valedictorian

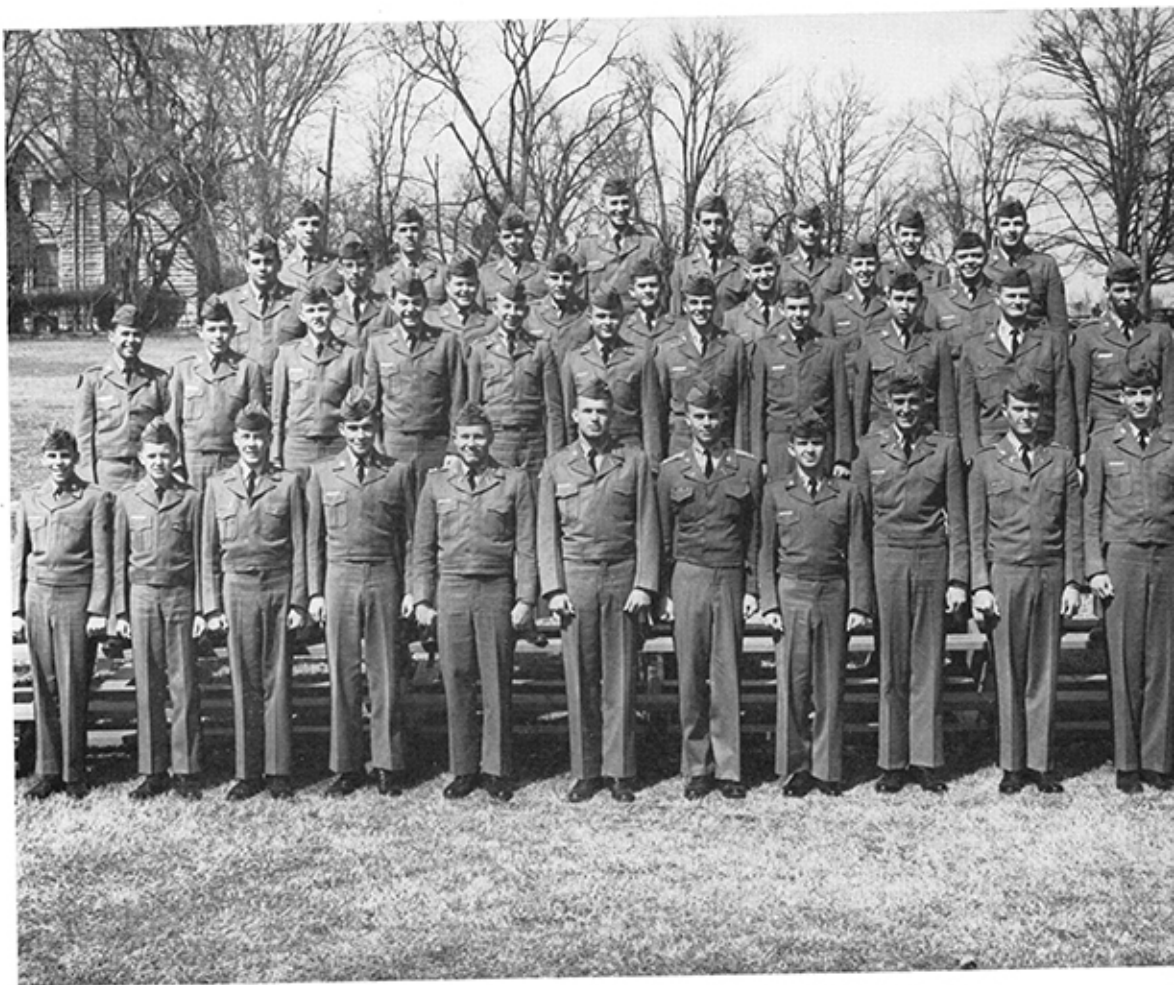

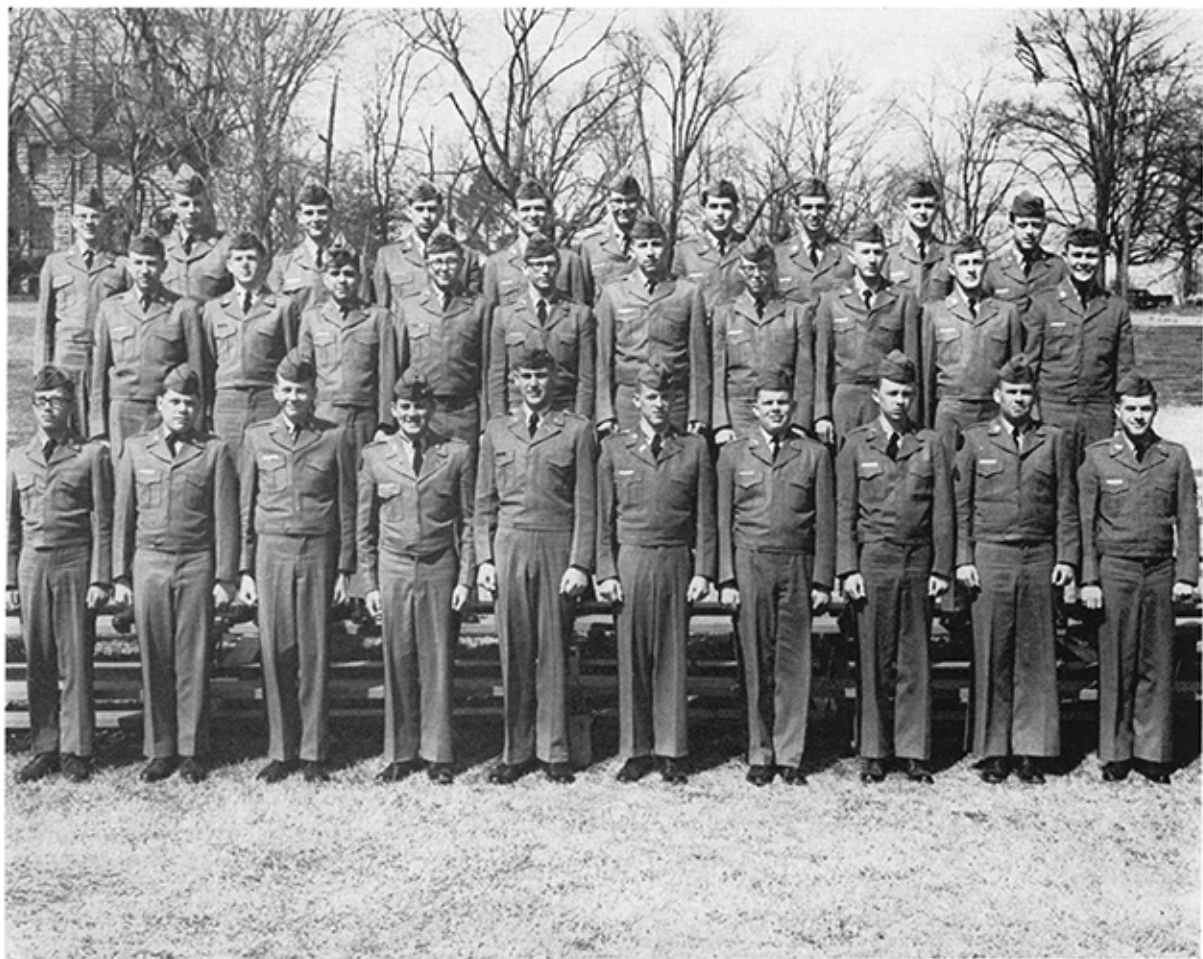
the scholarship badge

The Scholarship Group is one of two groups of students honored by the Academic Department. Those cadets who have earned this distinction for the first semester of the school year are pictured above. Each member of the group maintained an average of eighty-six or better in every subject for this period. For this demonstration of proficiency, each boy in the group was presented with a handsome red "S", the Scholarship Badge, to wear on his blouse. In addition, the cadets who have a final grade average in each subject of eighty-six or better are awarded the Scholarship Pin in an impressive ceremony during commencement exercises. This pin is worn on the Scholarship Badge. The Scholarship Badge is a coveted honor. Only ten per cent of the student body are awarded this distinction. We wish these boys continued and increased success and hope to see more of their classmates join with them in sharing this honor in the future.

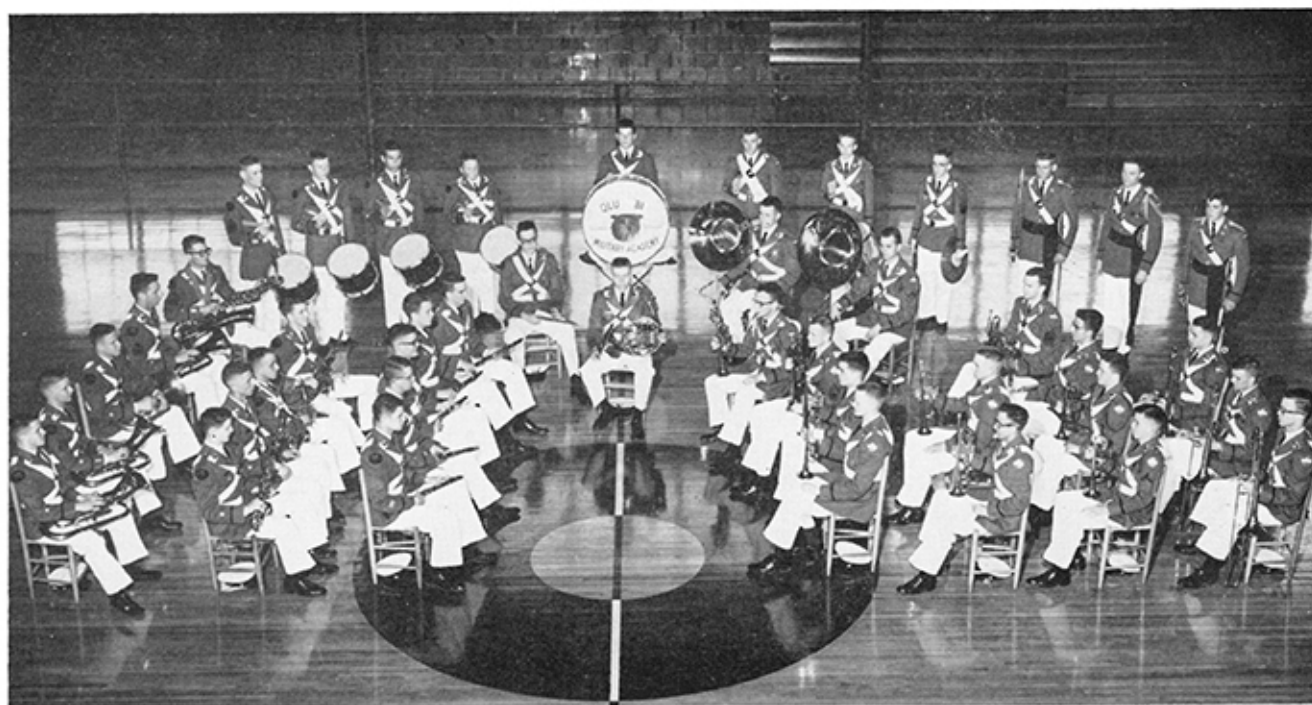
The Band "Sounds Off" at Formal Review.

This year's team captained by Taylor Archer scored twelve victories. Combining these with last year's fifteen victories gives Coach Gunn twenty-seven consecutive wins.

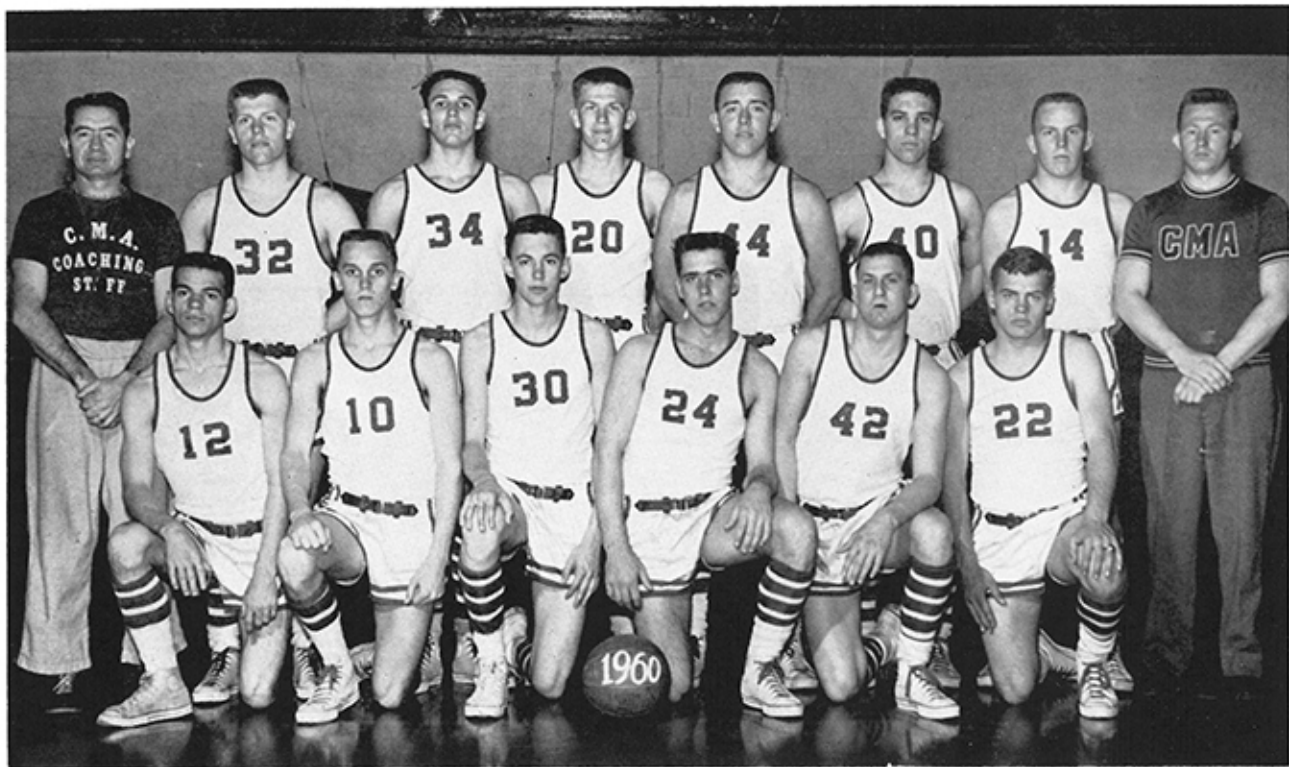
