
The high scholastic and military standing of the Class of '63 has made a significant contribution to that role.

VALEDICTORIAN

Throughout four years at C.M.A., Charlie has consistently been at the top of his class. He has won his respective class medal every year and has won a Mathematics Medal, General Science Medal, Biology Medal, and Chemistry Medal. Charlie has always been in the top ten percent of his military class and in his first two years he won the outstanding Military Science I and II awards. In four years here, Charlie has always been one of the more proficient members of our much vaunted rifle team.

Charlie is not limited to academic and military activities. He is President of our chapter of the National Honor Society and President of the Junior Civitan Club. 
Billy plans to study nuclear engineering at either the Air Force Academy or Vanderbilt University.







SCHOLARSHIP BADGE

Maury County Hospital

At the time of construction of Maury County Hospital, the residents of this area were being served by the King's Daughters Hospital which had a capacity of 42 beds. Because of the industrial growth and increased utilization of medical care, the King's Daughters Hospital became critically crowded, and many residents of necessity were going to metropolitan areas for needed hospital care.

The construction of Maury County Hospital was a joint project of the County, State, and Federal Governments. The Federal participation was made possible by the Hill-Burton Hospital Construction Program, begun in 1946. The hospital was constructed with an original bed capacity of 102 at a total cost of \$2,250,000 and was opened on December 16, 1953. At the time of the opening, there were 16 psysicians admitted to membership on the Medical Staff. The original number of employees was 55, and the first month of operation saw an average patient census of 49 per day.

The hospital has experienced a rapid increase in the number of patients, and it became necessary in 1958 to begin making plans for expansion. An expansion program was completed and the facilities made ready for use in December, 1960. The expansion cost \$1,000,000 and provided 50 additional beds, additional operating rooms, and additional

space in the laboratory, X-ray, kitchen, laundry, and some other service areas. Cobalt facilities were also provided in the new section for treatment of cancer victims.

The membership of the Medical Staff has increased from 16 to 25 physicians since 1953. The hospital now offers a comprehensive scope of care for surgical, medical, obstetric, and pediatric patients. The present bed complement is 152 adult and pediatric beds plus 26 bassinets for newborn infants. During January, 1962, the hospital averaged 130 patients per day, a sizeable increase in comparison to the average for the first month of operation. The operating budget for 1962 will reach \$1,000,000 with employees numbering 240, and the total payroll will be close to \$600,000.

Not only is the hospital fulfilling a very vital service for the ill and injured, but it is also a very important segment of our local economy from the standpoint of personnel and total operating budget. With the increase in medical specialization, the hospital is experiencing an increase in the number of patients being referred from neighboring counties in South-Middle Tennessee. It is anticipated that growth will continue and that future planning will include the most needed facilities to provide adequate and proper space and equipment in order to care for the ill, injured, and aged of this area.
