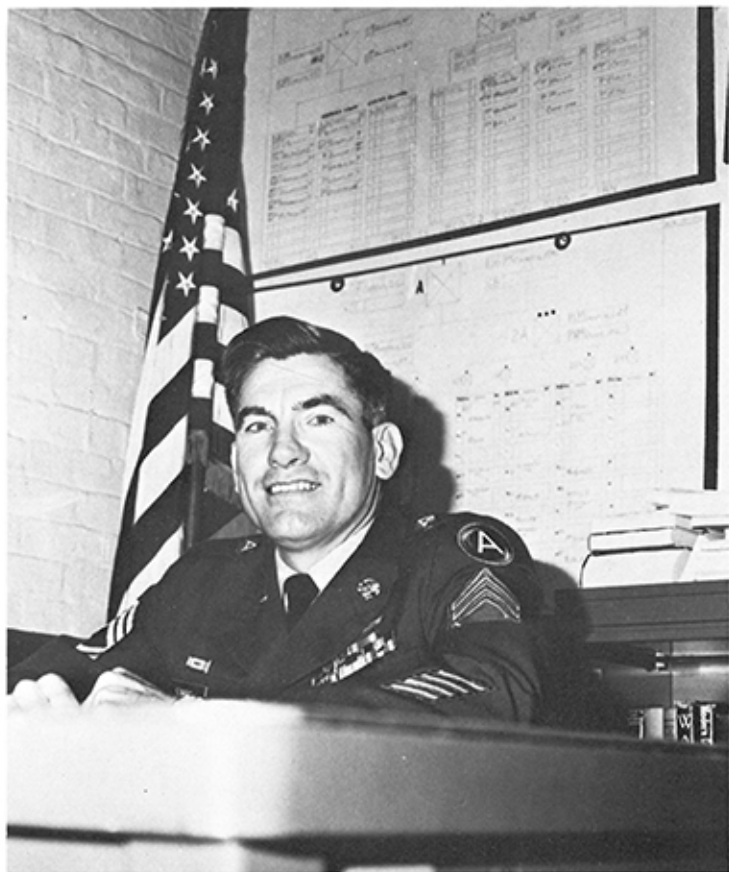




MILITARY DEPARTMENT

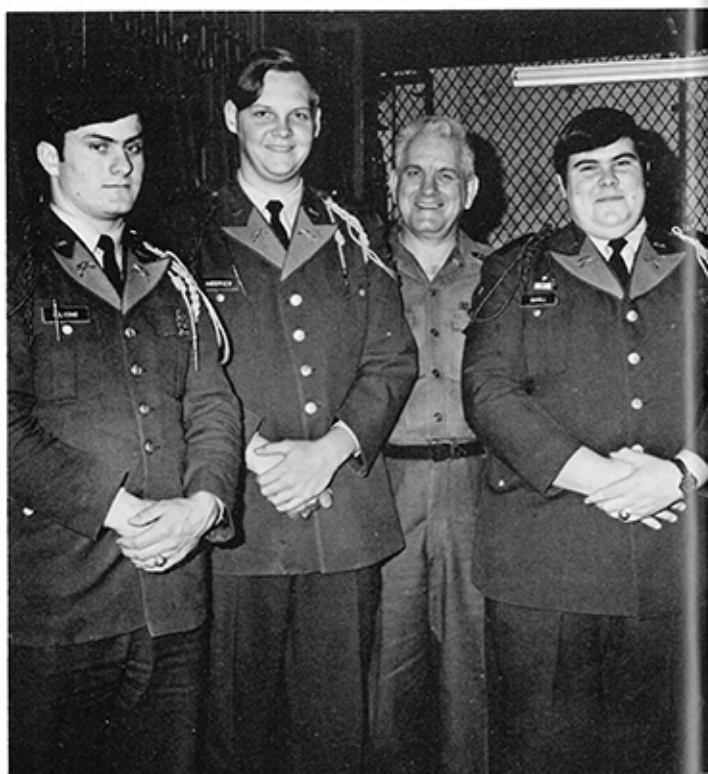

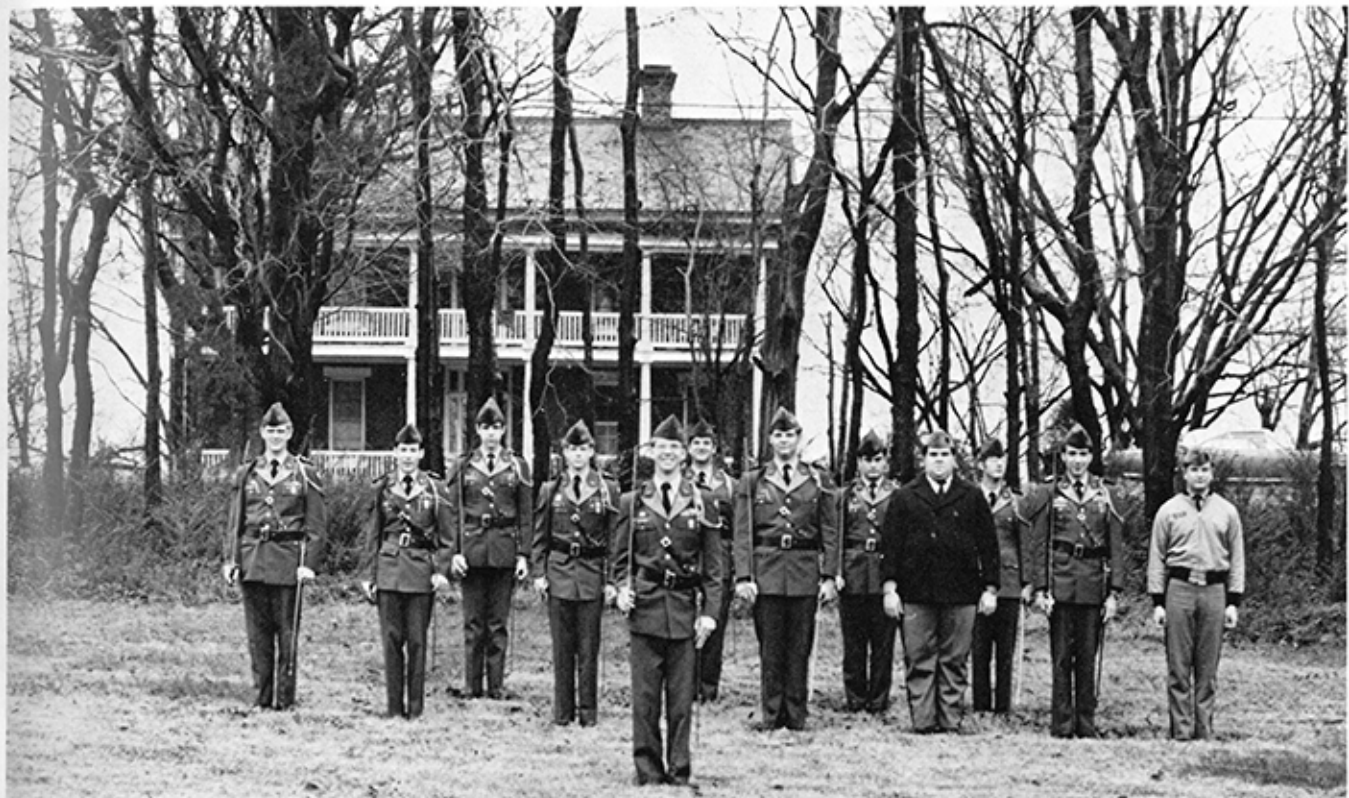
ARMORY STAFF

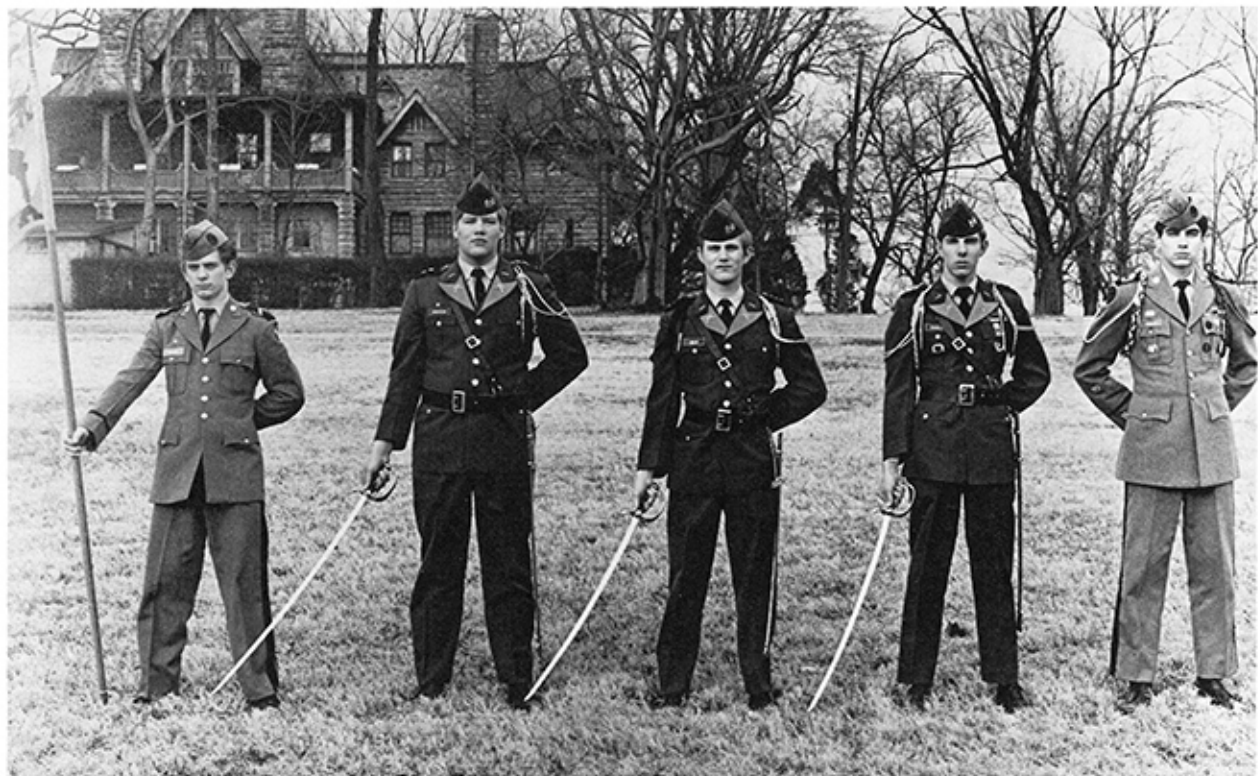

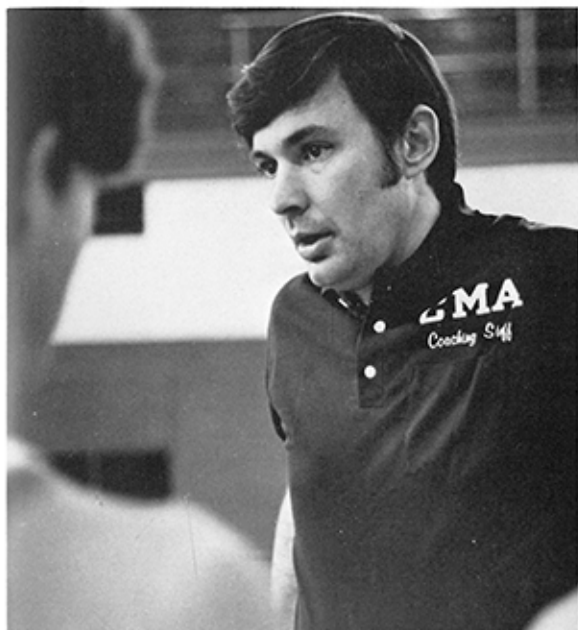


BASKETBALL

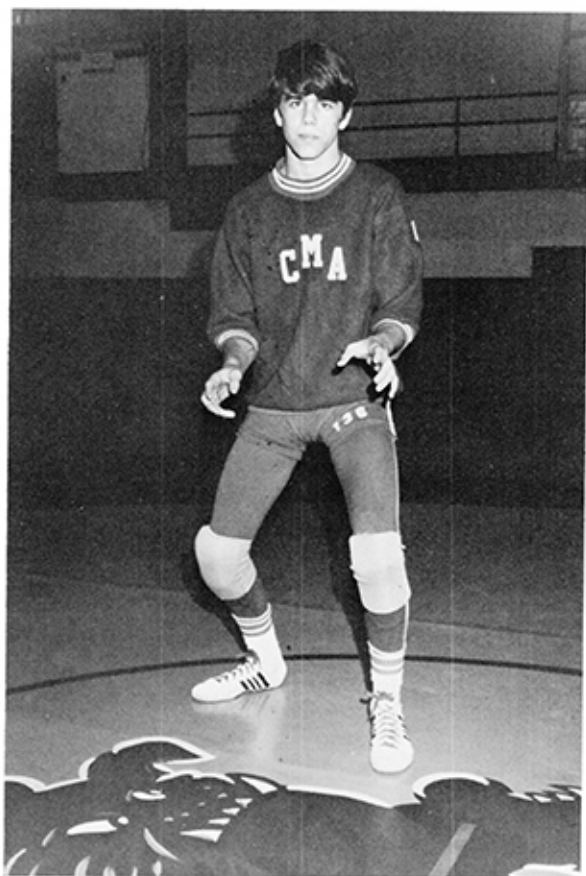

DRAMA CLUB

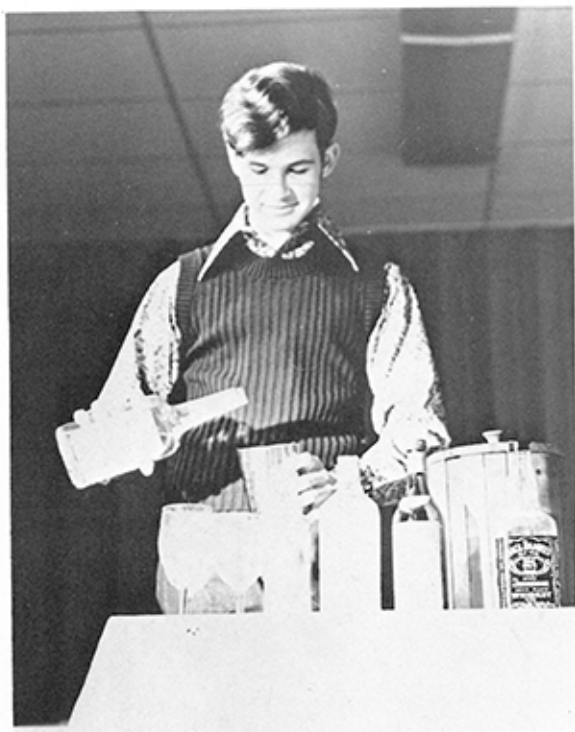

This is the honor that every student at CMA should strive for, because it represents outstanding leadership, scholastic achievement, and personality.



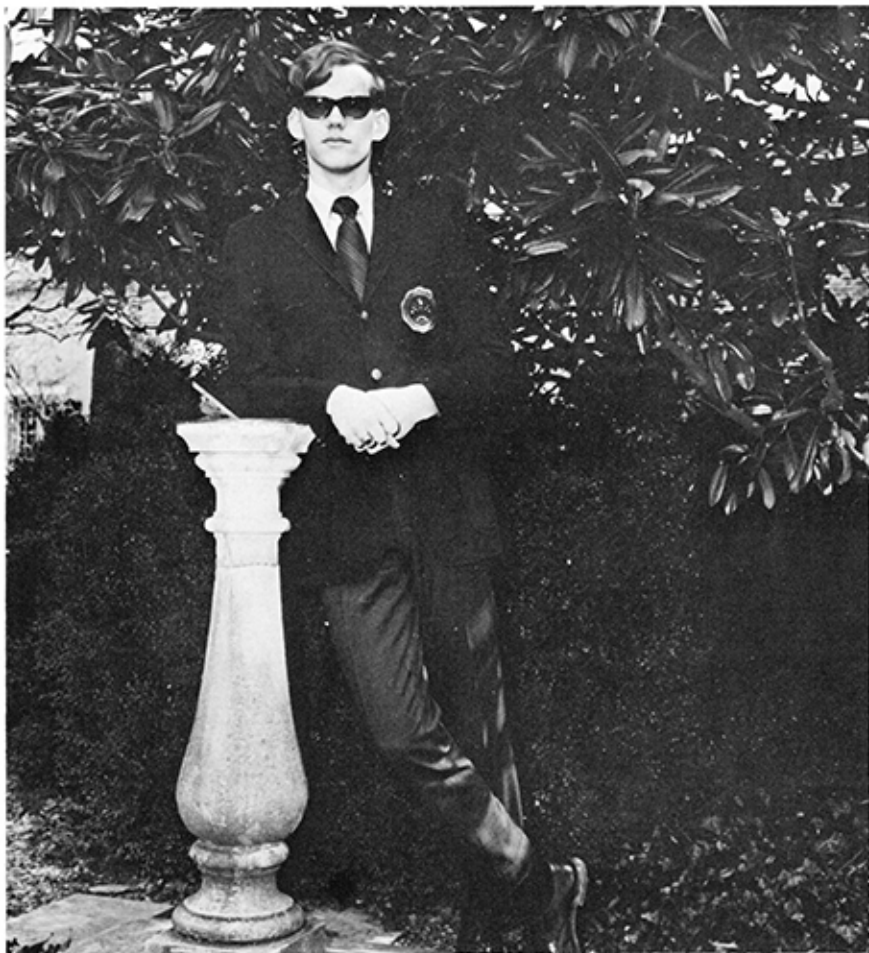


HALL OF FAME
