Duck River and a large farmhouse that could be converted into a lodge or classrooms.

### **Columbia Heights**

The property will be named *Columbia Heights* in honor of the Columbia Military Academy and Castle Heights. So that the school be referred to as the Southern Military Institute *at Columbia Heights*.

Guthrie said the curriculum initially would be geared toward qualifying graduates to become officers in the Army

Reserve and National Guard, although there is no connection between SMI and these services.


### **Target: 1,200 Students**

The SMI founders envision the enrollment eventually growing to about 1,200 cadets. Guthrie says it will probably be the fall 2004 before SMI begins admitting cadets and starts its first classes. He expects 30 students to be enrolled initially and more than 100 have expressed interest.

#### No Federal Money

Guthrie said the school would not be accepting any federal or state funding, so administrators are confident they can keep the school completely independent.

The institute will be unique among colleges and universities, not only in its military and southern traditions, but also in the fact that it will be a small Christian engineering-science college and one of only three all-male colleges remaining within the United States.

Virginia Women's Institute (VWIL) in Virginia is currently the only single-gender 4-year military program remaining in the United States.

### **Physically Taxing Program**

"The new cadets can expect to participate in forced marches, pugil stick fights, high-level entries into water, obstacle courses, rappelling, rock climbing and runs up to five miles," says SMI's website.

Young men of any race or creed desiring to place their name on the list to be contacted as potential cadets for the first class at SMI, may do so by submitting their name by contacting SMI HQ as directed in the admissions section of the prospective school's website at: www.south-mil-inst.org

SMI is currently trying to raise \$500,000 in Tennessee and the mid-South area to open the school and set a goal to raise and additional \$1-million within 18 months."
