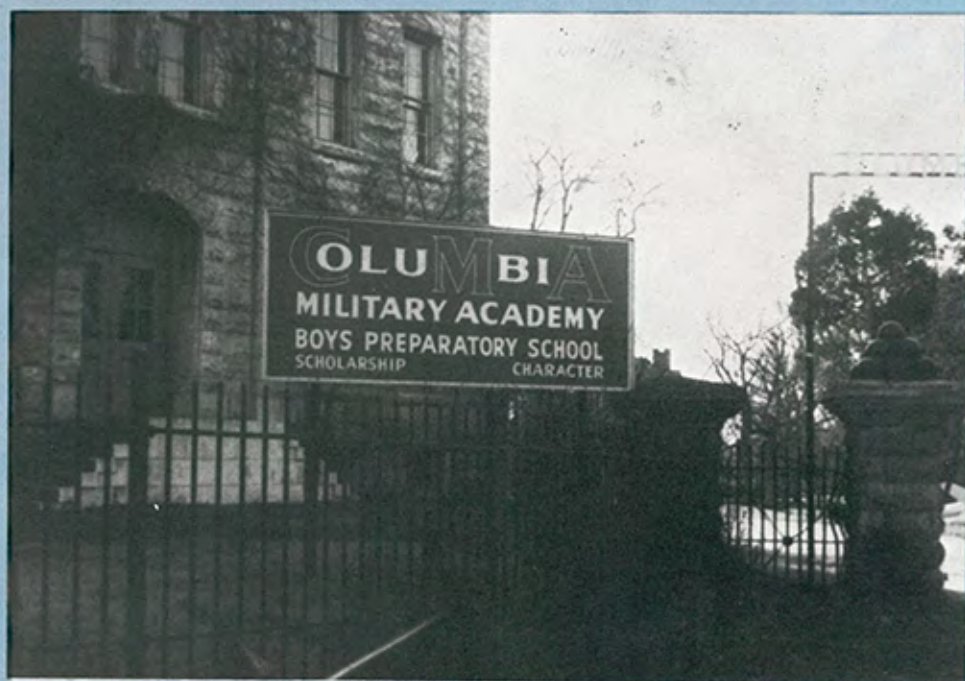

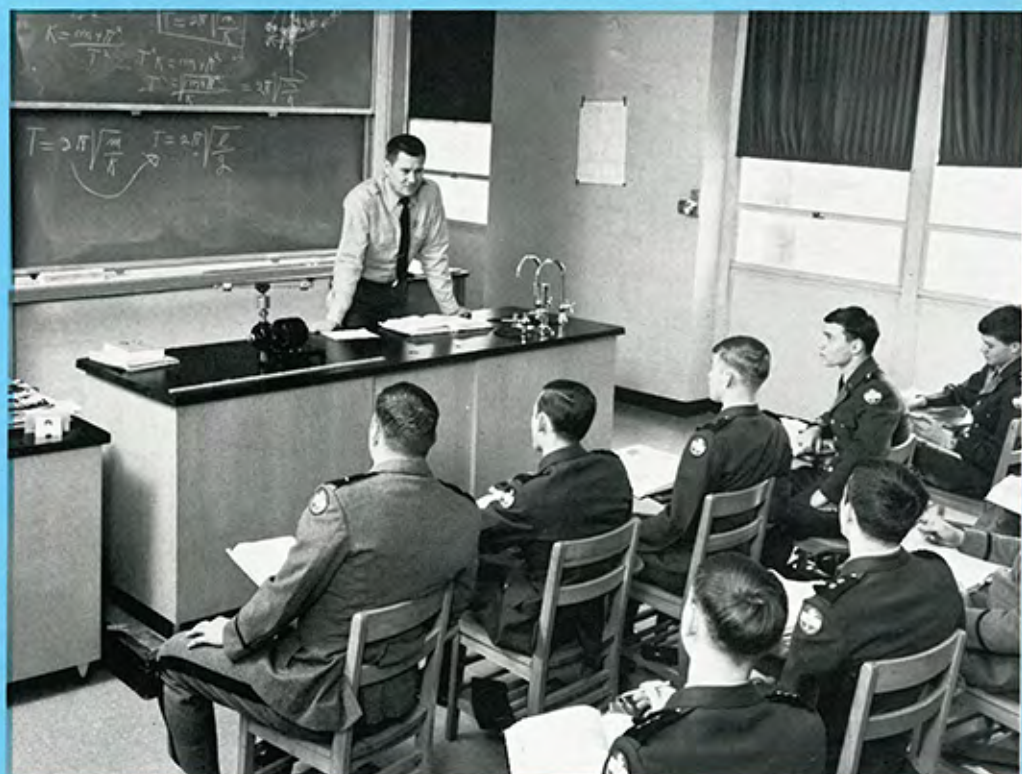

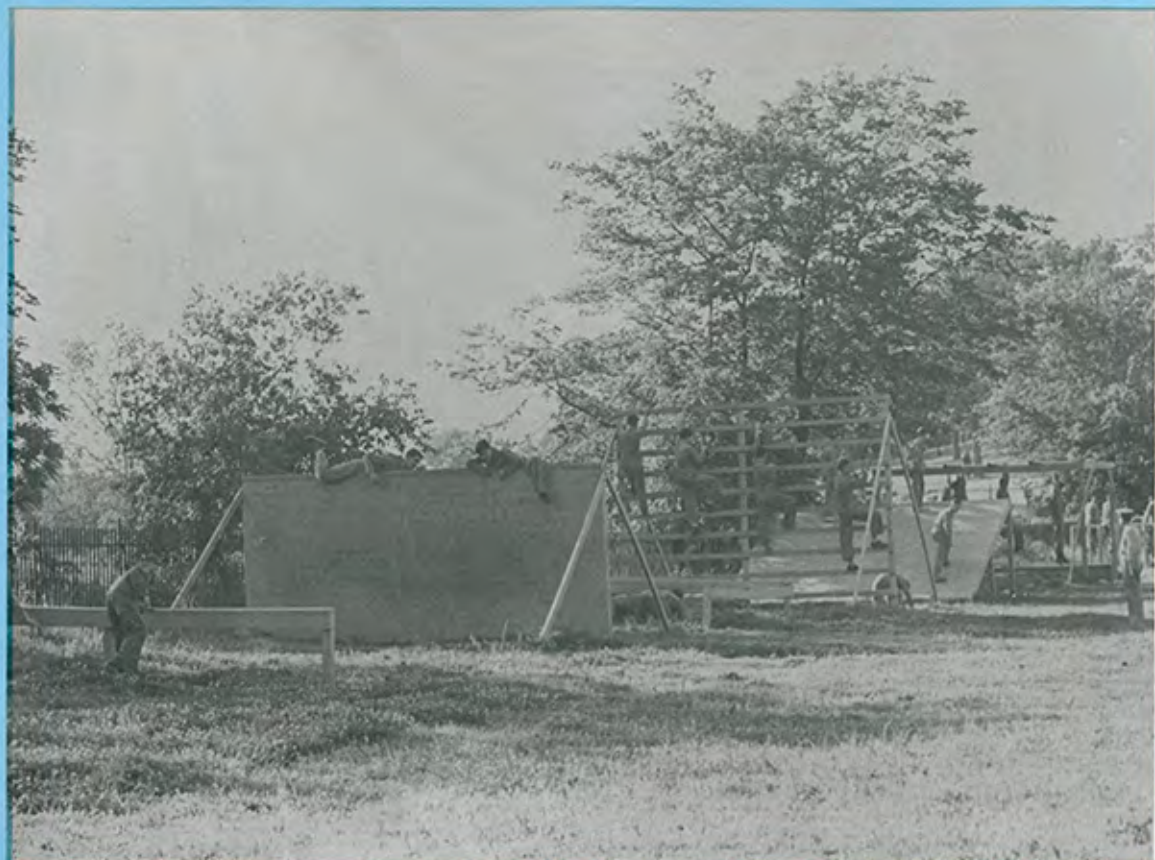
Blocker would frequently and facetiously lead a listener to believe that his was indeed a sorry lot—if the cadets got their hair cut as they should have, he was

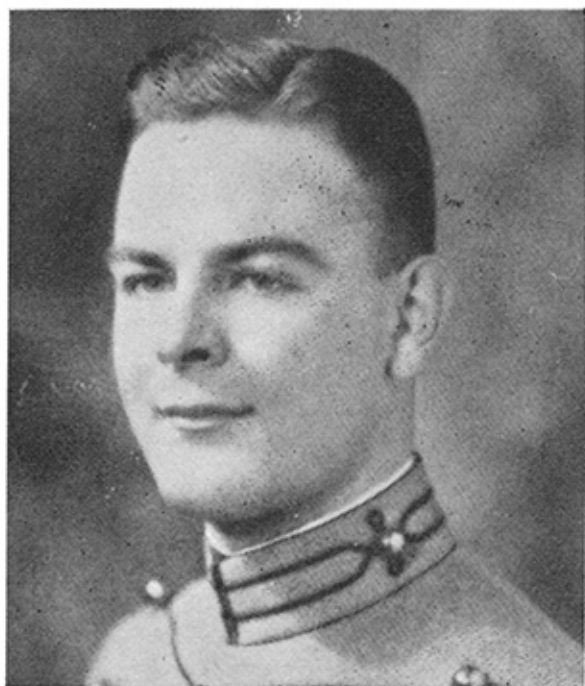

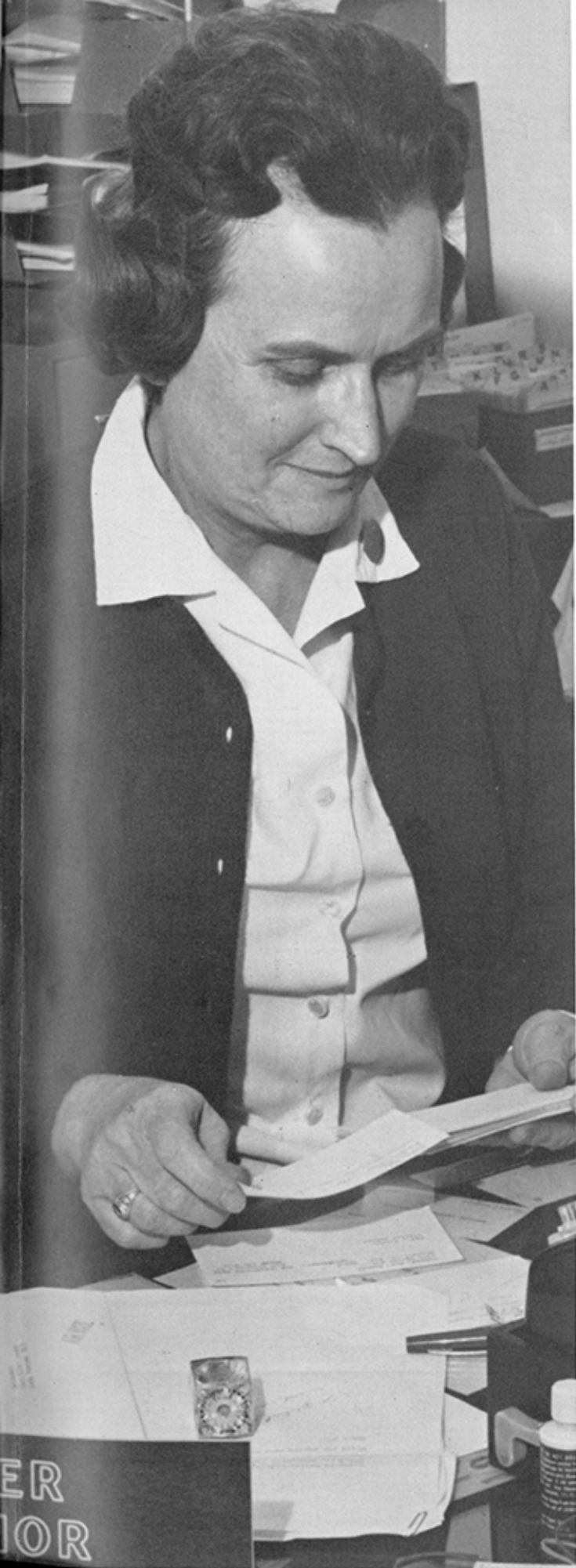

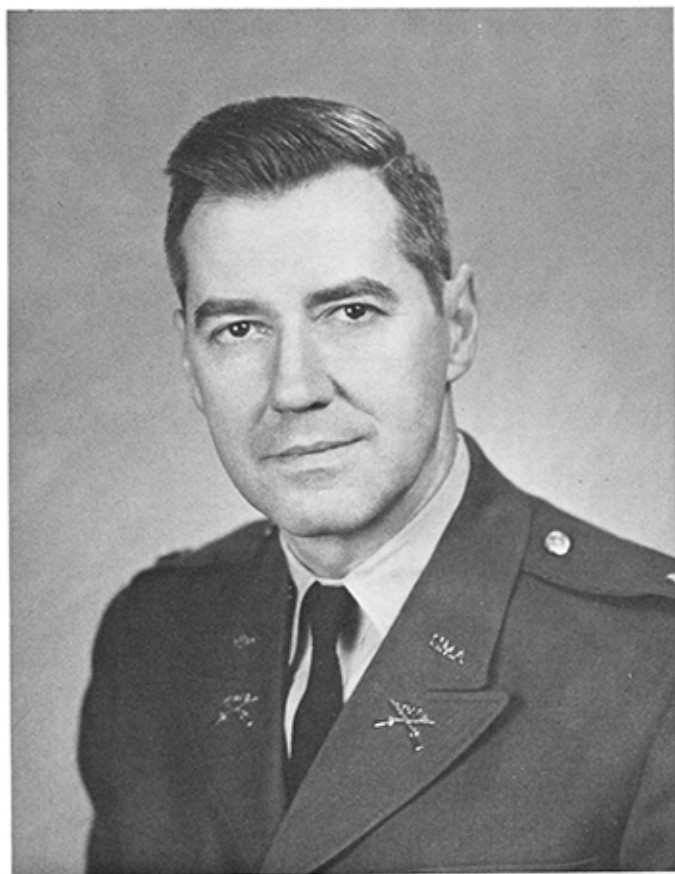

PRESIDENT

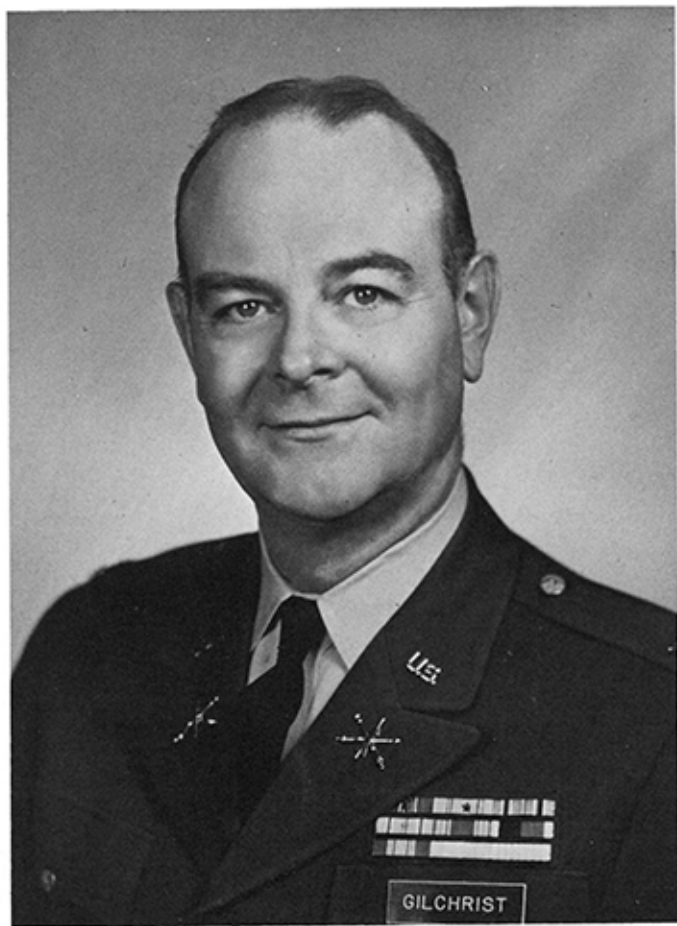

CADET STAFF

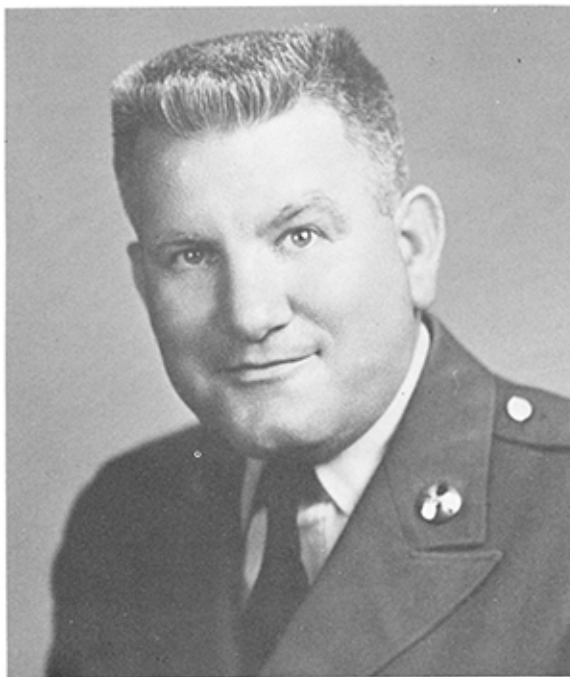
The cadet staff supervised the operations of the entire cadet corps. Cadet Col. Larry McKaig is the head of the cadet staff with the position of Battalion Commander.

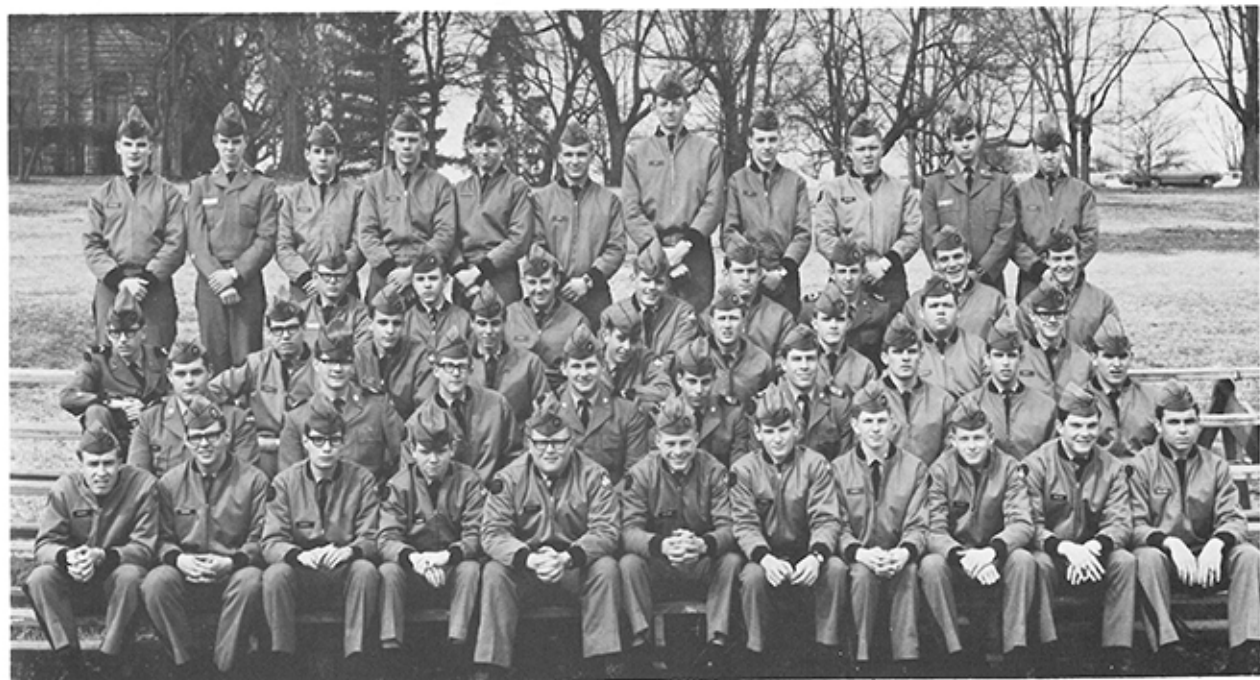

RIFLE TEAM

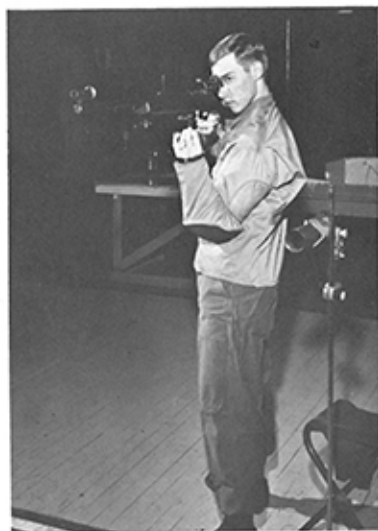

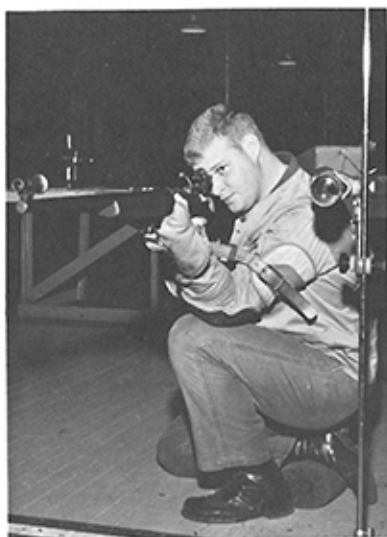

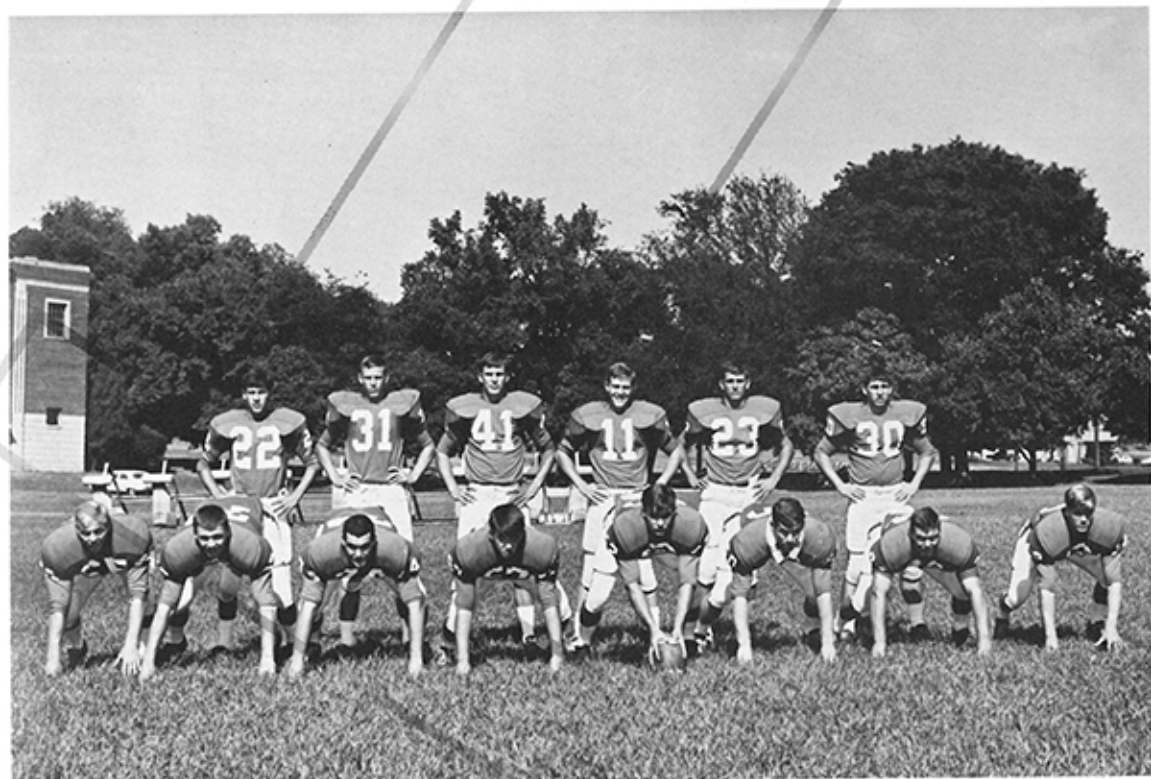

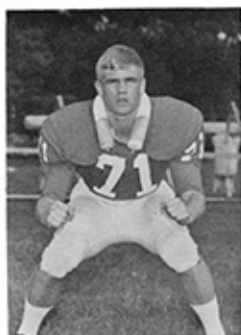
C.M.A. LYNCHES LYNCHBURG 15-6

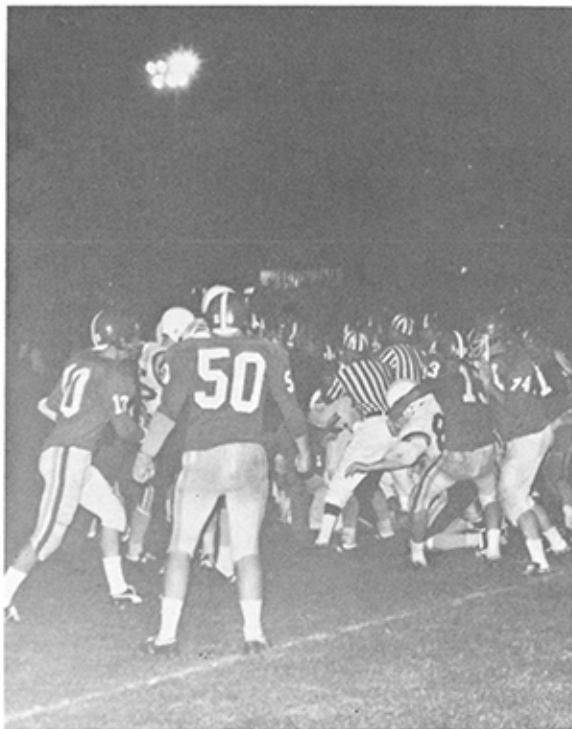

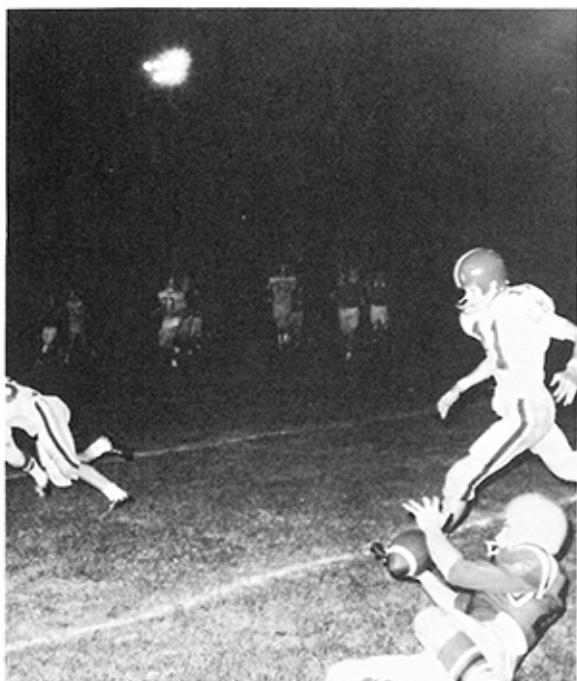

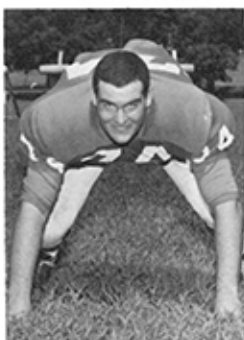


BULLDOGS BLANK HEIGHTS 19-0
