THE VALEDICTORIAN

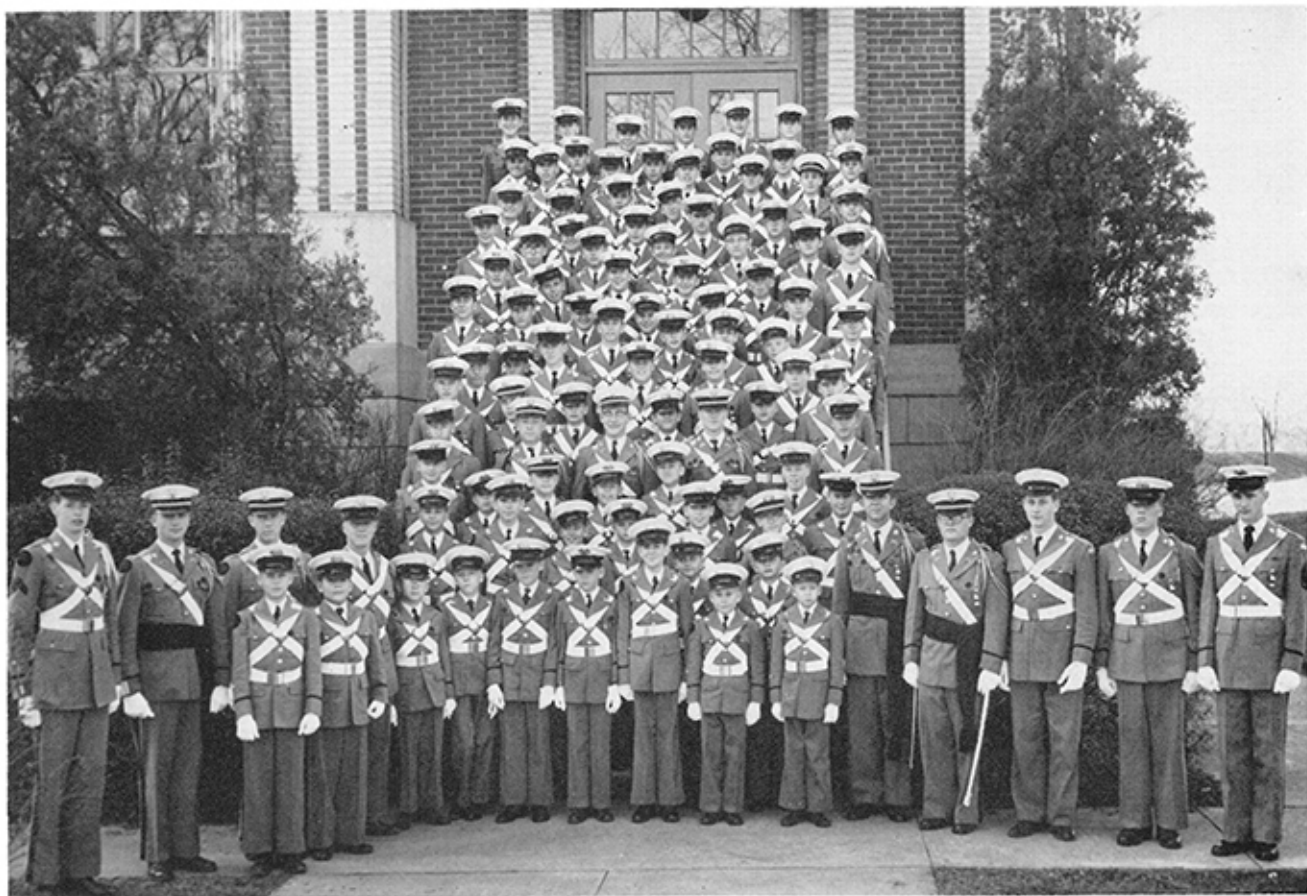

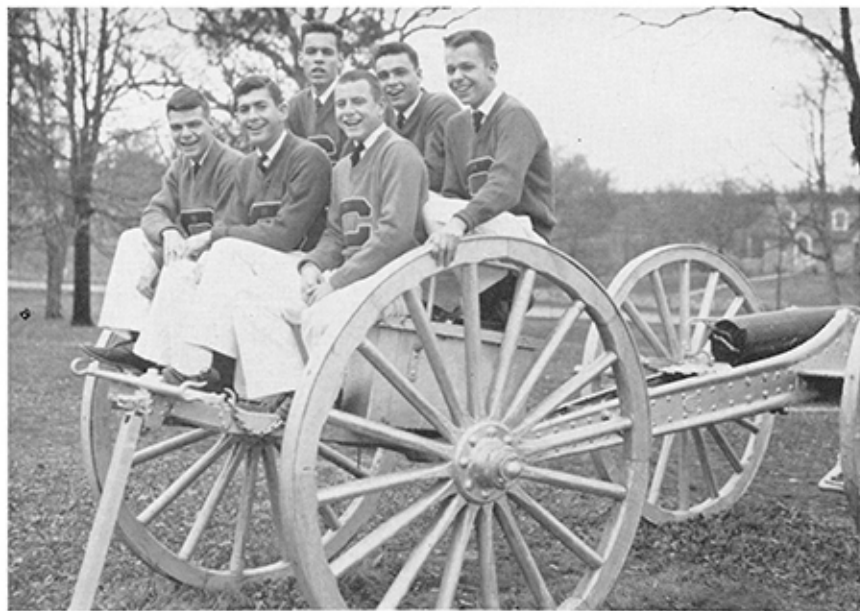
Among other honors bestowed on the band was the invitation to play for Vice-President Nixon on his campaign trip to Nashville, Tennessee

THE CHEER LEADERS

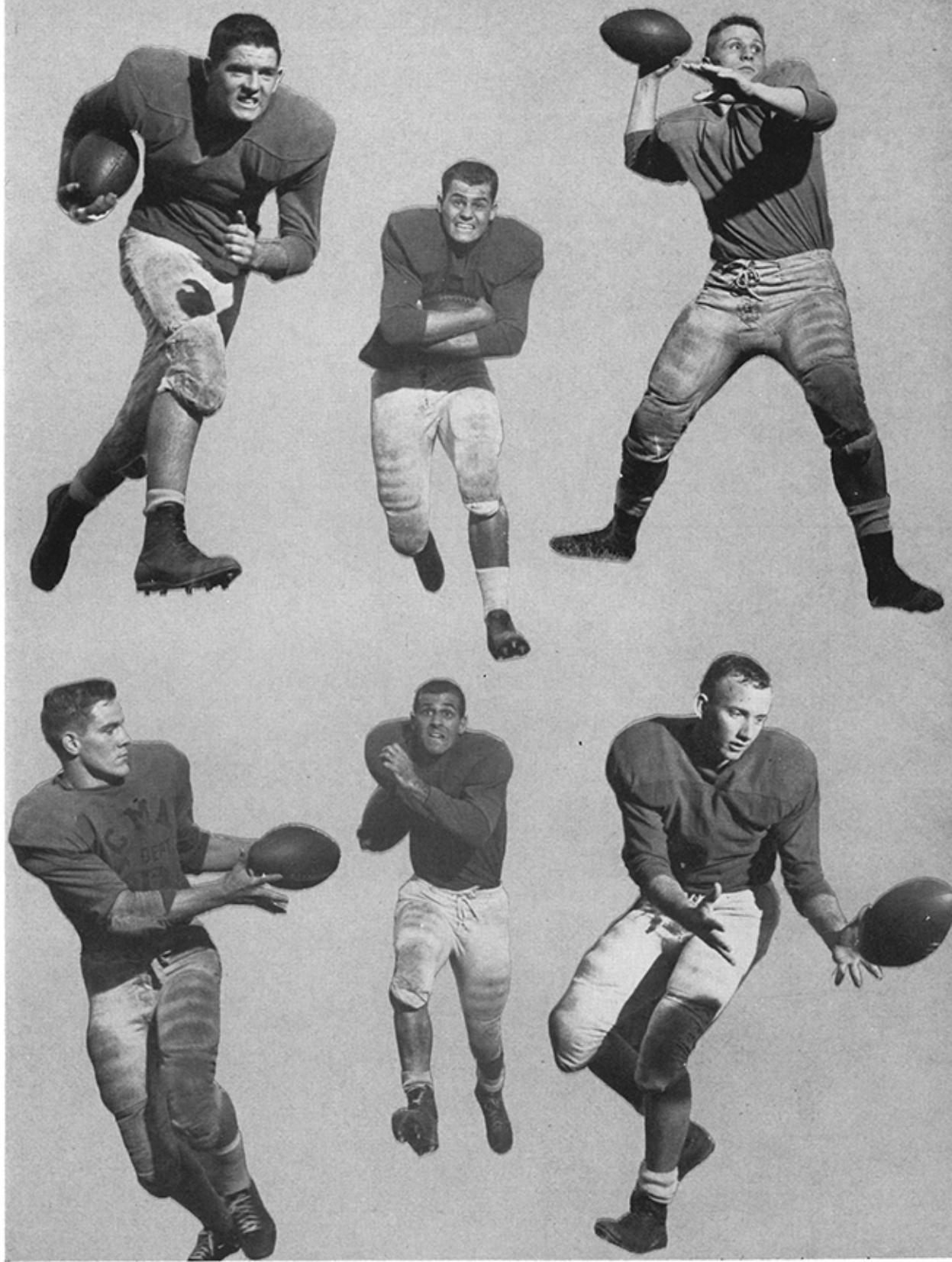

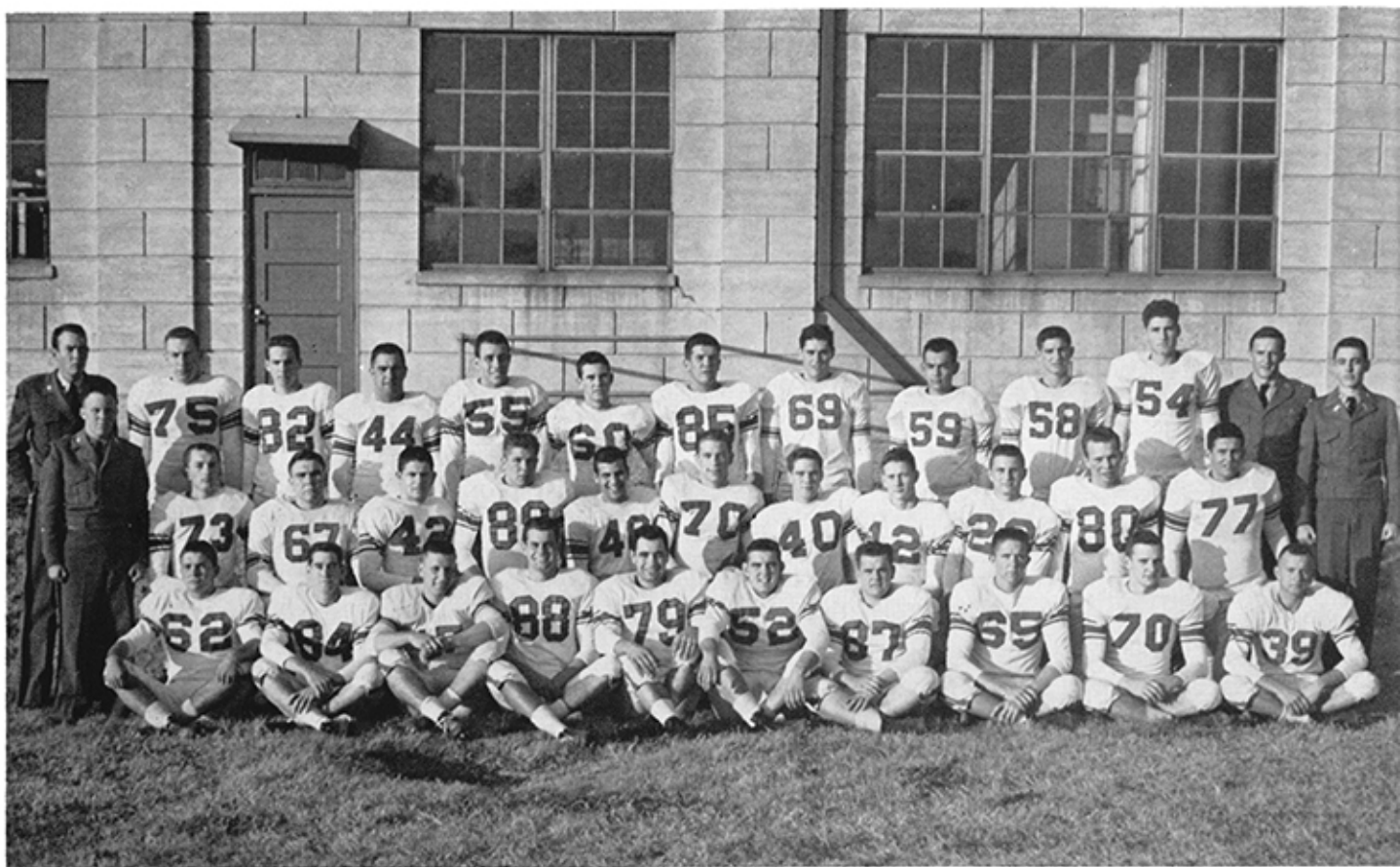

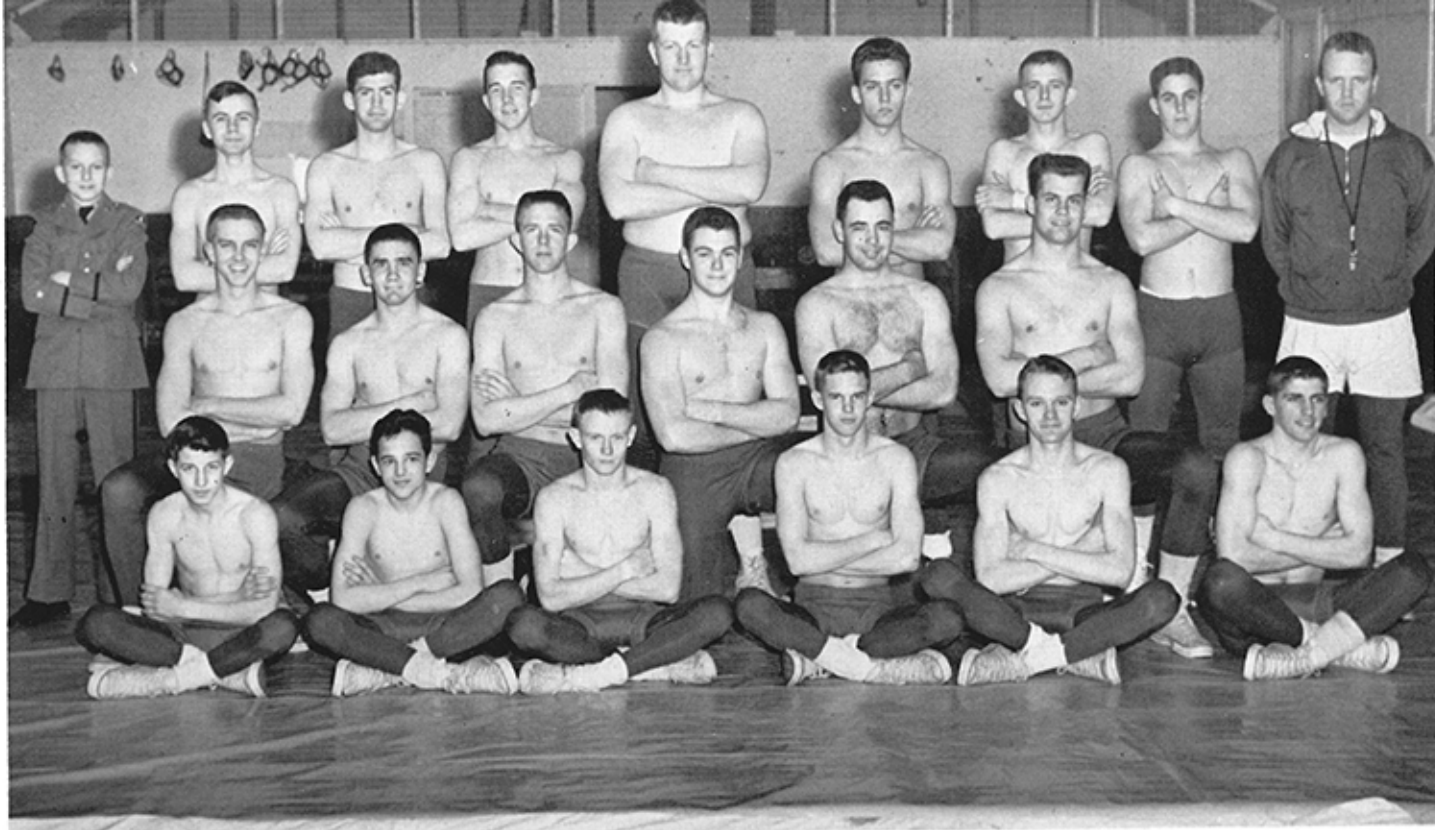
The 1957 "Baby Bulldogs" after fine spirited play all season climaxed a winning season by winning the division title and finishing second in the Mid-South conference.

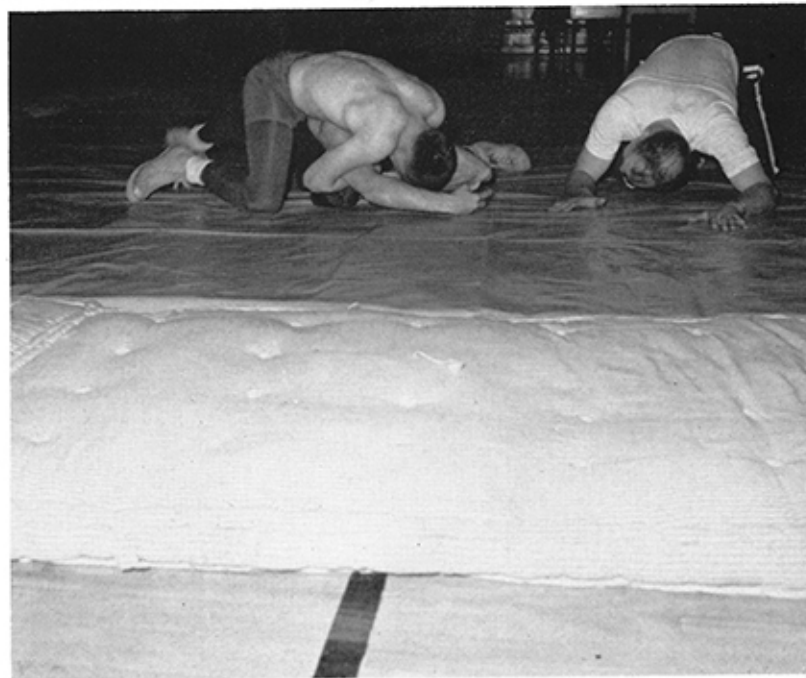

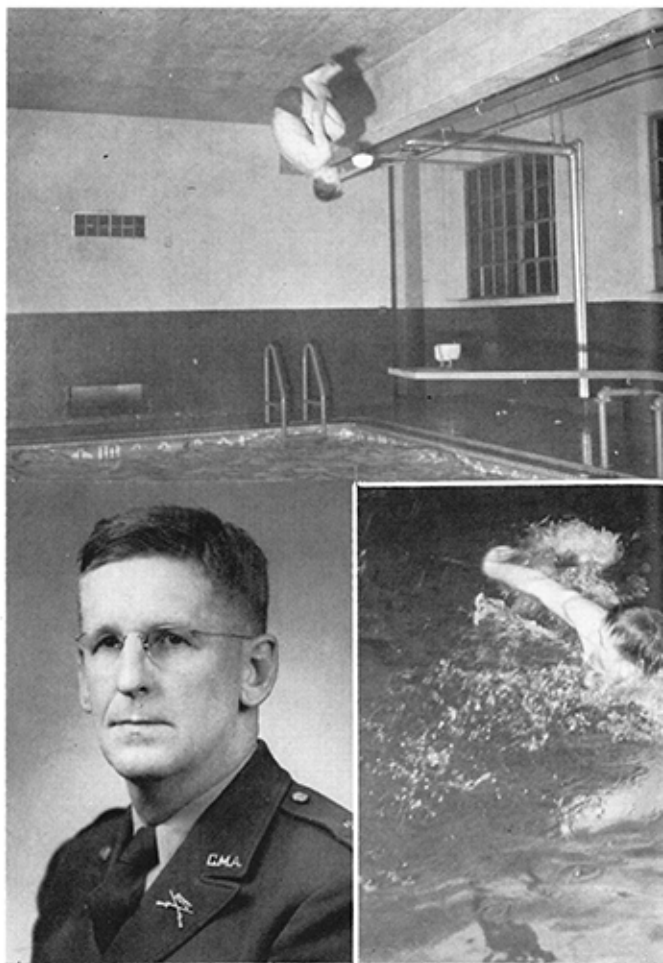
