jor's campus home, and admired and respected by the entire battalion as well as his colleagues, Major Harris was always willing to give timely advice and assistance to all who asked.




Major Harris is no longer here at Columbia Military Academy but is well remembered by those who knew him.








RIFLE TEAM




GOLD STAR DRILL PLATOON


The cadet band participated in the Christmas Parades of Nashville and Columbia and gave a fine showing in both. It also participated in several other parades through downtown Columbia.


1954 FOOTBALL AT C. M. A.

The 1954 Bulldogs started practice early in September under new Head Coach Lawson, and Assistant Coach Lynch. There were five returning regulars from the '53 team in Bobby Halliburton, David Ray, Jim Poe, Marshall Cranford, and Jimmy Bass. David Ray and Jim Poe were elected Captains.

The Bulldogs, after dropping the first two games to the Sewanee Bees and Notre Dame, got on the victory march, winning six games from Tennessee Military Institute, Castle Heights, Baxter Seminary, Westminster, M.T.S.C. Bees, and Darlington. The Bulldogs were nosed out one point by Richmond Academy and lost to Mc-Callie, who became Mid-South Champs.

This 6-4 season won Mid-South Runner Up honors for the team and placed end David Ray and quarterback Bobby Shackelford on the All Mid-South team. Center Doug Bigham was named to the second team and guard Marshall Cranford, tackle Julian Hillery, and fullback Bobby Halliburton made Honorable Mention All Mid-South. The Bulldogs had the best season since 1949.

C.M.A. 6; Sewanee "B" 8

The Bulldogs took the opening kickoff and a Shackel-ford-to-Ray pass moved the ball into scoring position where Bobby Halliburton carried it over. The second quarter showed fine defensive ball playing by both teams. Late in the third period the Bulldogs were caught behind their own goal line, giving the Bees two points. This lit the spark and the Bees quickly returned with a T. D., placing them ahead 8 to 6. Late in the fourth quarter the Big Blue threatened to break ahead, but a Sewanee goal line stand halted the Bulldogs.

C.M.A. 13; Notre Dame 25


Notre Dame forced C.M.A. to punt early in the first quarter, and, several plays later, the Irish scored. Bobby Shackelford received the kickoff and returned it to the 25. Then Randall Henderson raced 39 yards to tie the score. Late in the second quarter Shackelford's pass to Ray was intercepted and carried all the way to put Notre Dame in the lead 13 to 6. The third period showed fine defensive playing by the Bulldogs. Bigham intercepted an Irish pass and raced 47 yards to again tie the game. Notre Dame tallied in the last of the third period and intercepted a Bulldog pass in the fourth to go all the way. The Greenies kept a two touchdown lead.

C.M.A. 14; T.M.I. 13

The Bulldogs started a 60-yard drive early in the first quarter. The ball was moved to the 10, where Bobby Halliburton carried it over. After a fine exhibition of defensive playing, the first half ended with C.M.A. in the lead 7 to 0. The T.M.I. team returned and drove the ball 80 yards to score. The ball changed hands several times. Finally Randall Henderson broke loose, giving C.M.A. their second tally. T.M.I. scored again in the last of the fourth. Shackelford took the kickoff to the T.M.I. 40. Halliburton received a 30-yard pass from Shackelford, but he was stopped at the 7 as the game ended with the Bulldogs on top 14 to 13.

C.M.A. 26; C.H.M.A. 13

The C.H.M.A. Tigers scored first on a pass play; however, the Bulldogs quickly returned the tally as David Ray took the ball all the way on an end around. Late in the second quarter, after a 75 yard scoring drive led by the fine running of Bobby Halliburton and the superior quarterbacking of Bobby Shackelford, Halliburton crossed the stripe. Early in the third quarter, a Height's sub picked up a C.M.A. fumble and raced 50 yards for the second and last score of C.H.M.A. Ray again took the ball on an end around; this time going 21 yards to make the score 20 to 13. Early in the fourth period Ray intercepted a Height's pass to score again. The Bulldogs piled up more than 300 yards, and they had 10 more first downs than Heights.







C.M.A. 12; McCallie 26

The Bulldogs took an early lead as David Ray juggled a pass from Bobby Shackelford and sped across for the tally. The Blue Tornadoes quickly returned the ball with a series of short drives to put them ahead 7 to 6. Midway through the second quarter Bobby Shackelford raced 50 yards on a bootleg play to put the Bulldogs 7 points ahead in the third quarter. The fourth quarter showed little action; however, the Bulldogs threatened to score once, but the McCallie defense was too strong. The game ended with McCallie ahead 26 to 12.


C.M.A. 14; Westminster 13

The Bulldogs squeezed out a win over a strong Westminster team in Atlanta, Friday afternoon. The Wildcat's kickoff return plus a 25 yard pass and a 32 yard run set up their first touchdown on the C.M.A. fifteen, from where they pushed it across. The extra was missed. Two series of downs later, Westminster scored on a pass, and this time the extra was good. The half ended with the score 13 to 0, Westminster. The Bulldogs were fired up after the half, and on the first play of the last quarter Bobby Shackelford scampered 40 yards around end for the score, and then kicked the placement, making the score 13 to 7, Westminster. The defense tightened after this, and Doug Bigham recovered a fumble. The Bulldogs moved to the one, and Bass scored, with Shackelford again converting. The Bulldogs managed to run the clock out for the victory. A big factor in the win was the hard work of the forward wall.

C.M.A. 53; Baxter 0

The Bulldogs traveled to Baxter Seminary to play in a sea of mud. Jay Abel crossed the goal line for the first C.M.A. touchdown minutes after the opening kickoff. "Babe" Bass went over for the extra. After this early touchdown, the Bulldogs turned the game into a field day, with Abel scoring three more touchdowns, David Ray three, and "Ollie" Clark one. Bobby Shackelford and Jimmy Mays furnished the extra points by placement and on the ground. The game was a real team victory, with all of the subs getting into the action. The strong defense of the Bulldogs completely throttled the Baxter Bees.





C.M.A. 18; Richmond 19

The Bulldogs journeyed to Augusta, Ga., to meet the highly regarded Richmond, Musketeers, in A.R.C. Stadium. Shackelford tossed thirty-five vards to Ray for the first score. The extra was wide. Ray on an end around went to the one to set up the next touchdown made by Shackelford. The extra was no good. The half ended 12-0, C.M.A. In the third period Shackelford's pass was intercepted and ran back to the two. Richmond scored from there, making the score 12-6. A thirty-five yard pass by the Musketeers went to the C.M.A. five. They scored on the next play, the extra was wide. A Bulldog fumble gave the ball to Richmond on the twenty-five. A wide lateral scored for Richmond and the extra was good. The score was 12-19, Richmond. Ray went forty yards around end for the final marker, making it 18-19, Richmond. C.M.A. 19; Darlington 13







W R E S T L I N G




TRACK


