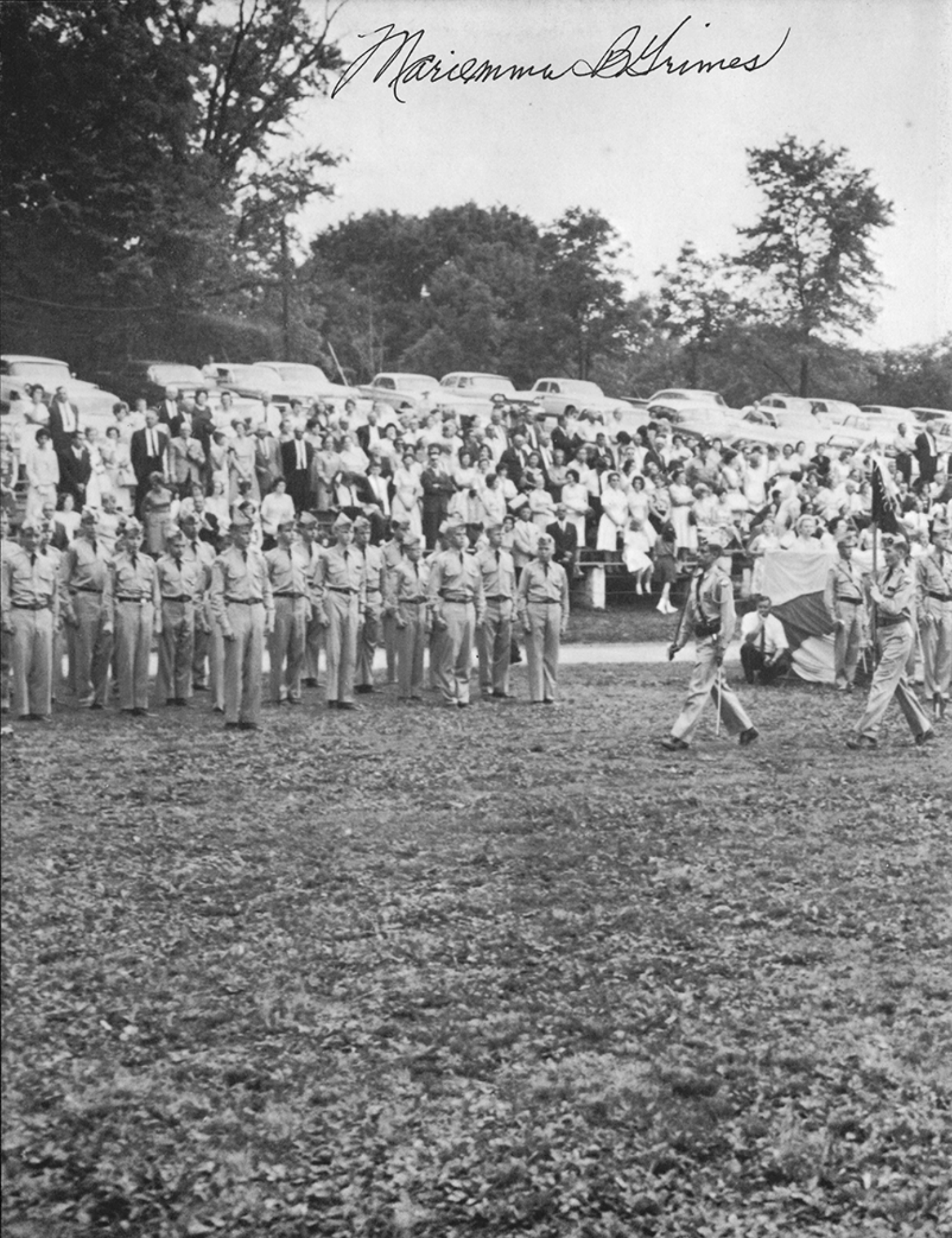

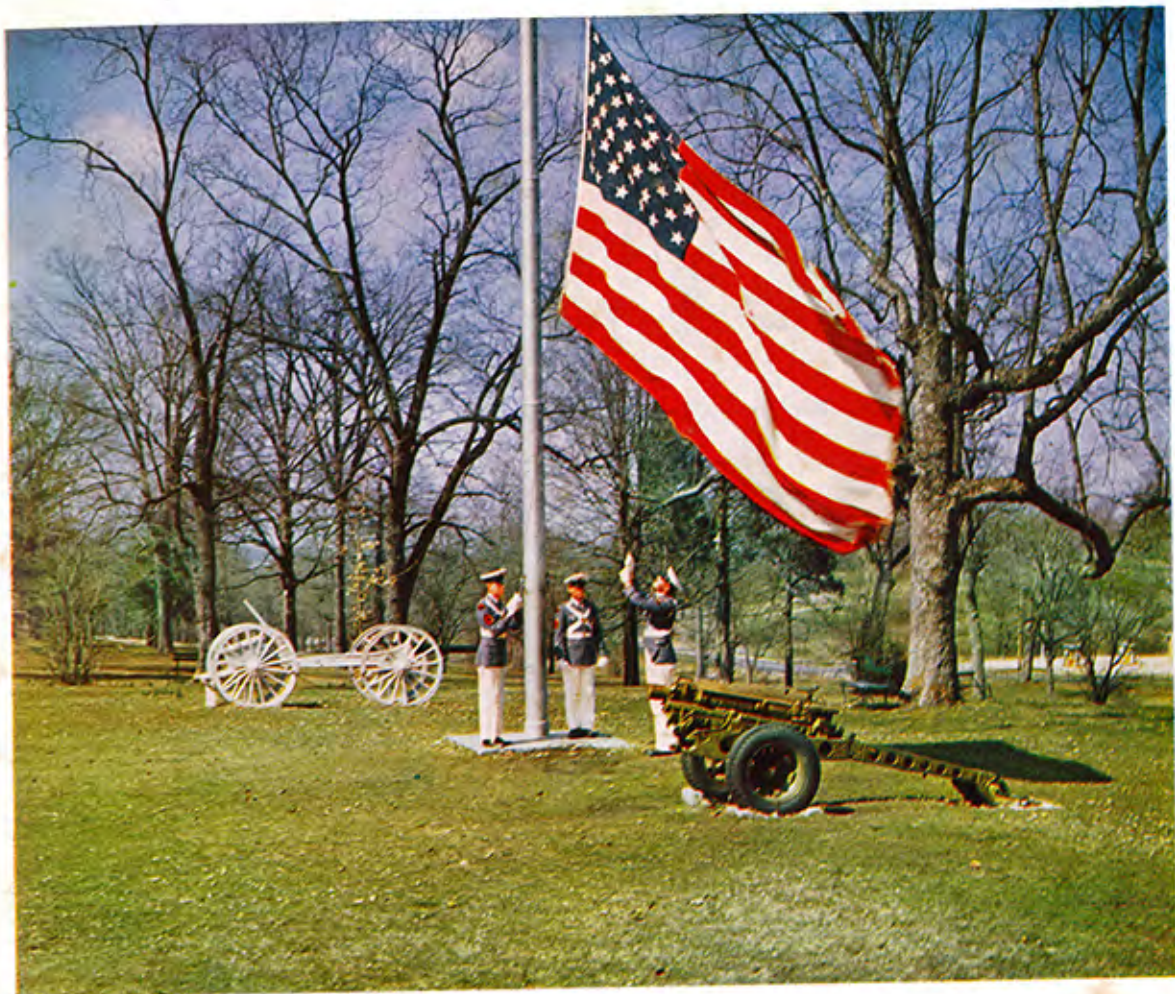

DEDICATION

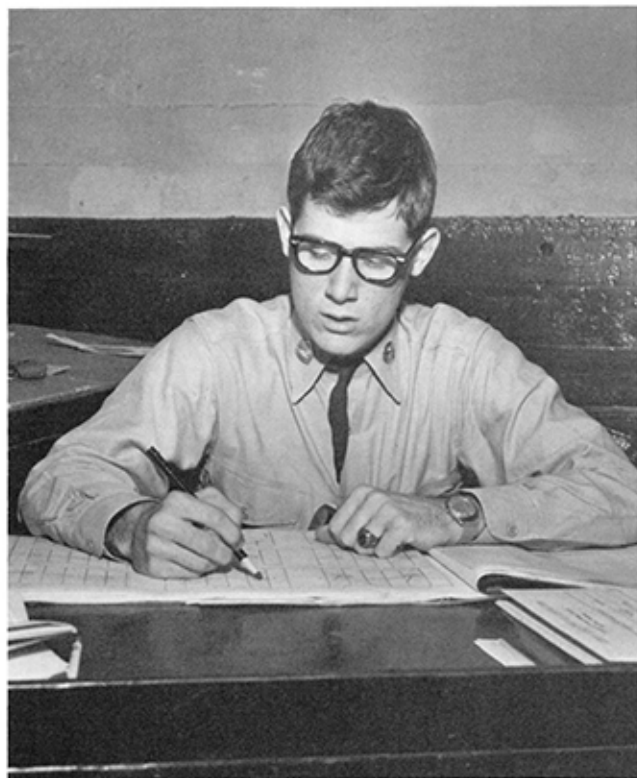

Haywood has been high in his scholastic standing throughout the four years he has attended C.M.A. He has attained the wreath for being in the top ten percent of his Military class.

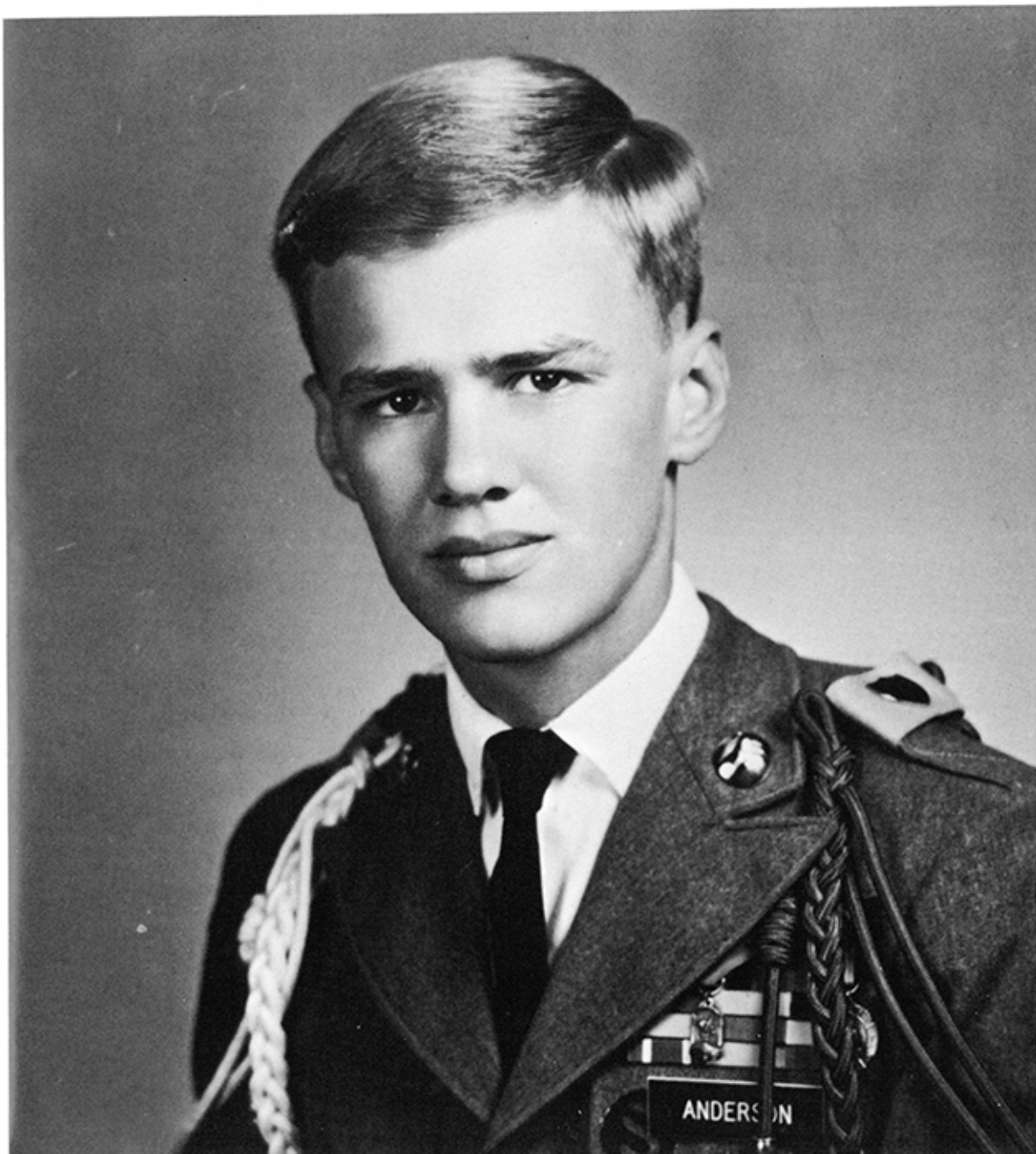

Their over-all season record was 8 wins and 4 defeats.

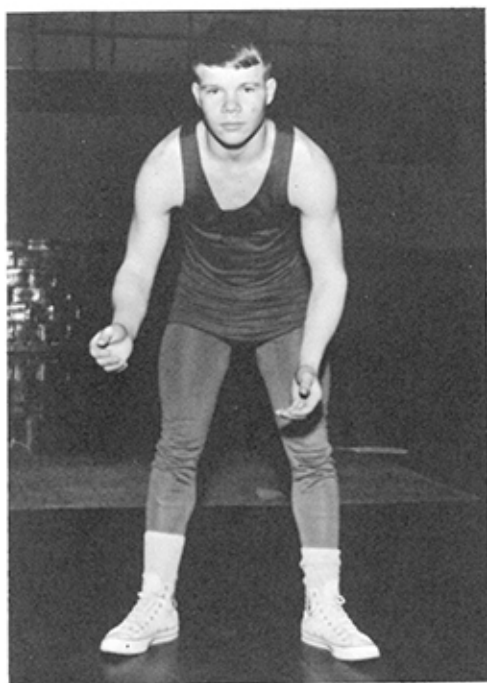

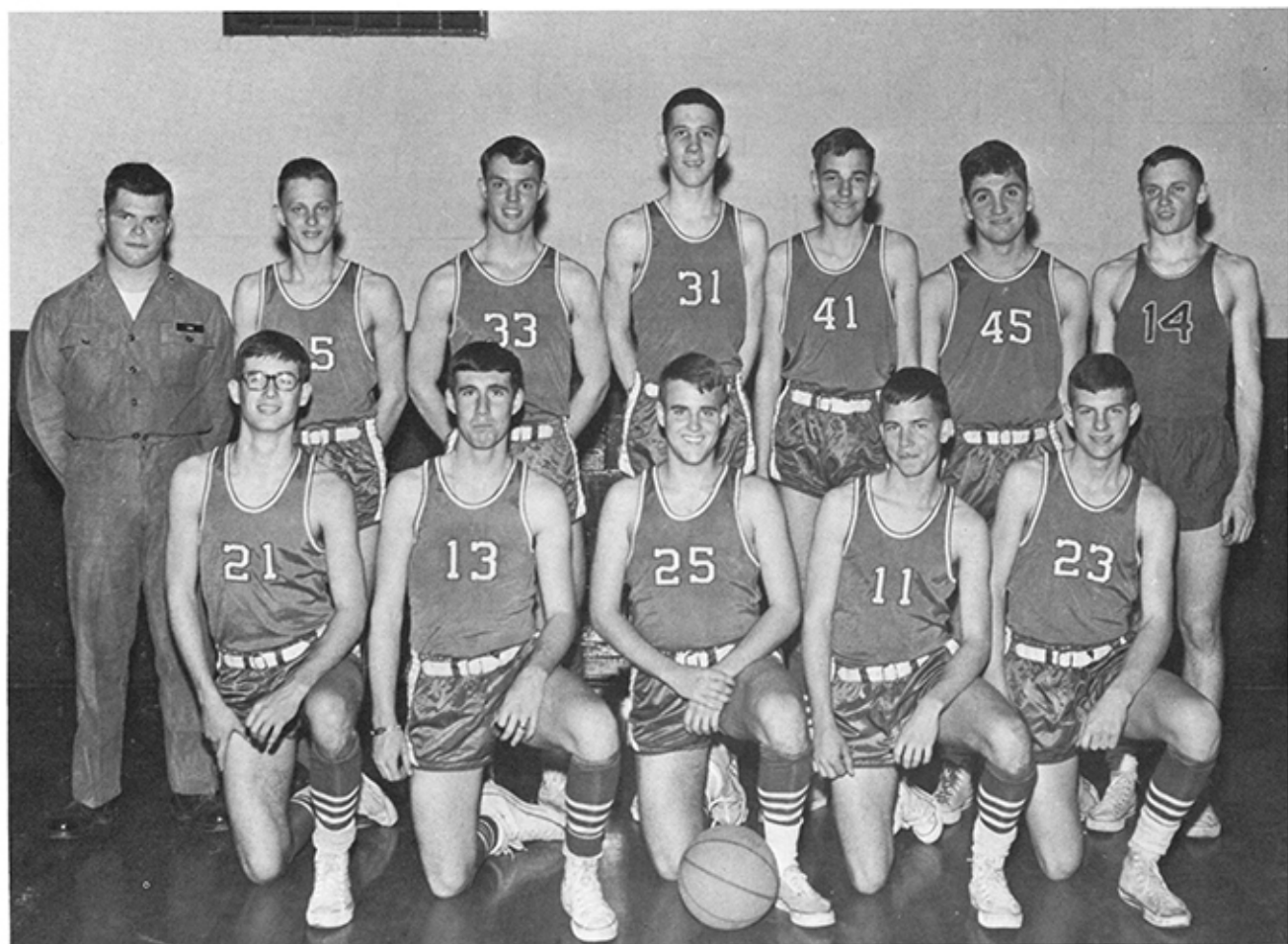
Jr. VARSITY FOOTBALL

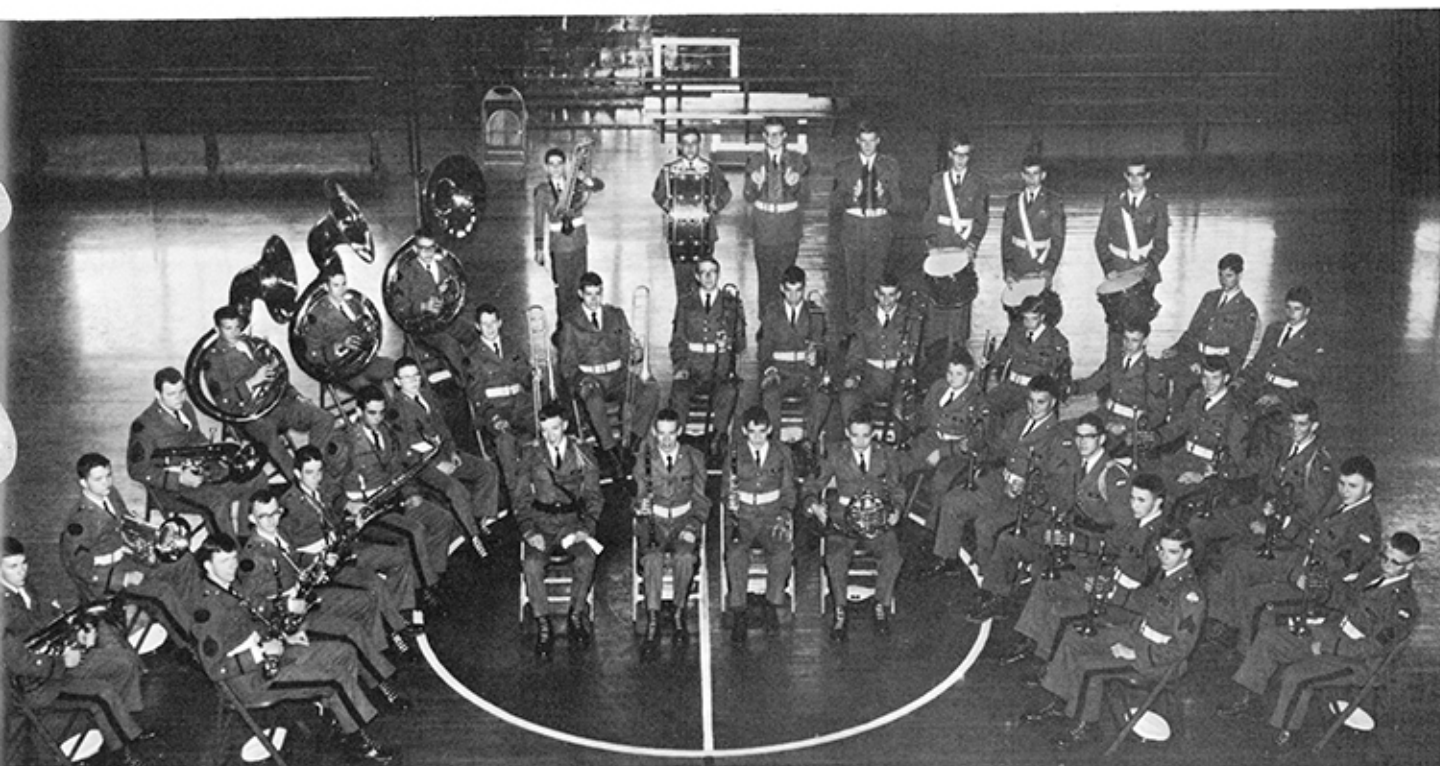
CONCERT BAND

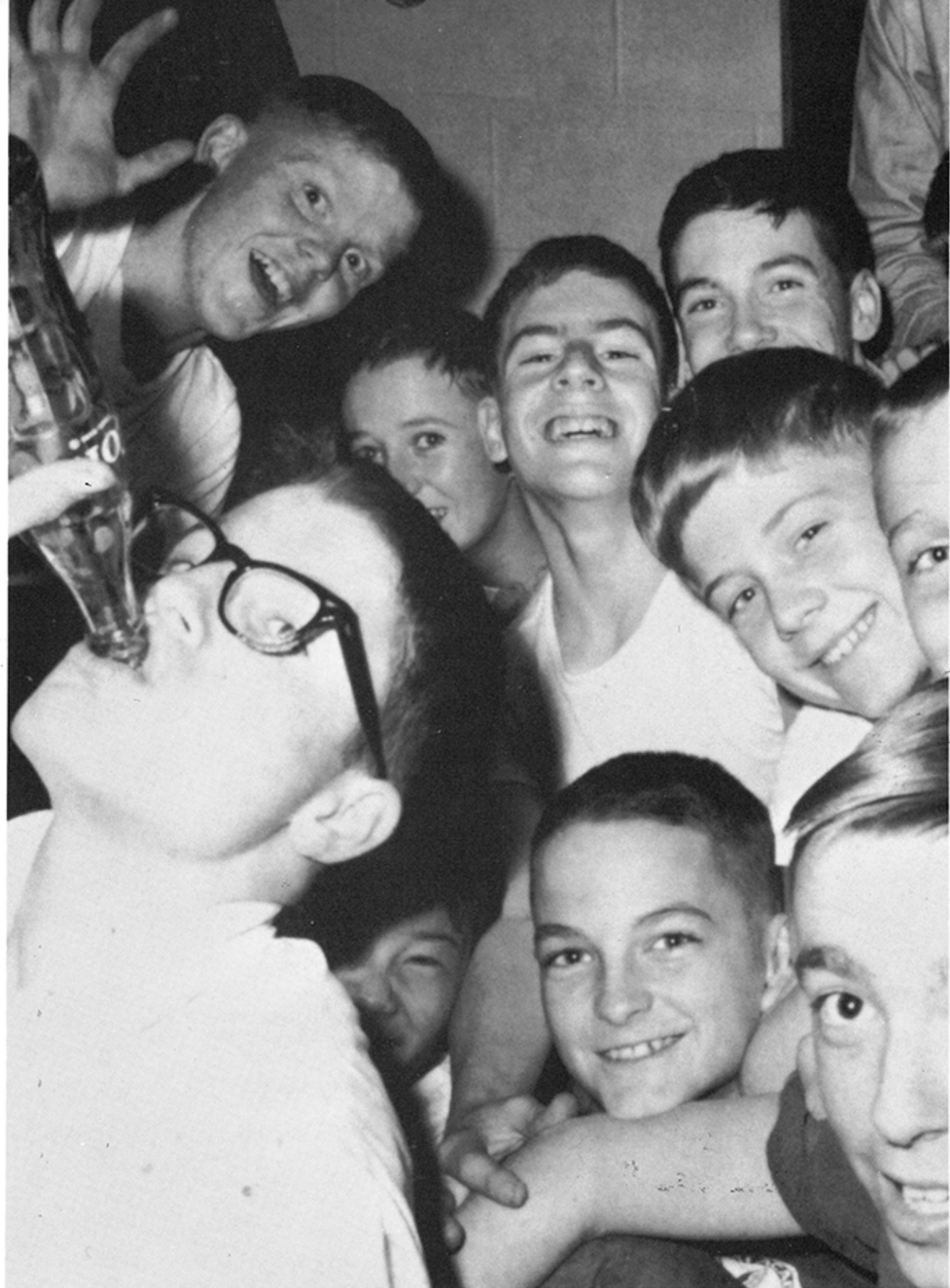

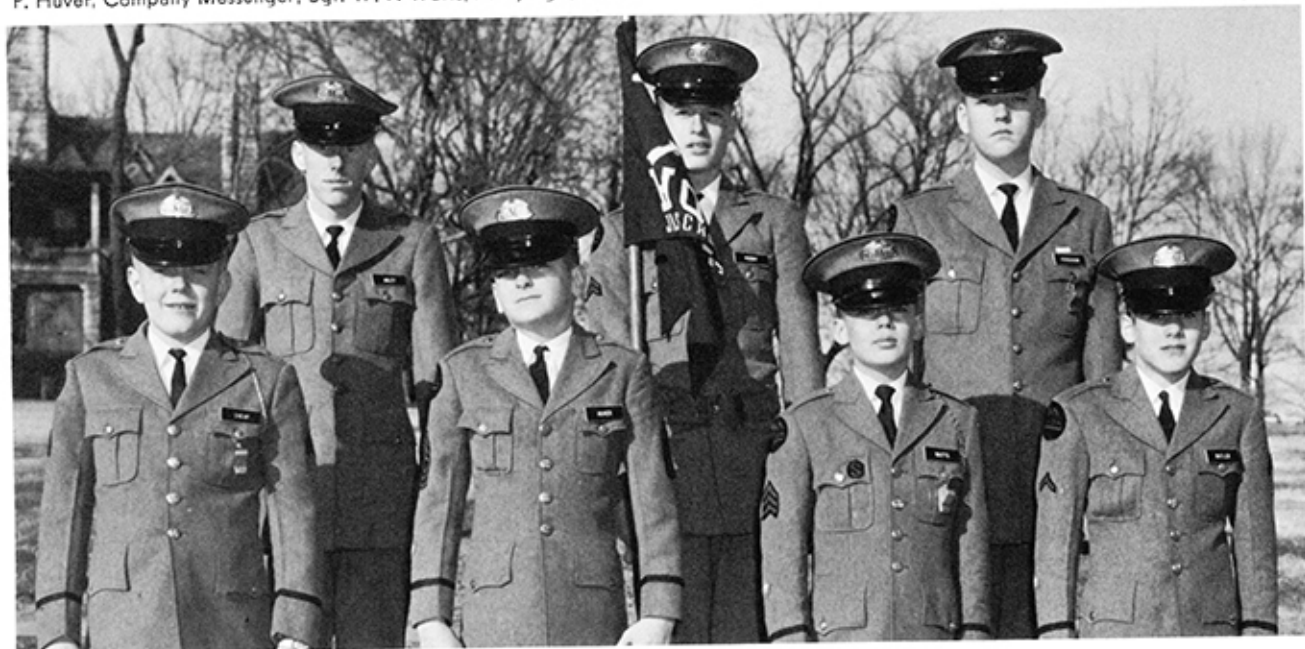
