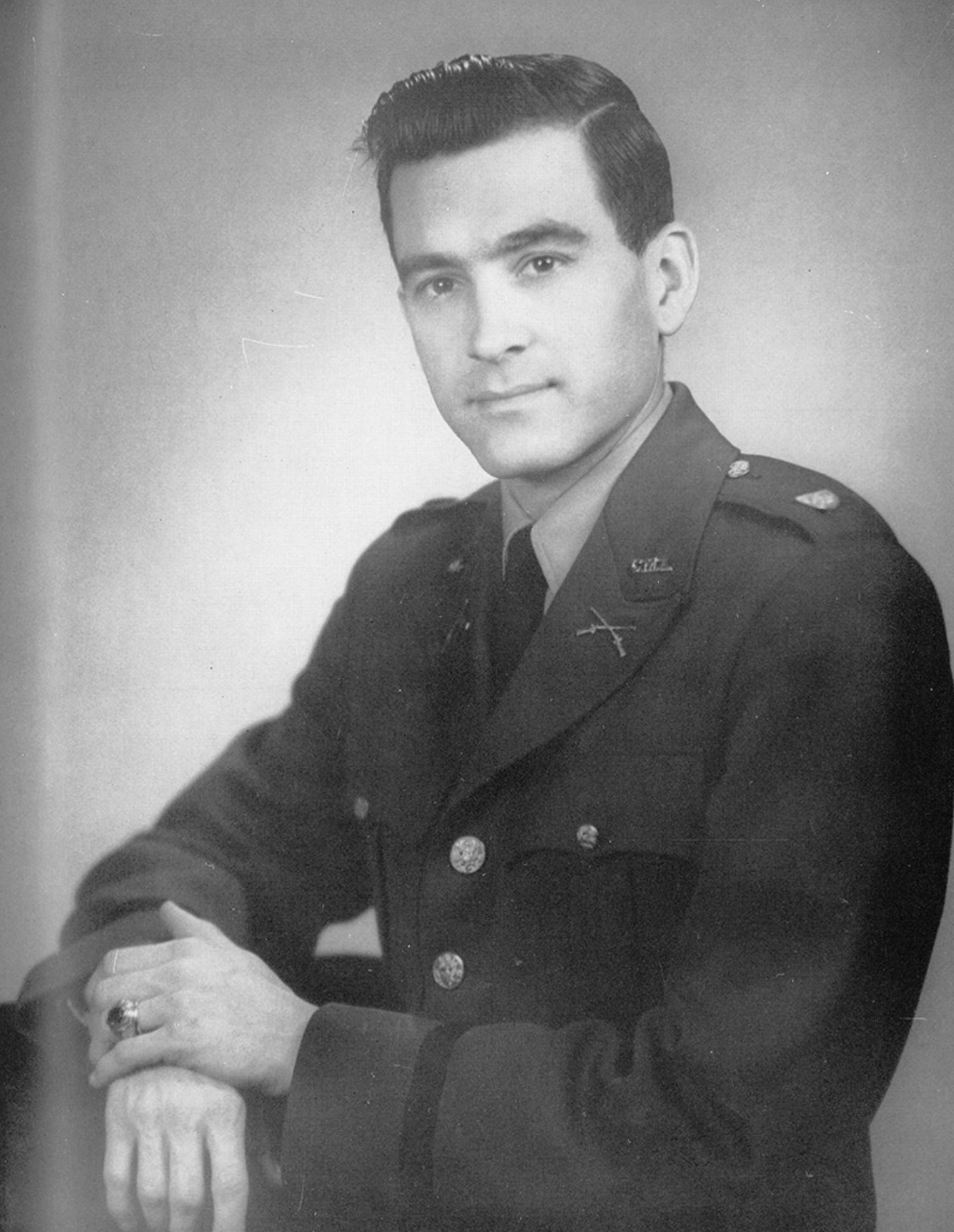
Major Cauchon is the Band Director, Head of the Science Department, Physics and Trigonometry Instructor, Dance Committee Ad-

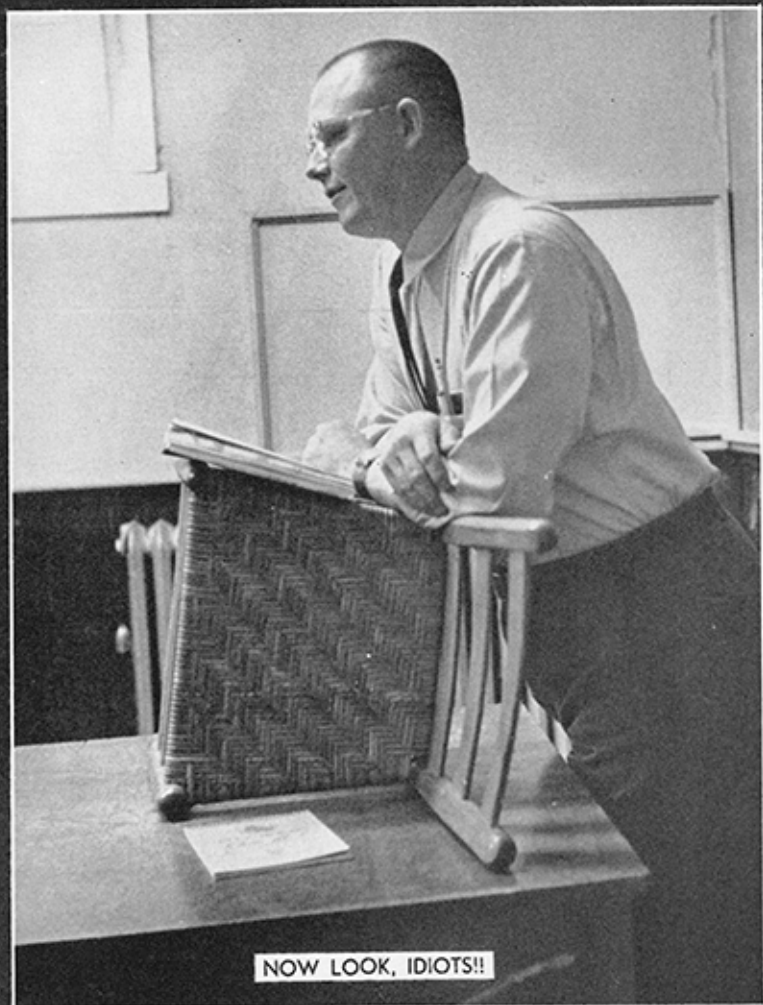

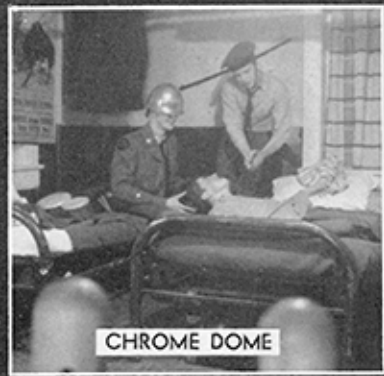

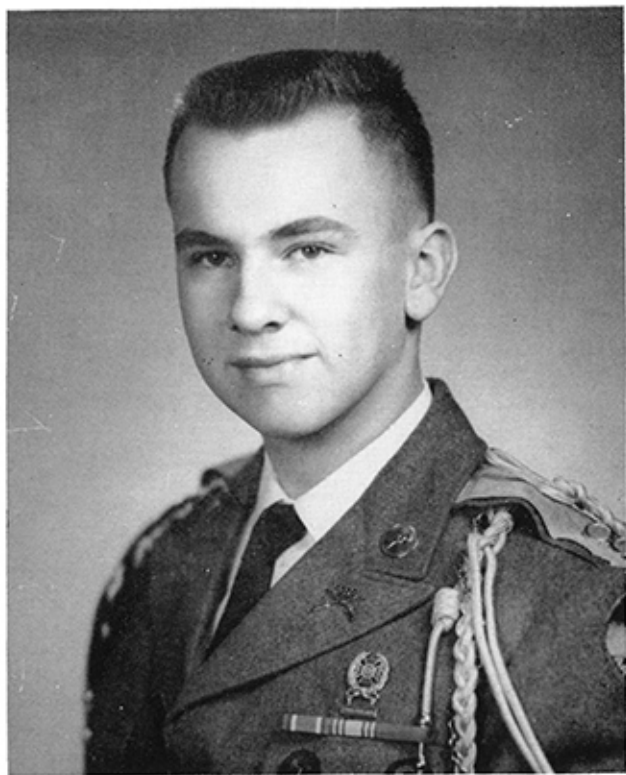


VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN

manifested a great interest in drill and have spent many hours perfecting precision drill movements.

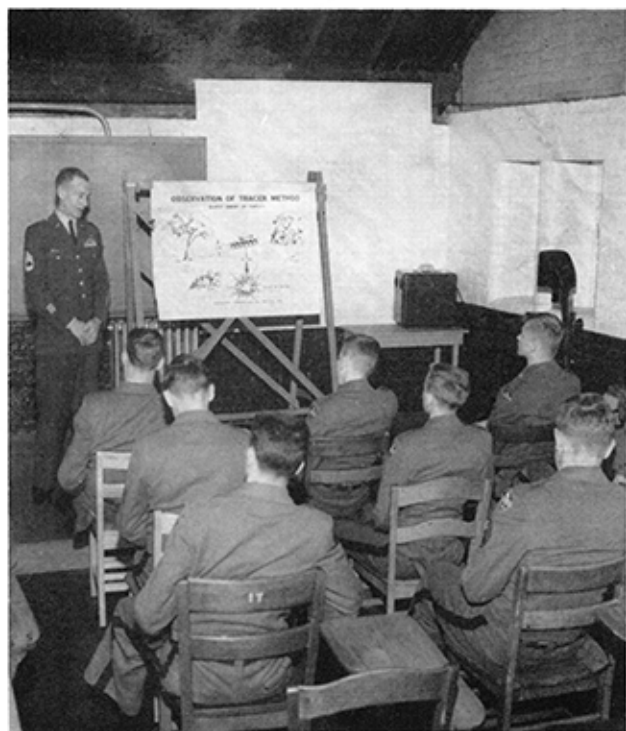

VARSITY FOOTBALL

An undefeated football season in the Mid-South Conference is hard to come by, but C.M.A. had just such a season with one of the greatest squads ever to don Bulldog spangles. The gridgers ran up an amazing 33 points per game while rambling over nine tough foes. The defense played magnificent ball and were scored on only four times during the entire season. Although there was no actual Mid-South Championship this year, the Columbians were named as the "Mythical Champion."

CMA 51; St. Vincent 0

The CMA gridders opened the 1958 football season at Perryville, Missouri, September 20, by trouncing a gallant but outmanned St. Vincent High team 51-0. The Bulldog offense glistened with flashy runs and sparkling passes and their defense was impenetrable.

Steve Tanner scored first for the Bulldogs with a 25 yard jaunt. Then Jack Yusk bulled his way for six yards and a second T.D. Quarterback Larry Denny produced the third touchdown when he hit his halfback Zollie Sircy with a 35 yard pass. Just before half-time Bob Bonnett padded the lead with six more points when he blazed his way 30 yards to paydirt.

Although a new unit started the second half the score kept mounting. Pat Quillen tossed for two touchdowns hitting Carl Beidler with a 15 yarder then George Dykes with a 35 yard heave. In the last period Quillen scored from two yards out on a quarterback sneak. George Boutsolis made the last marker with a tremendous 30 yard punt return.

CMA 39; McCallie 0

Making their first homestand of the season, CMA stormed over a hapless McCallie eleven by a 39-0 score on September 27. Once again both offensive and defensive teams sparkled under the grid-iron lights.

The first time the Cadets had their hands on the ball they scored. Zollie Sircy took the ball on his own 23 yard line and roared 77 yards to a touchdown. After fumbling on the McCallie 4 yard stripe, the Cadets returned a punt to the McCallie 40. From there, the Bulldogs marched to McCallie's two where quarterback Larry Denny dove into paydirt and a second CMA touchdown.

With six minutes, thirty seconds left to play in the first half the alert Bulldog defensive unit recovered a Blue Tornado fumble on the McCallie 17 yard line. Jack Yusk lugged the ball to the seven on the first play, then scored on the second play as he bulled his way the remaining seven yards. This ended the first half.

McCallie took the second half kickoff and began their first real threat of the night. Zollie Sircy ruined their drive by intercepting a pass on his own 35 and streaked to the McCallie 20. From there George Boutsolis went all the way for another Columbia score.

With the score standing at 24-0, Pat Quillen tossed a forty yard pass to end George Dykes, putting the ball 15 yards from another touchdown. One play later the Bulldogs got this touchdown on a Quillen to Ronnie Norton pass play. Halfback P. B. Johnson ended the scoring by grabbing a McCallie punt and spurting 50 yards for another 6 points.

CMA 33; Western Kentucky "B" 7

Western Kentucky State College's "B" team came to CMA October 4 and left the next day nursing their wounds and a 33-7 loss. The CMA offensive machine ground out 225 yards on the ground and racked up 62 more yards on passes.

In the first quarter the Bulldogs marched to Western's ten yard line where Larry Denny galloped around end for the first score. Later in the same period fullback Jack Yusk lowered his head and drove ten yards for the second tally. Steve Jelacic made the placement and the score stood at 13-0.

The second quarter was a defensive battle with both teams swapping punts and holding the other to little yardage.

The Bulldogs started the second half with a quick touchdown as George Boutsolis hit Jack Yusk with a 20 yard aerial. The extra was made and the Columbians led 20-0.

Then for the first time in the season the Bulldogs were scored on when a Western defender gobbled up a fumbled pitch-out on his own 12 yard line and galloped 88 yards for their only tally of the game.

Eager to erase their error, the Bulldogs took the kickoff and marched to the Western eight. Denny then rounded end and blasted into the end zone to put the Cadets ahead 26-7. Jelacic added one more point when he kicked the extra point. The Big Blue scored once more before the game had ended. This marker came when Carl Beidler took a pitch-out and scampered 35 yards.

CMA 33; Marion Jr. College 13

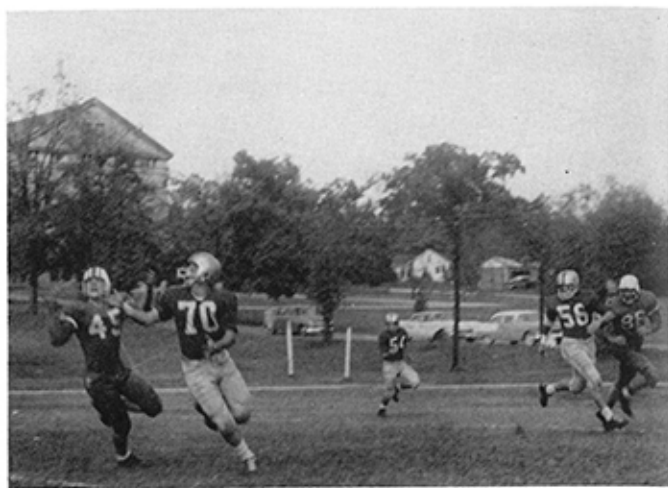

Zollie Sircy couldn't have started the game off better if he had written the script. He took the opening kickoff and, behind some bone-jarring blocking, raced 98 yards for a touchdown. This was the only scoring done in the first quarter.

Then in the second quarter Denny moved the ball to the Marion twenty. On the next play he hit George Dykes with a touchdown pass. Tanner was next to score with a 25 yard dash around end.

Denny opened the second half scoring with a 30 yard pass to Sircy. This time Marion retaliated with a touchdown of their own. Then Chuck Christopher took Marion's kickoff on the fifty and went all the way to cap CMA's scoring for the night.

In the fourth quarter Marion scored again on a pass play but the game was already tucked safely away in the Columbians' arms.



CMA 24; Darlington 0

The CMA gridders journeyed to Rome, Georgia, October, 18 where they met a pack of upset-minded Darlington Tigers. The Tigers gave the sluggish Bulldogs almost more than they could handle in the first half then were scored on thrice in the second half.

The first quarter was scoreless, as was most of the second period. Then, using Jack Yusk as the workhorse, the Bulldogs moved the ball from their own 30 to Darlington's 3 yard stripe; then Yusk smashed his way over for 6 points.

In the second half Zollie Sircy scored on a 45 yard sprint. Then Larry Denny skirted his left end and sprinted eight yards for the third tally.

The fourth and final score came on a 35 yards jaunt by halfback Carl Beidler.

Pruitt, Gupton, Christopher, Greenfield, and Nason were the defensive stars of the tilt.



CMA 12; Murray State 0

CMA's gridders probably met their toughest opponent of the season during the afternoon of October 23. The place was Columbia, the foe was Murray State Colloge's "B" team, and the score was 12 to 0 with CMA on the winning end.

In the first quarter Carl Beidler scored the first touchdown as he scooted around right end on a reverse. The try for the extra point was no good.

After being halted twice by the heavier Murray line, the Cadets scored again on a nine yard pass from Denny to Dykes. The extra point attempt was again thwarted.

The second half was entirely a defensive battle. Each team had several scoring drives in the making but each was ruined by either a fumble or an intercepted pass.





CMA 13; AUSTIN-PEAY 0

CMA met another tough opponent in the person of Austin State College "B" team on October 30 but once again the powerful Cadets emerged victorious. This time it was the Columbian defensive team that got the headlines as they allowed the visitors only two first downs the entire game. In addition the team from Clarksville gained only 63 yards on the ground and a feeble eight yards in the air.

The defensive line of Greenfield, Gupton, Falls, Christopher, Dykes, Corder, Kennedy, and Ballard were immovable.

Although the Cadets ground out 182 yards on the ground, they could score only twice. Both of these tallies were made by Denny on runs of one and four yards. Fullback Jack Yusk led his offensive mates in ground gaining followed by Steve Tanner.



CMA 69; Colbert County 0

CMA's Bulldogs tuned up for their homecoming battle by putting on a show of speed and power at the hands of a thoroughly out-classed Colbert County High School team on November 7 at Leighton, Alabama. The Indians never managed to penetrate beyond the Bulldog 35 yard line.

The Bulldogs scored practically every time they had their hands on the ball. In the first quarter Sircy scored on a 65 yard run, Quillen tallied on a 45 yard jaunt, followed by Joe Fish's 5 yard sprint. 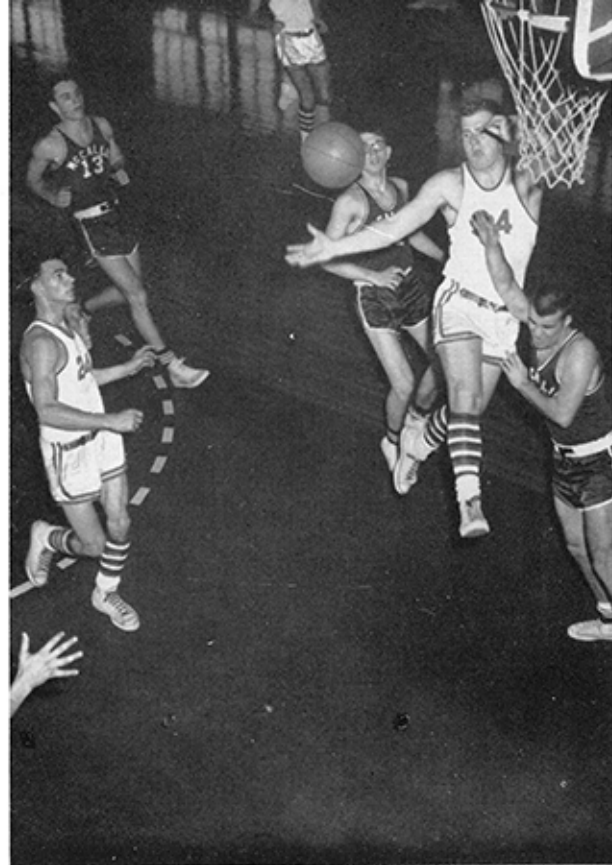

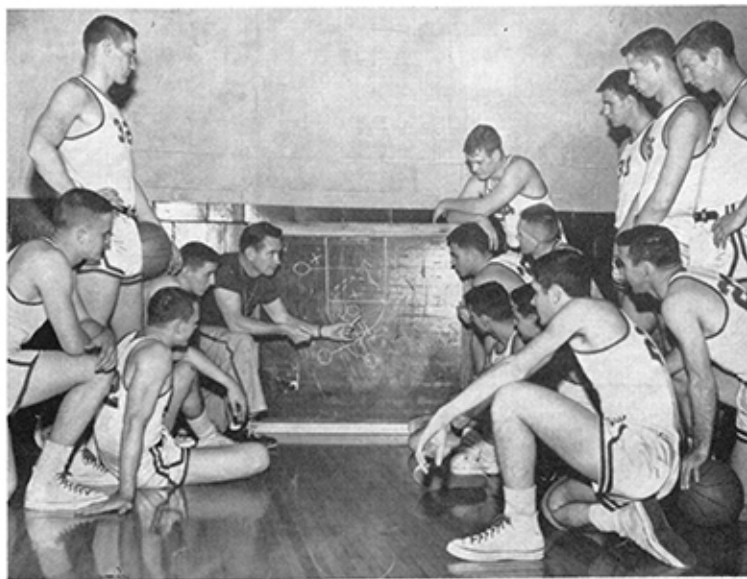
