







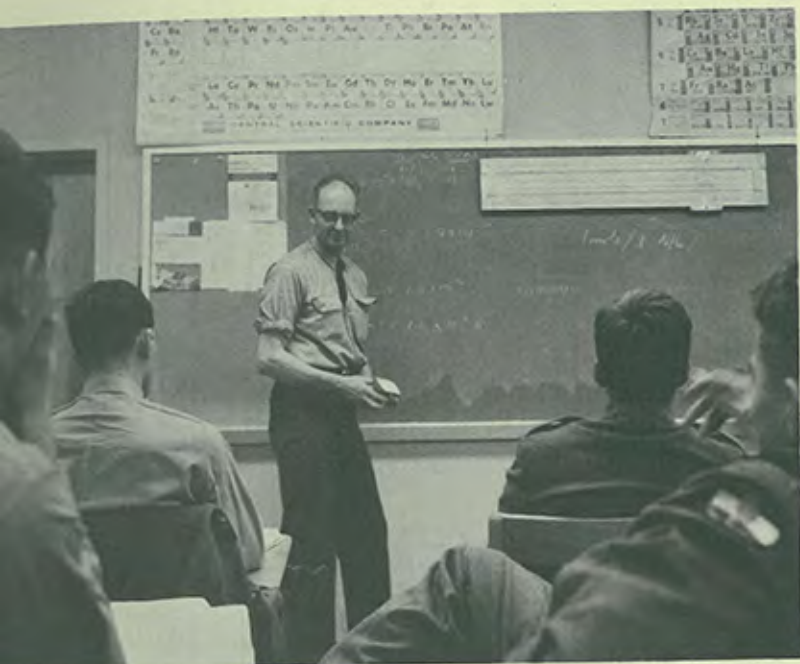

Lieutenant Colonel Eugene S. Towles



The 1967 RECALL is respectfully dedicated to Lieutenant Colonel Eugene S. Towles for his consistent guidance and service to the Cadet Corps of Columbia Military Academy.

Coach Towles came to C. M. A. in 1955 to teach chemistry and coach the track team. During that year, he designed and supervised the construction of the track. Now head of the Athletic Department, he still takes an active part by coaching cross country, soccer, track, and the physical training program for cadets not participating in interscholastic athletics.

Through the efforts of Lt. Col. Towles, a chapter of the National Honor Society was established here in 1961. He has been the sponsor of the society since that date.

Lt. Col. Towles is the Lay Reader at St. Peter's Episcopal Church, a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, belongs to the Kappa Alpha Fraternity, the Columbia Choral Society, and the Nashville Area Branch of the American Chemical Society.

Coach and his wife, Sophia, live in Streater Hall with their son, Sumter, a C. M. A. alumnus, who is now a sophomore at Mississippi State University. At Streater, in spare moments, Lt. Col. Towles indulges in portrait painting, his primary avocation.

We would like to offer this dedication as an expression of our sincere appreciation to Coach Towles for the salutary influence he has had on our lives physically, mentally, and morally.

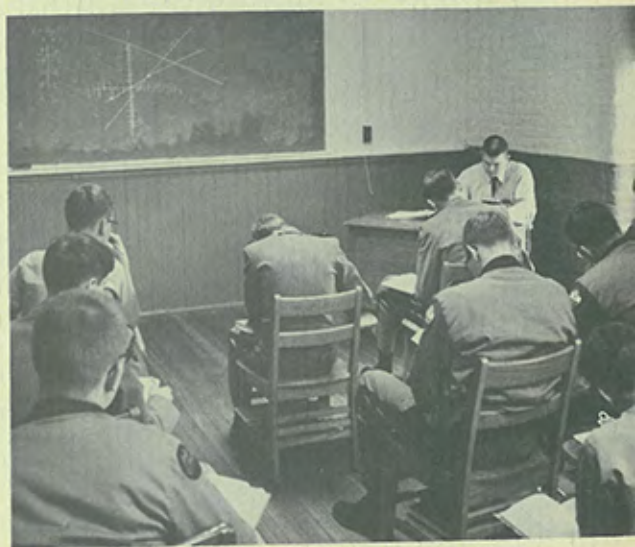

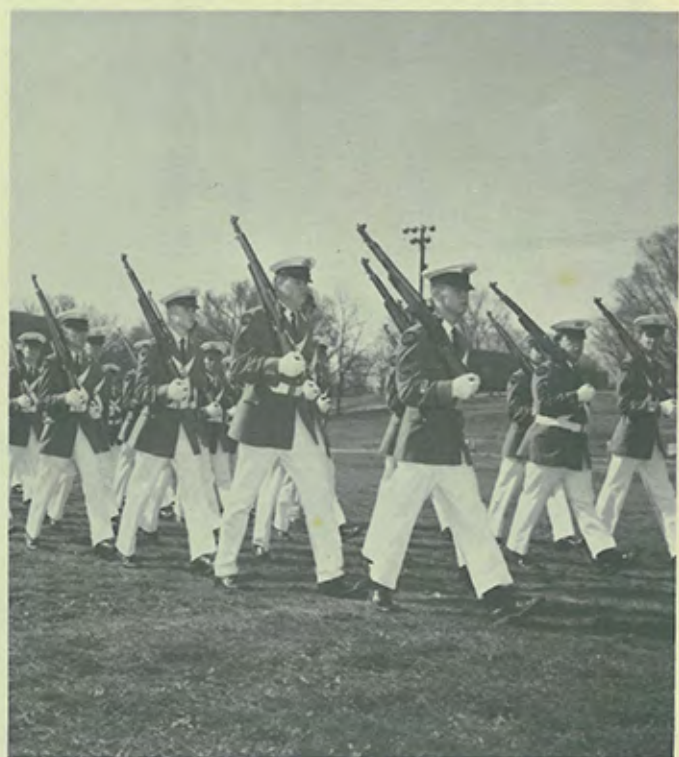




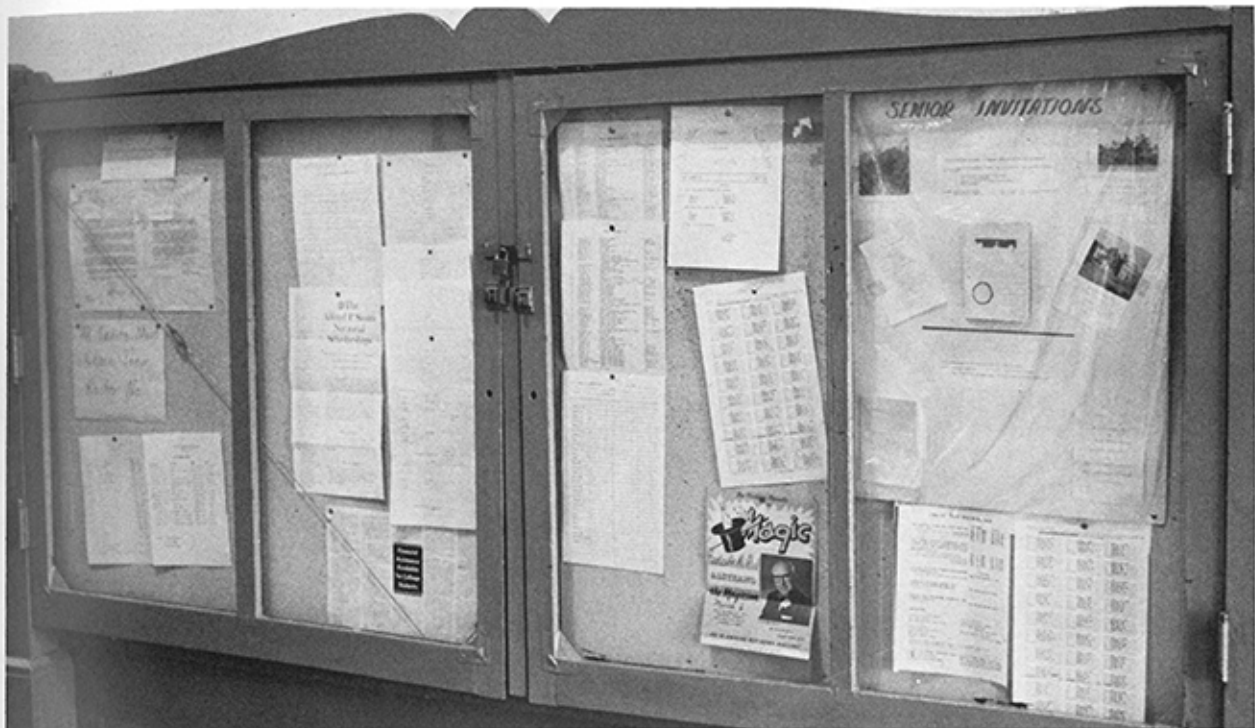

IN MEMORIAM

Colonel Clifton A. Ragsdale, who greatly helped in making Columbia Military Academy one of the leading military schools in the nation, passed away on July 23, 1966, at the age of 74.

Colonel Ragsdale served C. M. A. for thirty-one years as teacher, administrator, president, and Board member. He continued as an advisor and member of the Board of Trustees from his retirement in 1962 until his death. He gave inspiration and guidance to the cadets who passed through the halls of C. M. A. His faithful and tireless efforts were reflected in the growth and continual improvements in the school, its curriculum and associated programs.

On November 2, 1963, Colonel Ragsdale was named to the Columbia Military Academy Roll of Honor, a position shared to date by only six other men.

The administration, staff, faculty, cadets, and all who were associated with Colonel Ragsdale will remember him throughout the years.

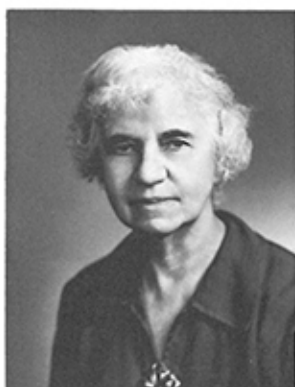

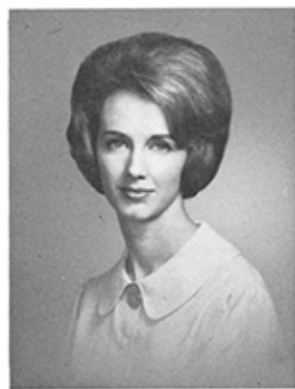

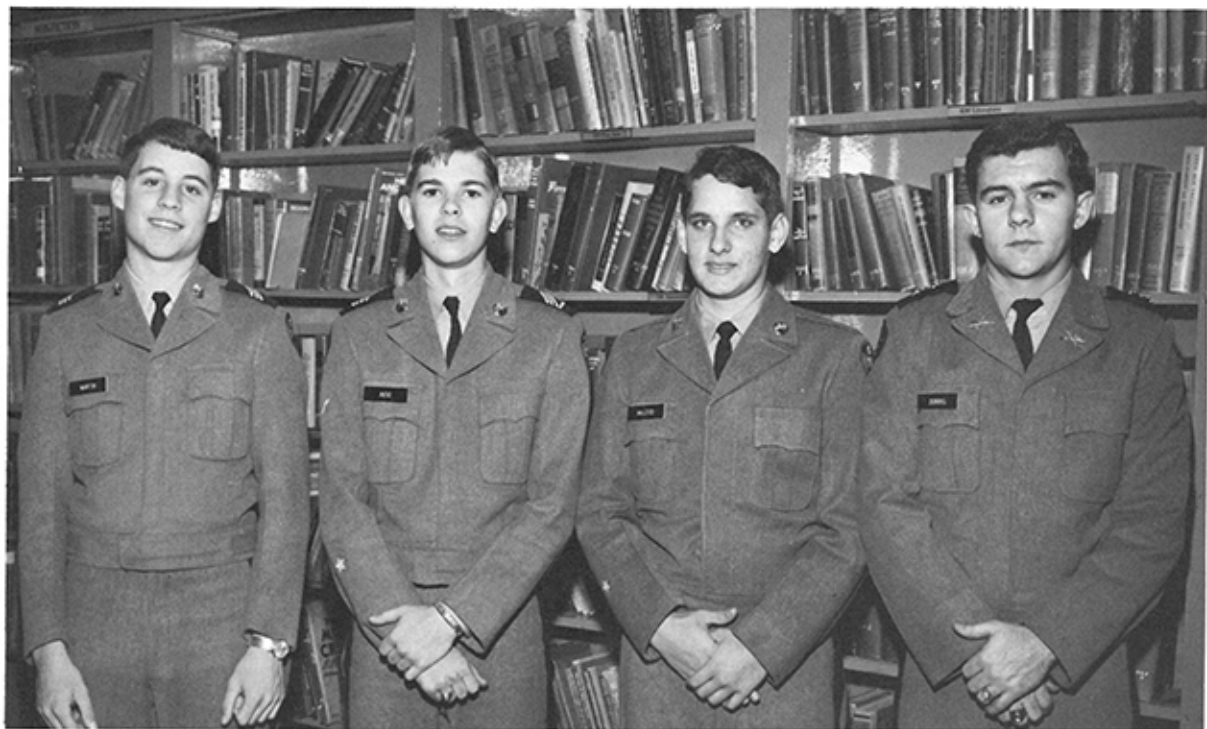

VALEDICTORIAN

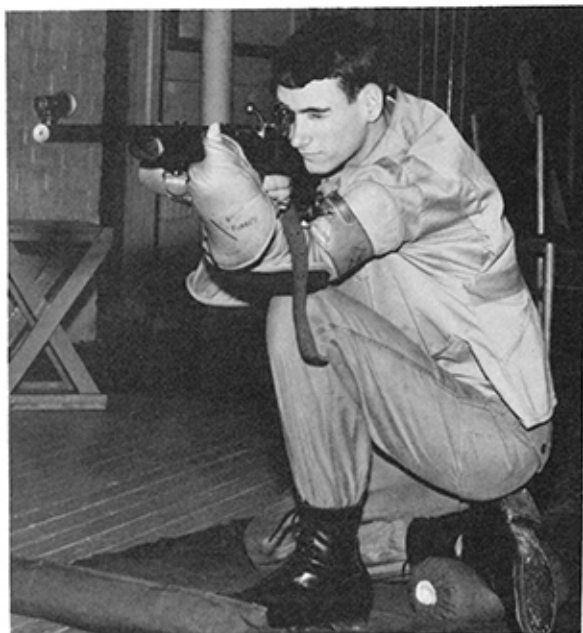

This year the team has been supervised by Captain Roy Hamilton and Sergeant Major A. J. Lambert.



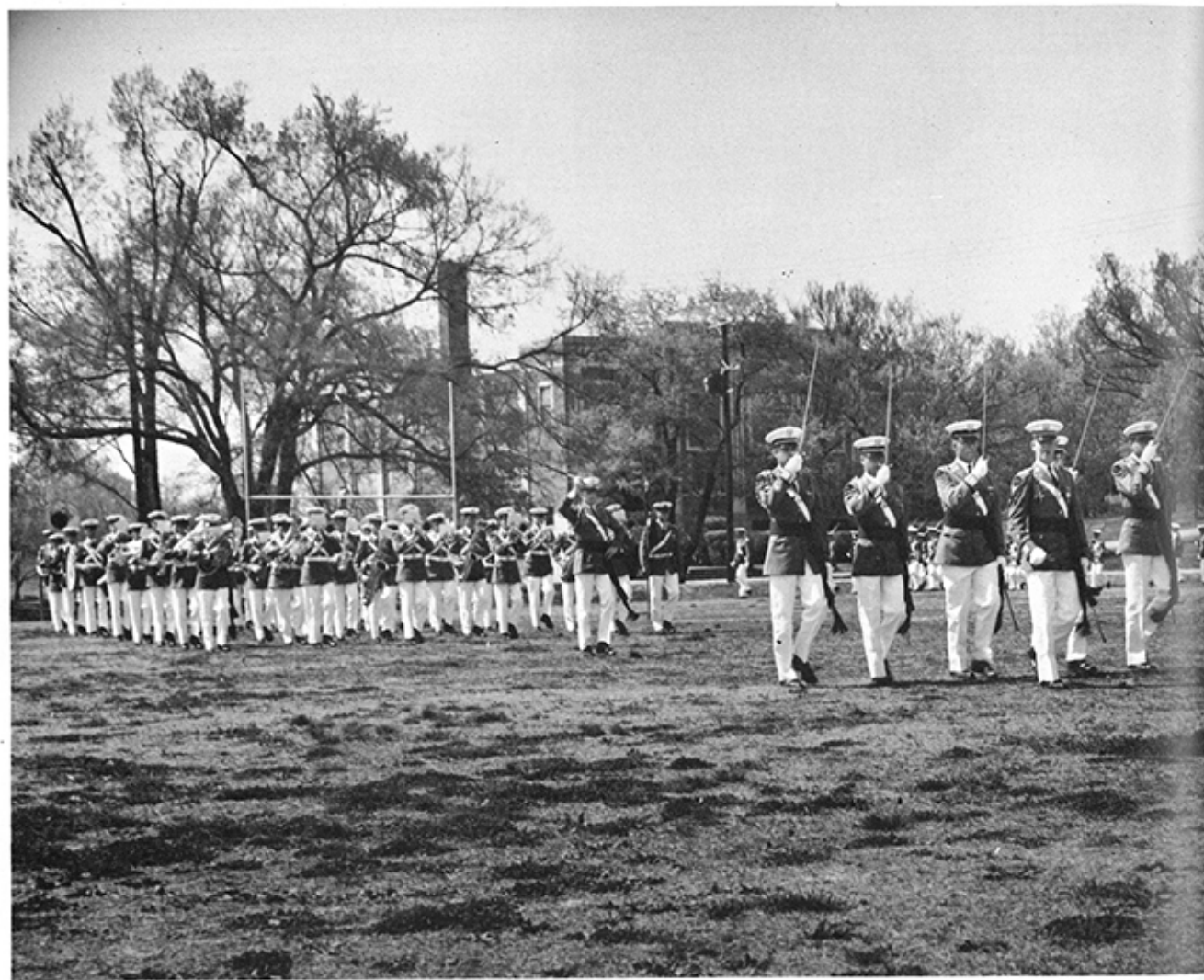

HALL OF FAME

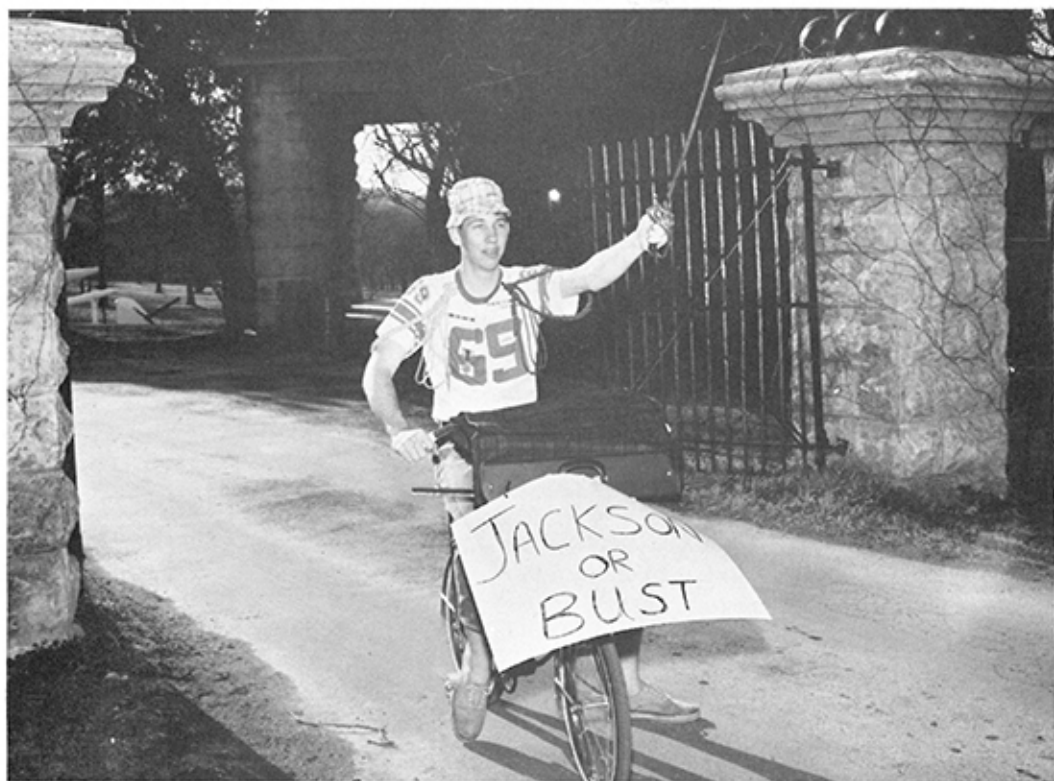

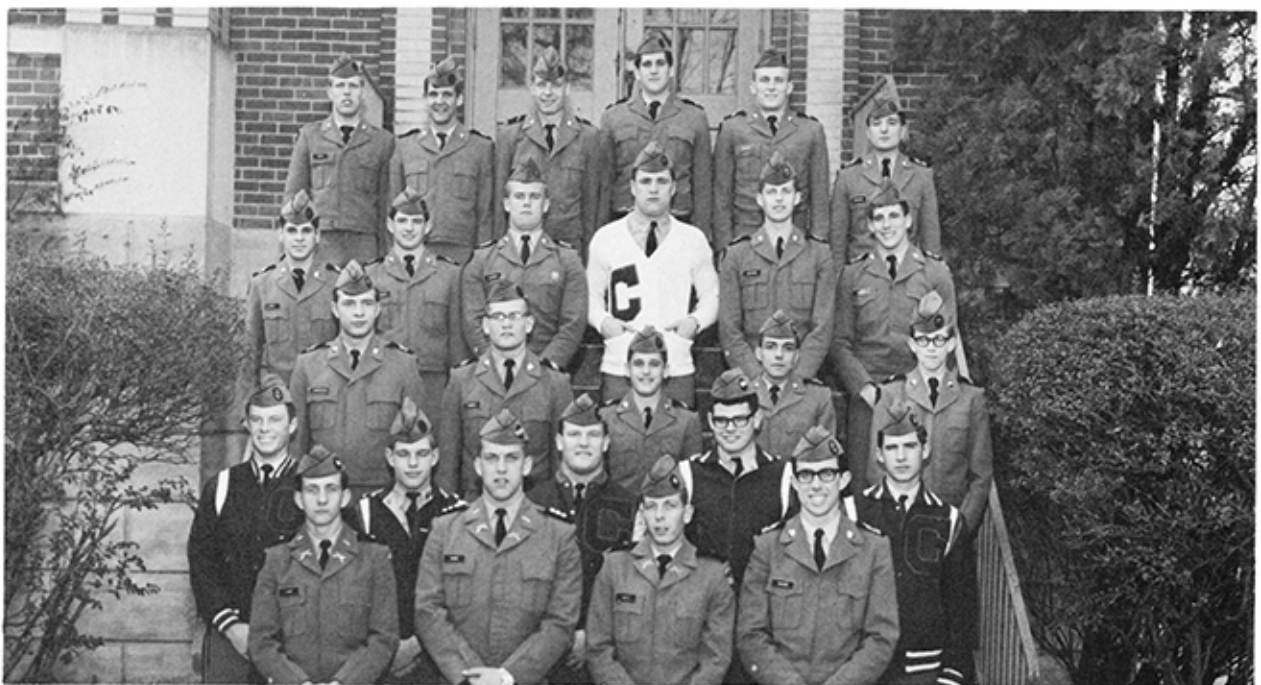

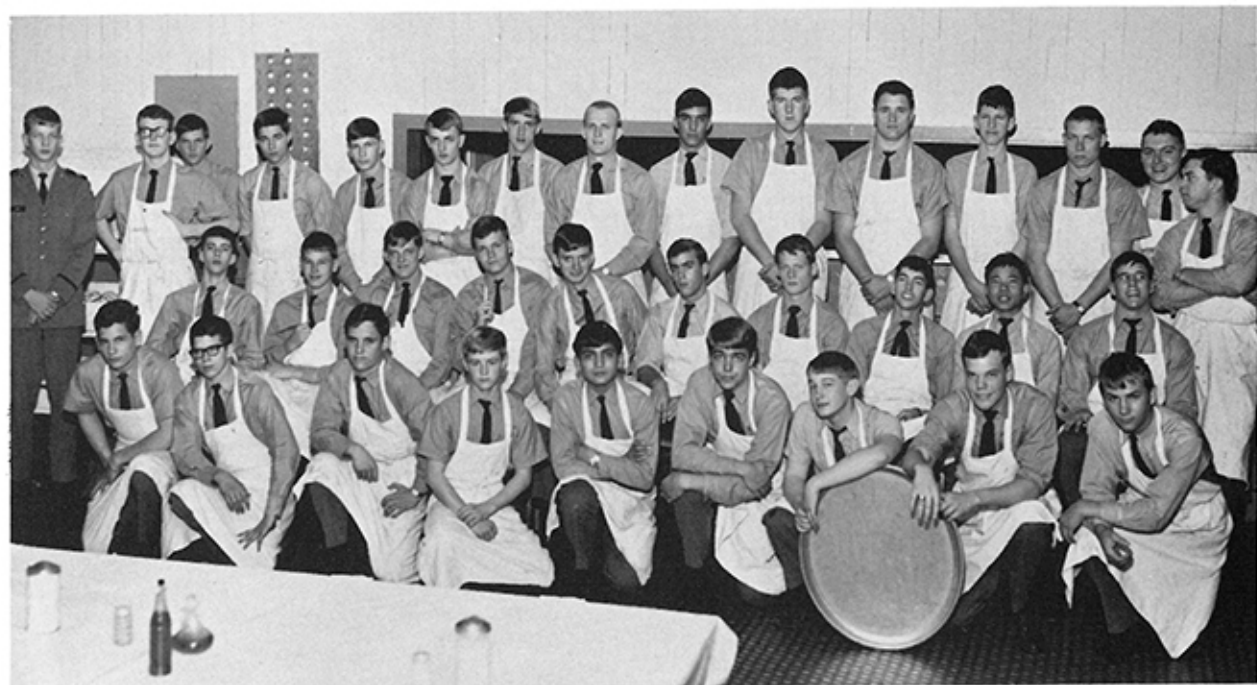
