In most cases it is based on the contributions and impacts the individual has made in service to the nation, society, school and association. Woody Pettigrew said he had the procedures if anyone was interested. Also, Rob Zimmerman proposed that Ernest Allen be considered for recognition by the Association. Coach Allen was approved for a recognition certificate.

CMA Museum Opens For August Reunion

The CMA Museum project continues its path for completion in time for the August 2, Reunion Opening.

We are into Phases 2 and 3 of the project with the inside clean-up completed and refurbishing efforts underway. The decision was made to do everything we can to ensure an adequate environment for the preservation of artifacts and, as a result, central heat and air are being installed.

Controlled Environment

While we may not have "needed" such comforts as Cadets, the artifacts will be better off in this environment.

We have also completed installing appropriate lighting and have completed updating the bathroom and finalizing carpentry work inside the building. We are now determining which artifacts to display, how to

Tax Exempt Status – Don Kimbrell reported to the Association that his Son-in-Law had been working taxes for clients over the last two months and had not been able to complete the necessary work on our forms. Now that his workload is has slowed down he should be able to finish our forms over the next few months. All the work done continues to be "Pro Bono" by Don's son-in-law.

Class Realignment

Bobby Bain reported on the class realignment project. He showed a graphic of the Board by classes and dues paying members. The idea was that the classes with more dues paying members should be better represented on the board. However as classes get older the number of members who could be dues paying members would go down thus penalizing them based on class size and not on the fact that the members don't pay.

A proposal was made to have an "at large" board member category so that those larger classes with more dues paying members can have additional representation to the board. The motion carried and the a proposed change to the By-laws will be provided to the board members by 1 June so they can be reviewed and the board can vote on the proposed change at the 1 August Board meeting; this procedure meets the requirements for changing the By-laws.

Museum Project

Woody Pettigrew reported on the Museum Project. He said that the contract with Columbia Academy was signed on November 1, 2007. He said that significant work had been done on the roof, porch, and inside. The estimate for the roof work was \$15,135 but additional work was asked for in the process (metal beams on roof, improved shingles) and the total project ended up at a little over \$21,000. Woody and Dicky Thompson (CMA graduate whose company did the work) came to an arrangement where we would pay \$17,135 for the work (\$2000 over the estimate) and would give Dicky credit for an "in kind" donation of a little over \$4000 to cover the difference. Woody went on to note that the committee would meet this afternoon to review some proposals made by John Gruber on the set up and interior motif of the Museum. John's proposal costs approximately \$26,000 and we had approximately budgeted \$33,000. Woody anticipates that we will go with John's proposal for the Museum as we discuss it at the committee meeting this afternoon. The meeting will be open to the board should anyone want to attend. Woody then covered all the costs to date and he has these available for review on request. The Museum will be ready in time for the reunion in August 2006.

New Business

A Nominating Committee under Tom Walbert was formed to put a slate of officers together for the August Reunion.

Reunion Planning – Propose to have a theme for the reunion each year in hopes of getting more alumni to participate. This year the reunion will recognize alumni who were career military or attended service academies or were veterans of a war.

A form will be e-mailed to fill out on military service by CMA alumni. Other groups such as Battalion Commanders may be recognized in the future. Rob Zimmerman will head up a committee to put this program together. He will be assisted by Jack Walker and Ron Nall.

Registration will need volunteers to assist. Contact Robin Saltze at: frsalze66@yahoo.com if interested..

Alumni items need to be collected to be put in the Museum. We will also need to collect the items in Mrs. Grimes office. Woody will try to locate these items through Columbia Academy. The items will be catalogued and placed in the Museum.

A proposal was made to update the banners on the Quadrangle. \$3000 was approved for the update.


