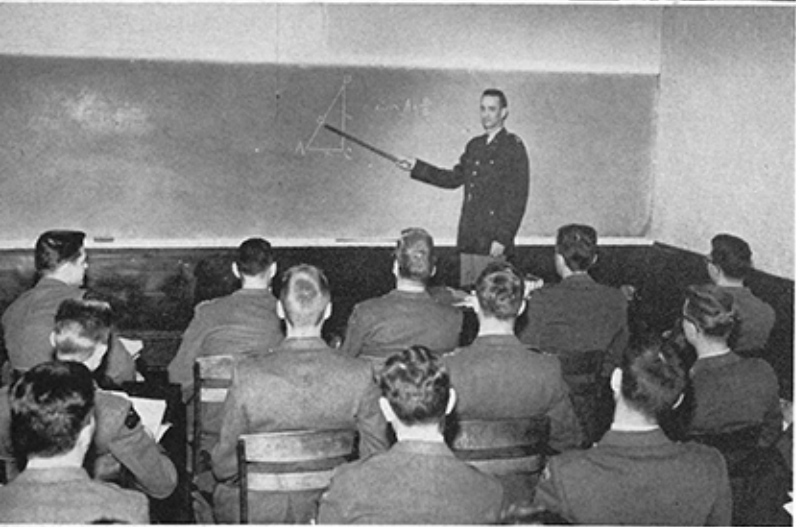








TO A MAN WE ADMIRE . . .

The annual staff extends its heartiest congratulations to these chosen cadets.

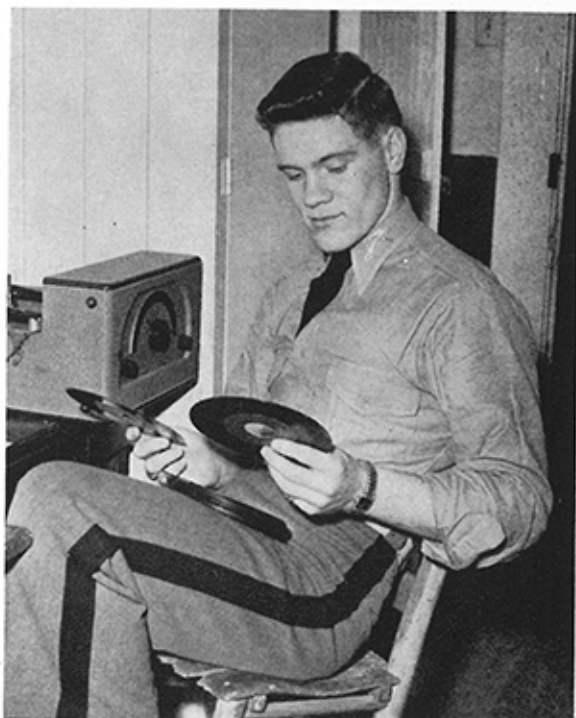

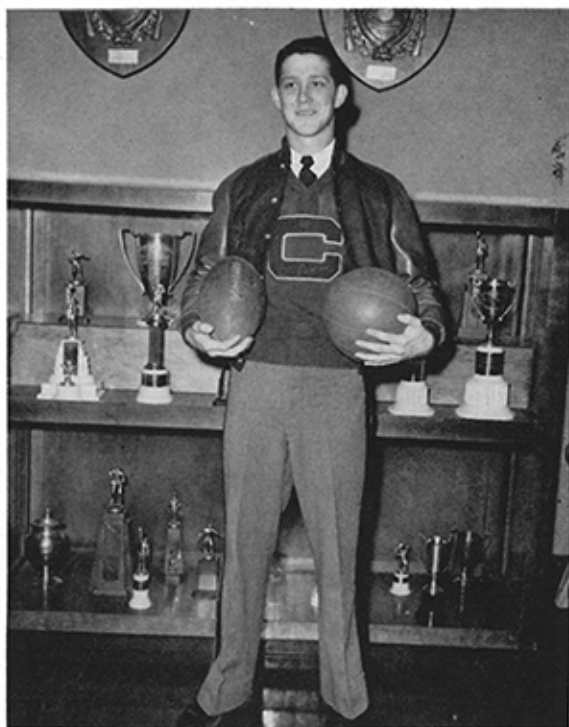

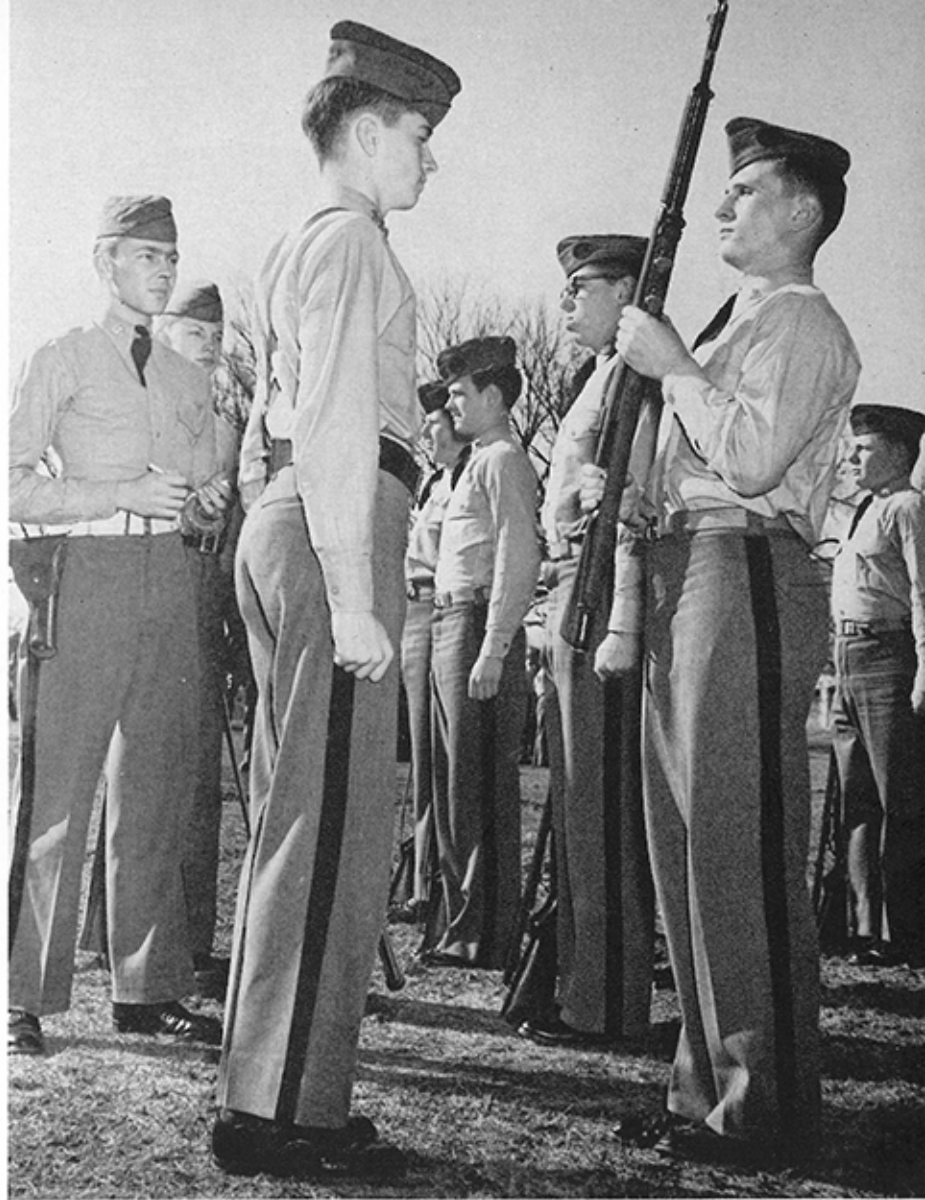
CALL, entirely free from campus politics.

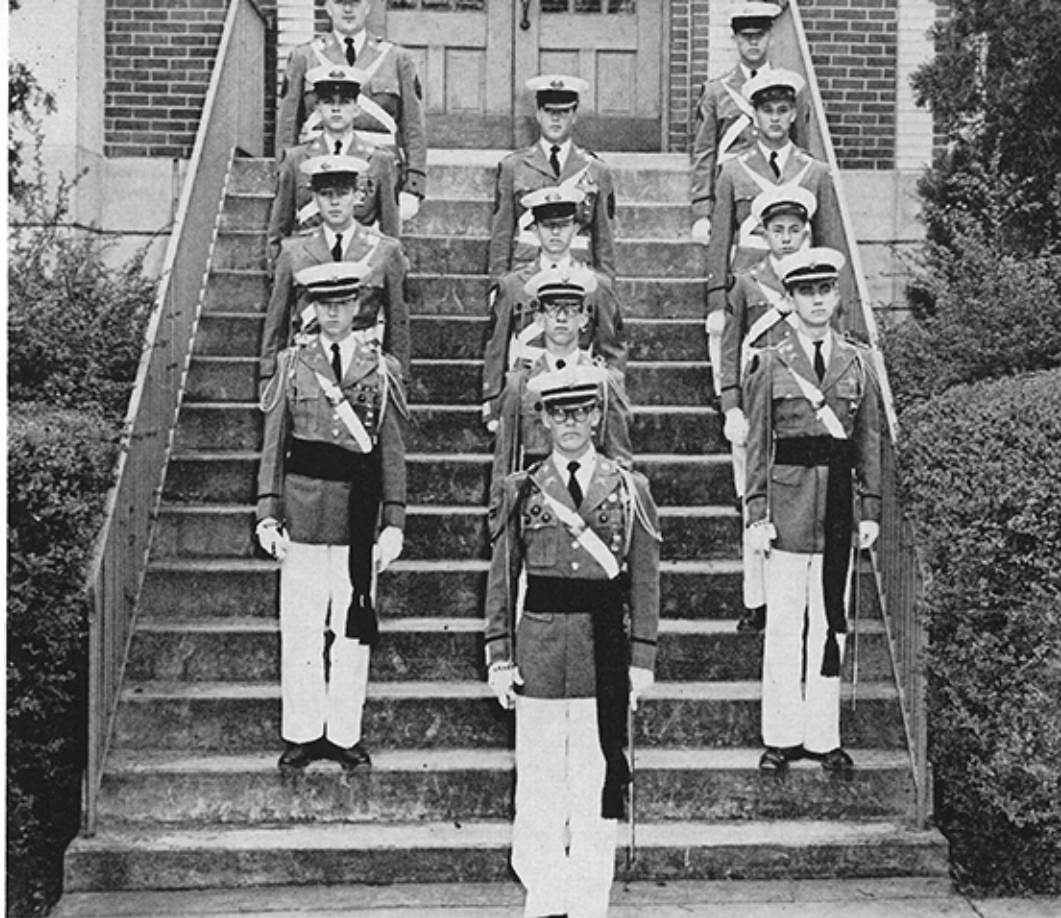

The military department should be commended for the excellent guidance it displayed throughout the school year.

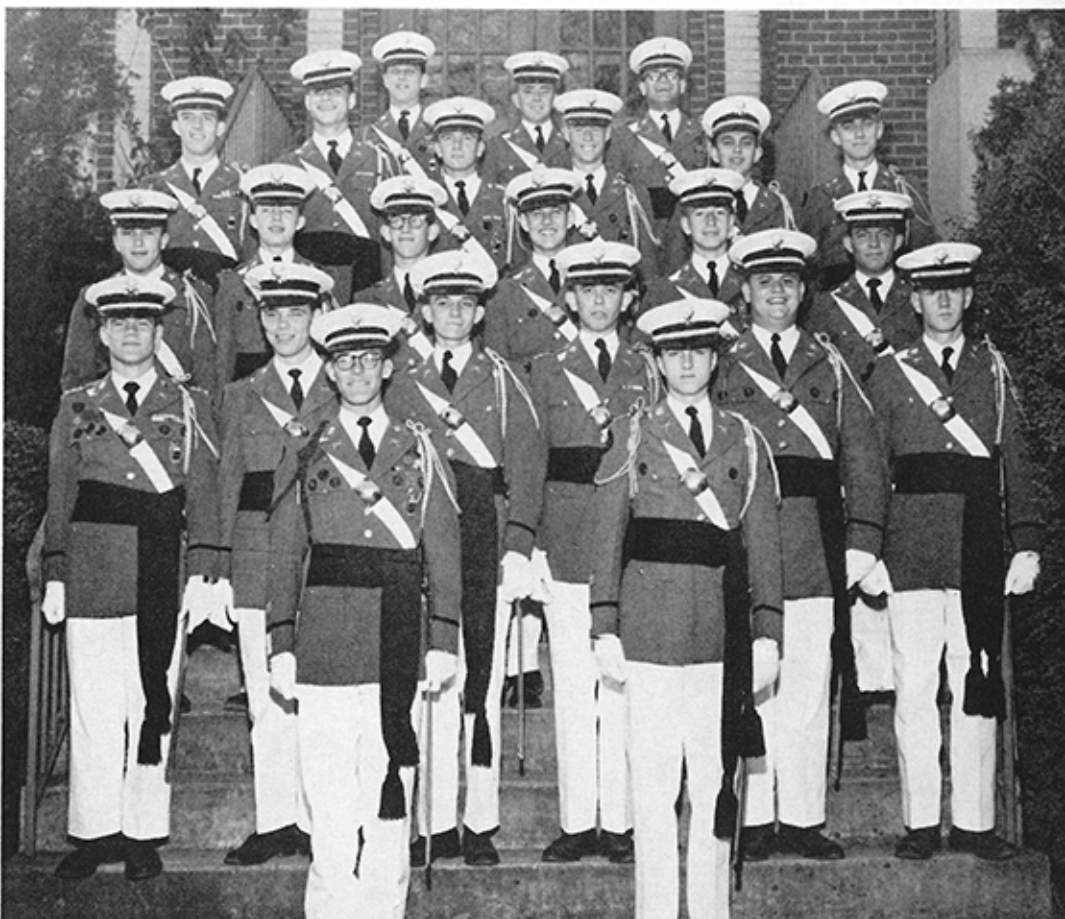

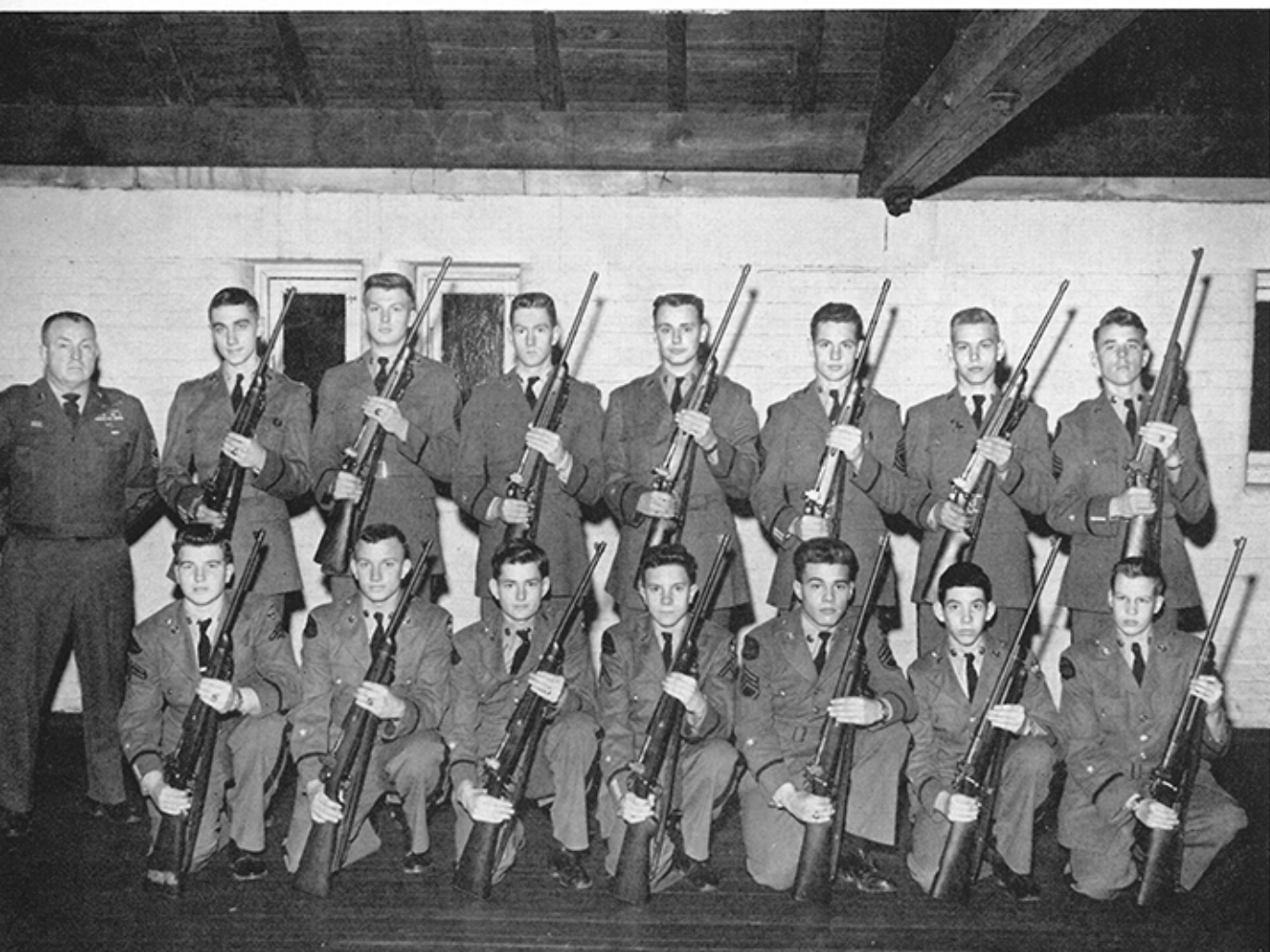
THE RIFLE TEAM

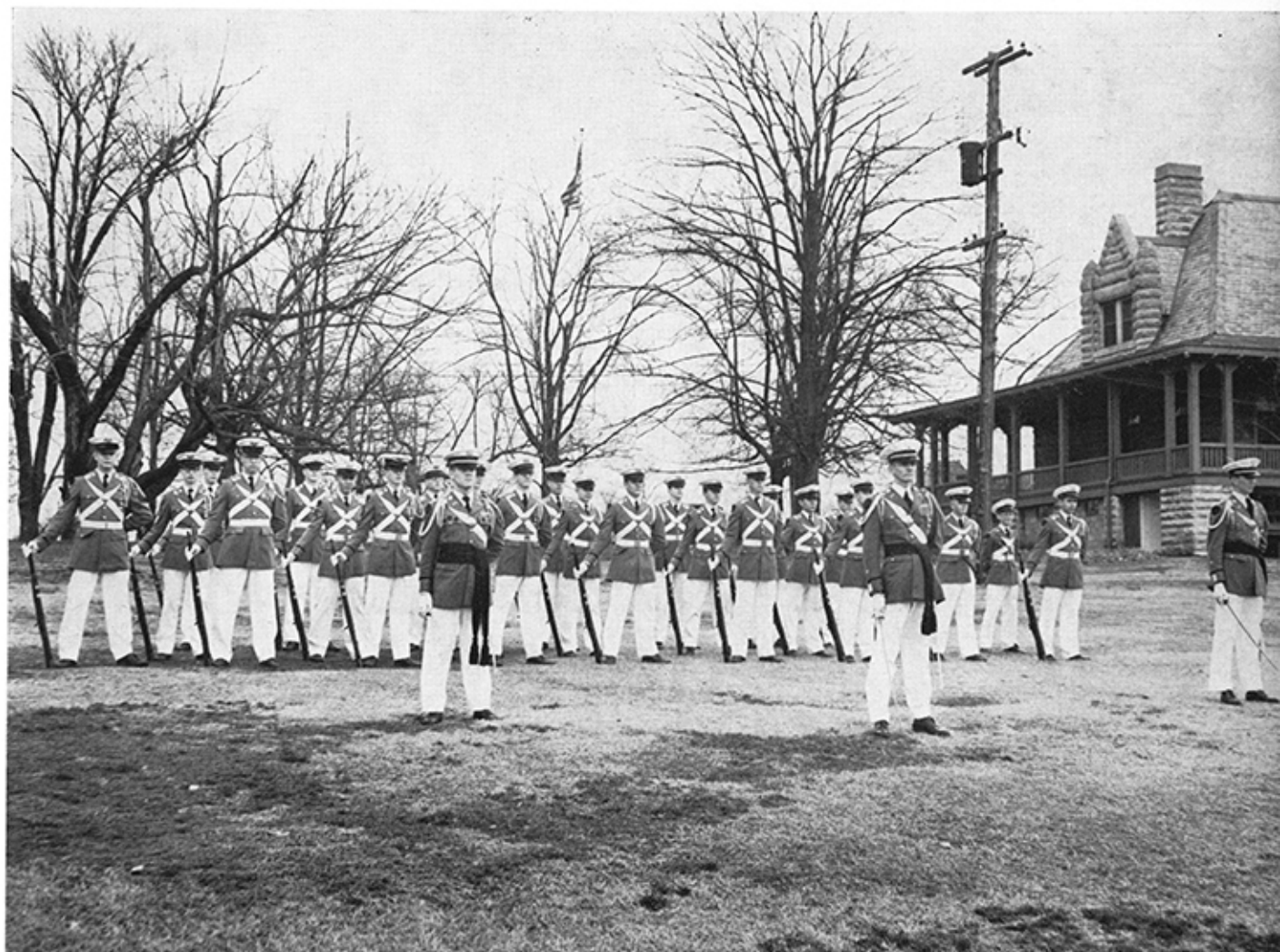


GOLD STAR DRILL PLATOON

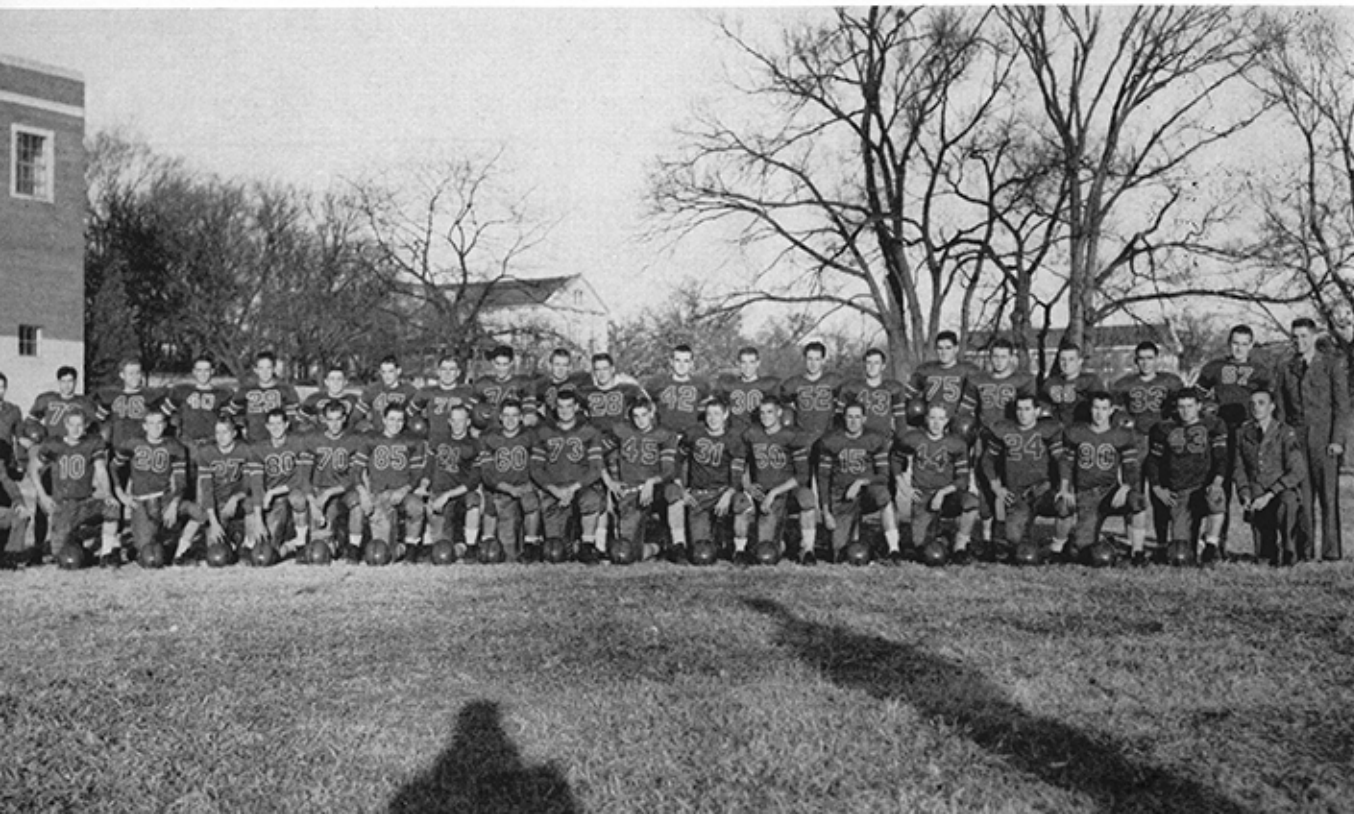
THE 1955-56 MID-SOUTH

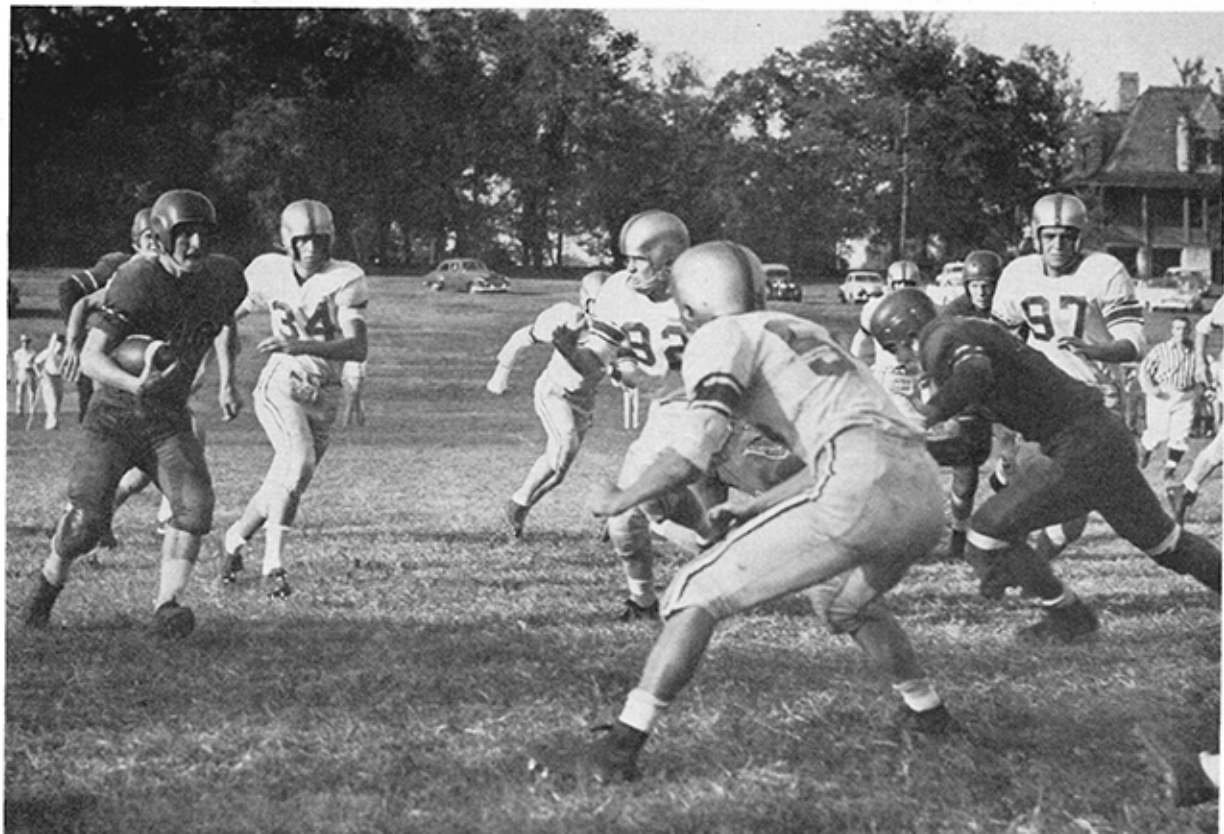

Tony Sciotto, Bill Hayes, Davis Couch, Tommy Bratten, and Gwin Scott returned from the 1954 "B" team.



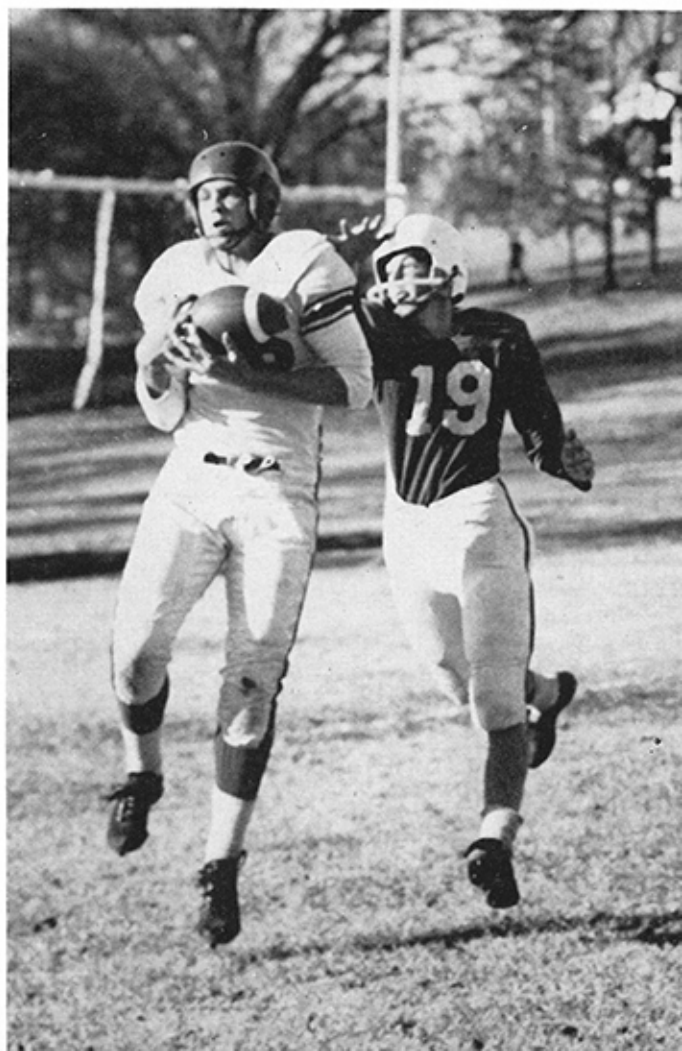


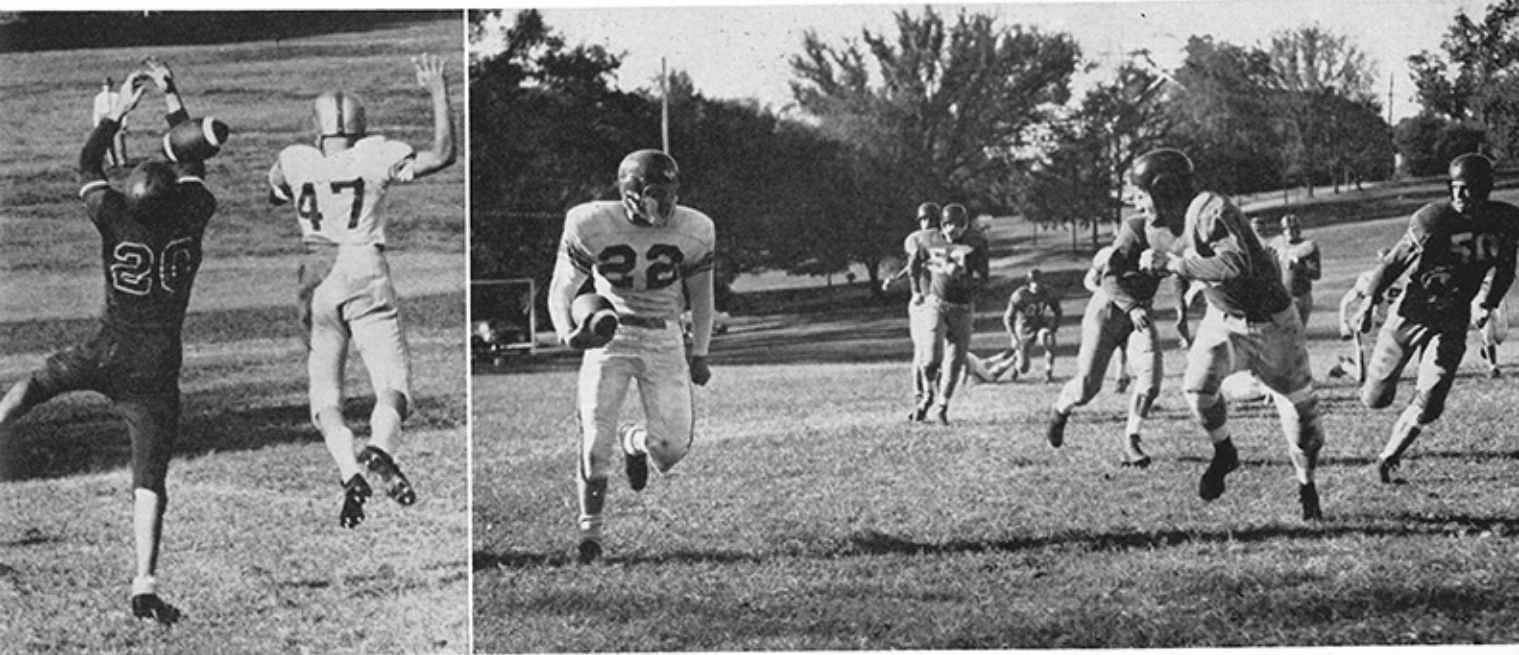
C.M.A. 19; DARLINGTON 6

C.M.A. 13; CASTLE HEIGHTS 0

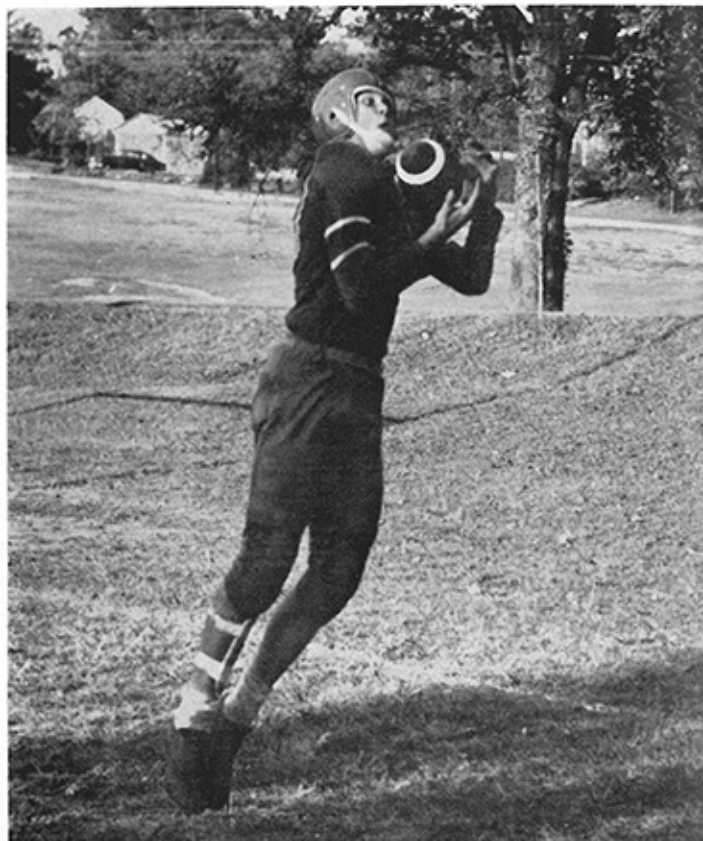
The CMA "Bulldogs" defeated the Castle Heights Military Academy "Tigers" in Castle Heights' Homecoming game 13 to 0.

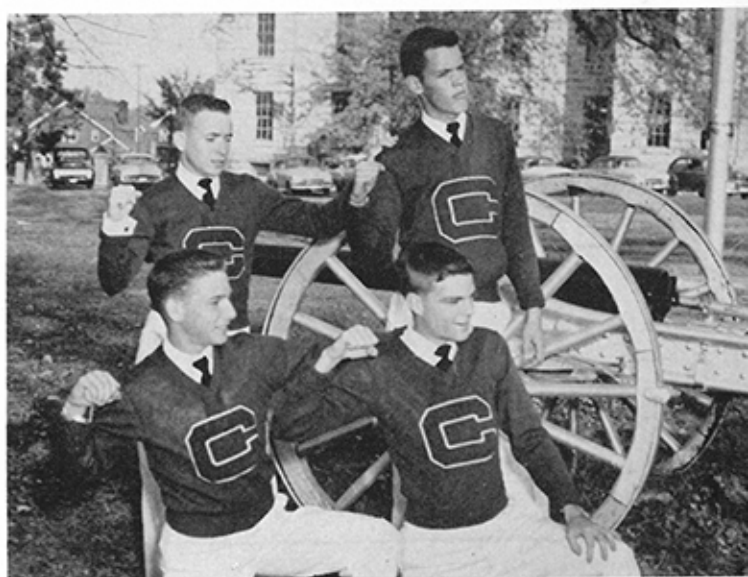
C.M.A. 28; SEWANEE "B" 0

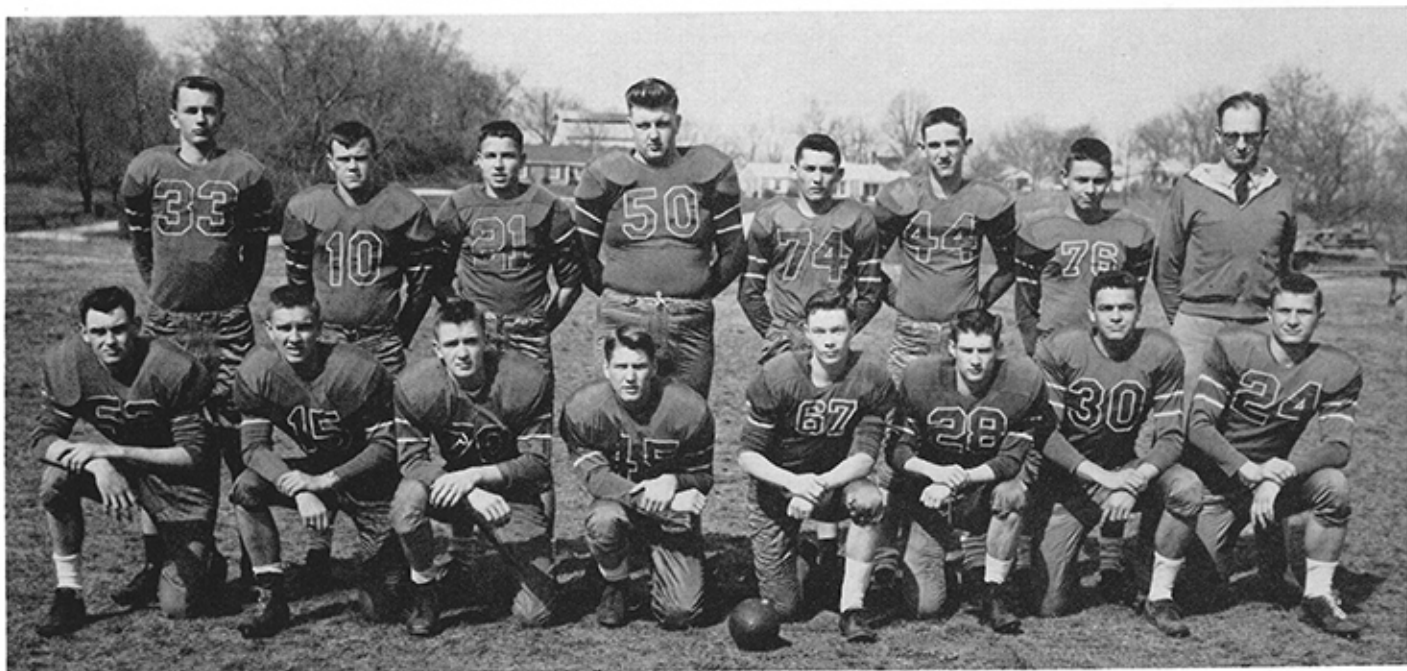
