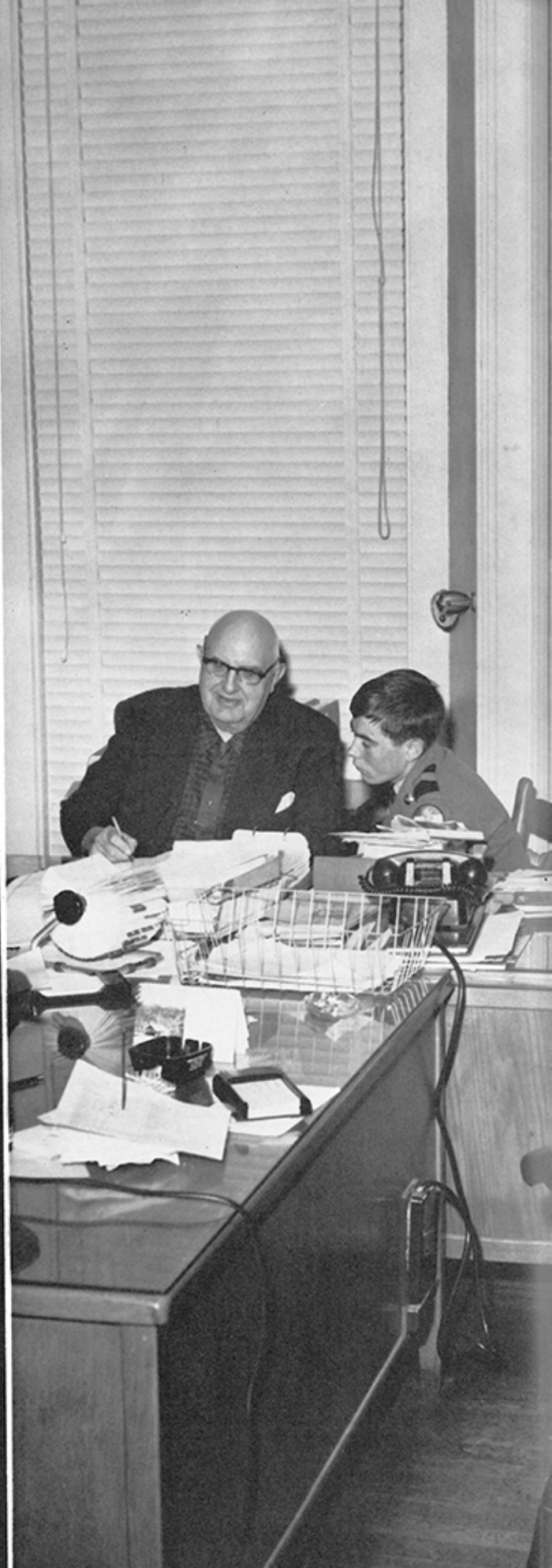
MR. C.M.A.

VALEDICTORIAN

Billy Wayne Akin of Columbia, Tennessee, with a four-year over-all average of 96.61, achieved the highest academic honor attainable at Columbia Military Academy: that of being named Valedictorian of the 1966 graduating class. During the six years he has attended C.M.A., Billy has distinguished himself in many phases of school life. He has consistently been at the top of his class. He won the class medal in the seventh and eighth grades, sophomore and junior years, and Chemistry Medal his junior year. Billy has represented C.M.A. at the Middle Tennessee Math Contest twice and has always been in the top ten per cent of his military class. In his Sophomore year he commanded the best drilled squad and received the Chicago Tribune Medal for Military Excellence at Commencement. During his four years in senior school he has been a member of the Gold Star Drill Platoon and the Rifle Team.

Billy plans to be a doctor and upon graduating will enter Vanderbilt University.



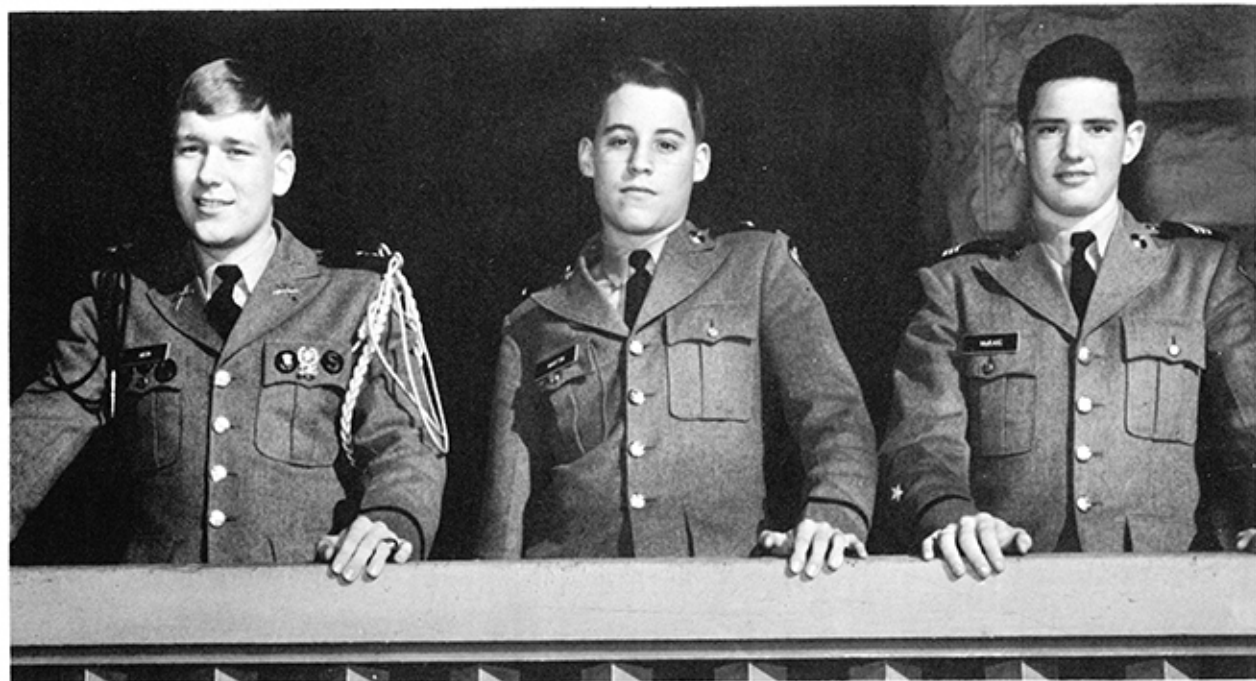
SALUTATORIAN

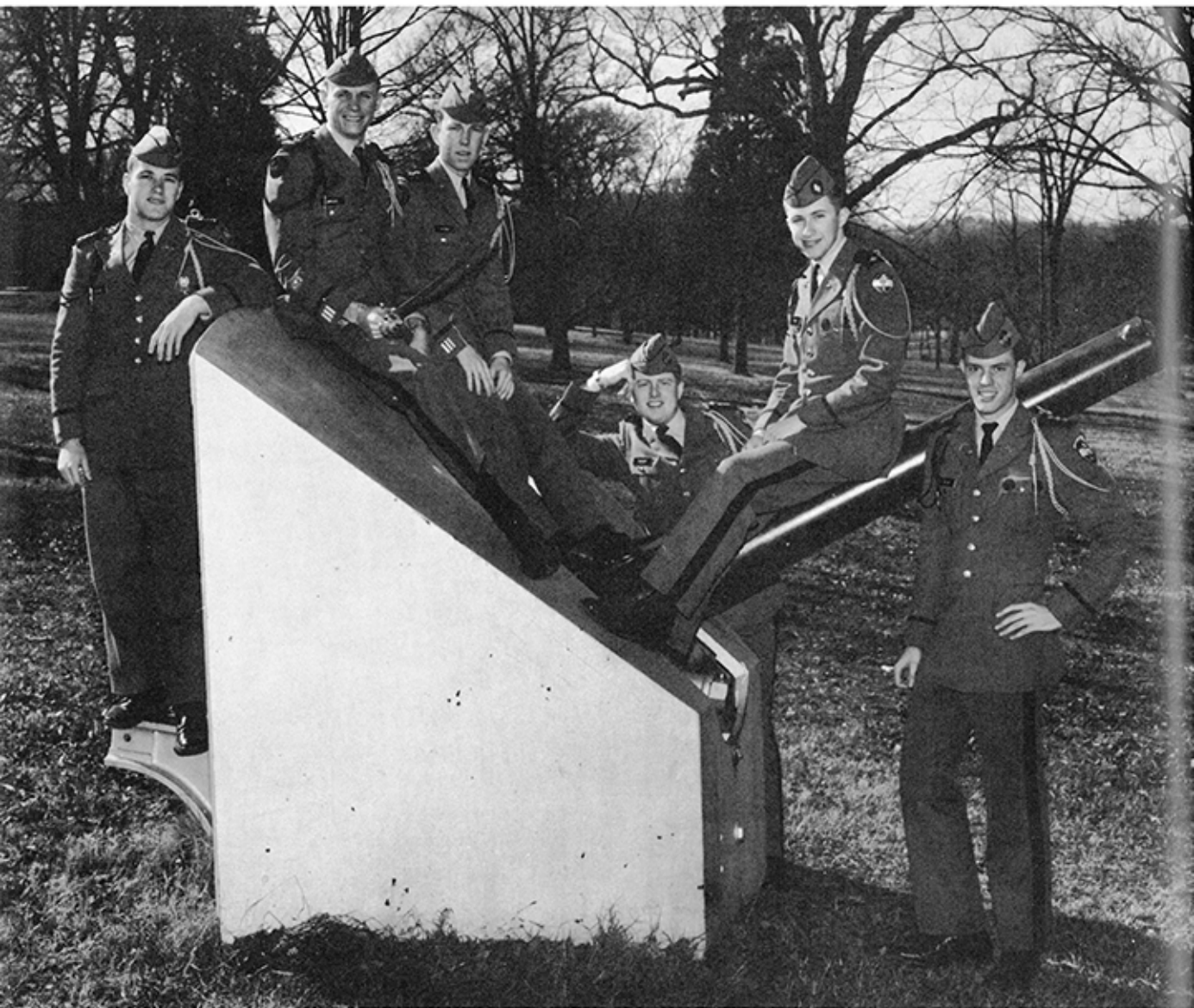

Columbia Military Academy has been an honor school for thirty-one years. Our Military Staff should be commended for the excellent guidance it has demonstrated during the years.



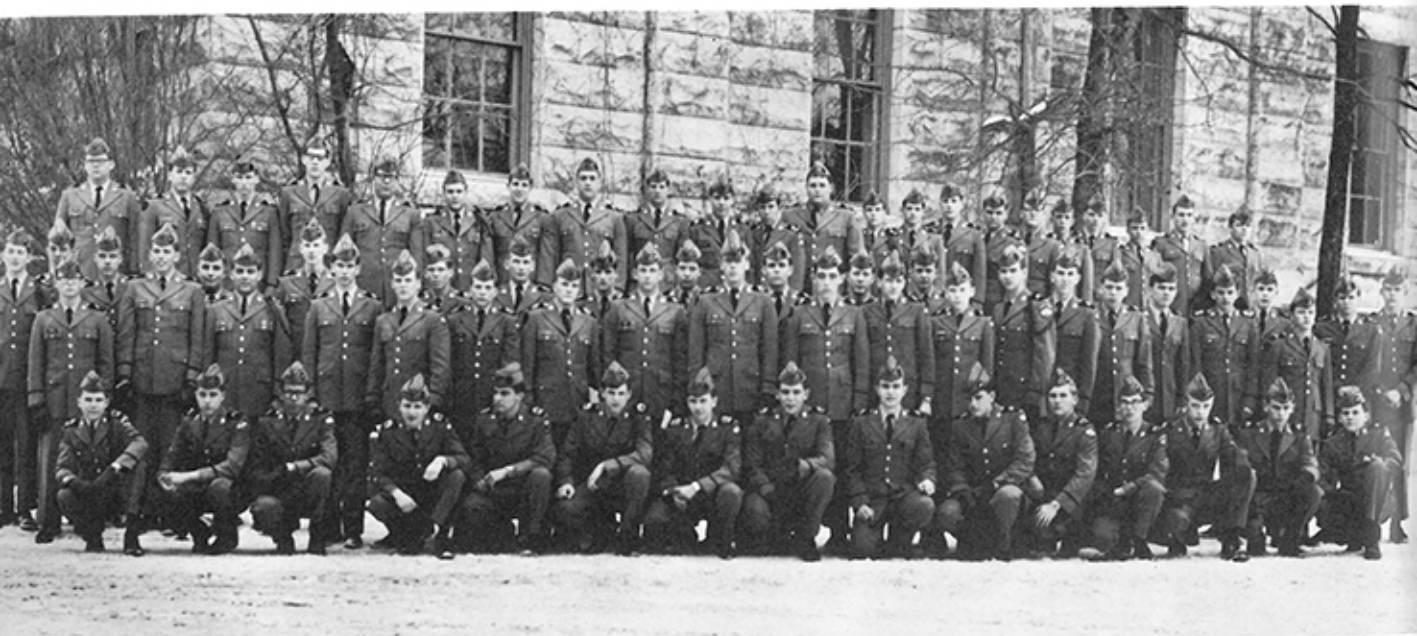

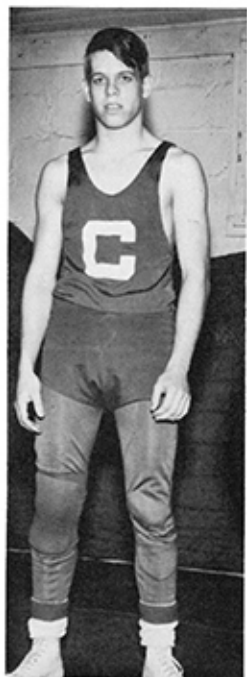
WRESTLING
