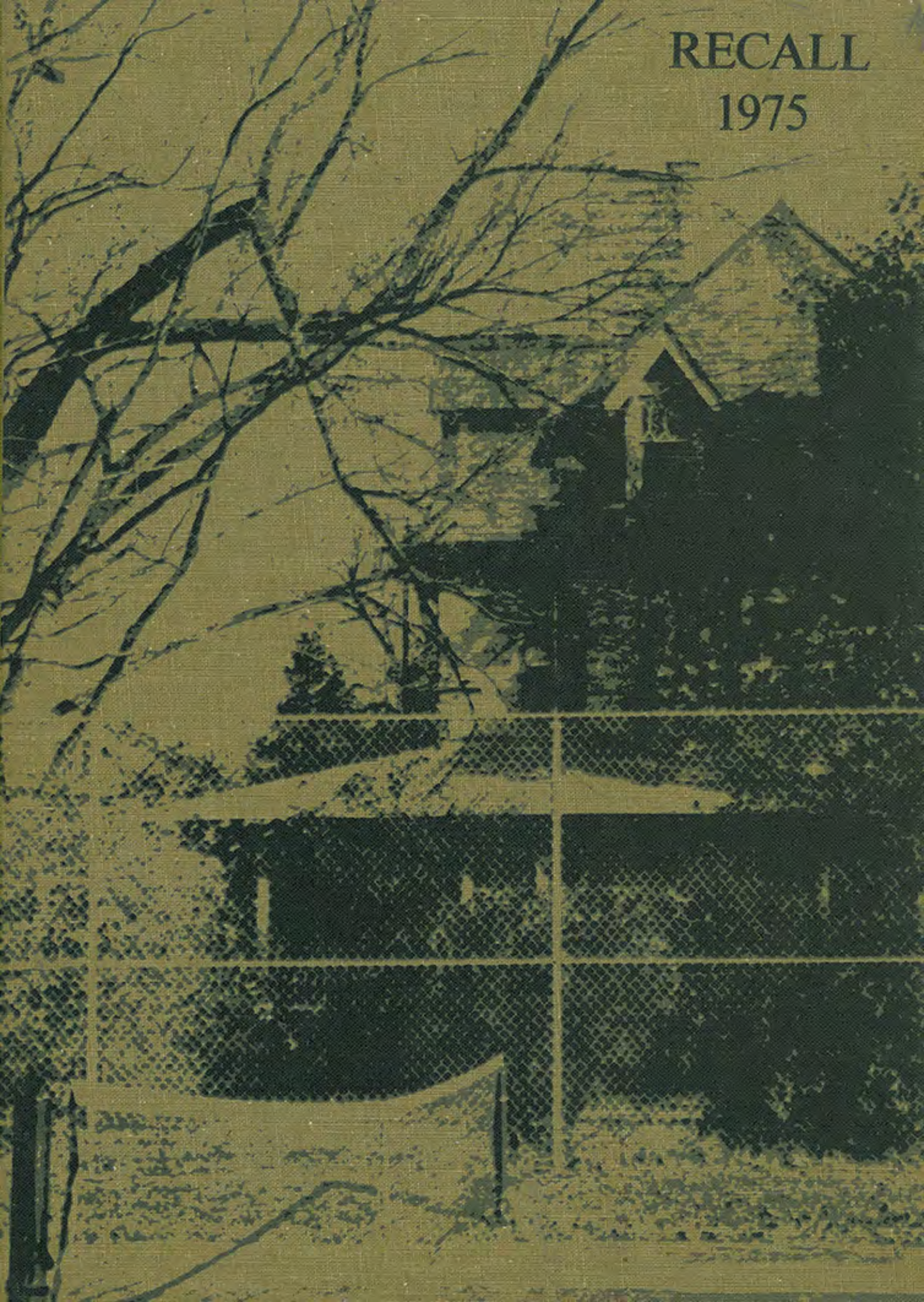

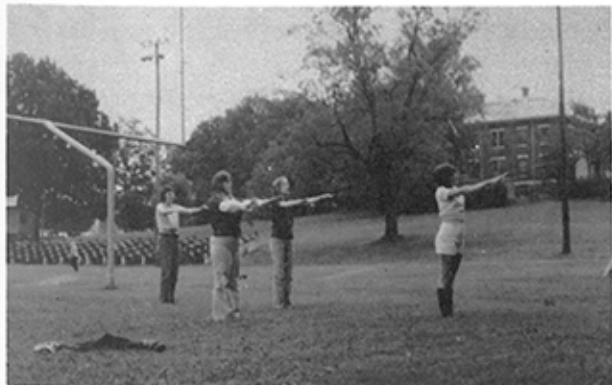

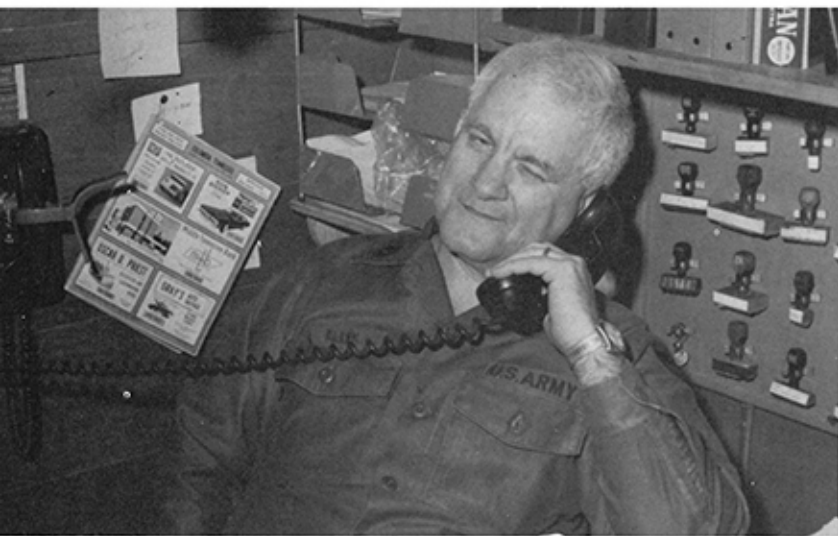
DEDICATION

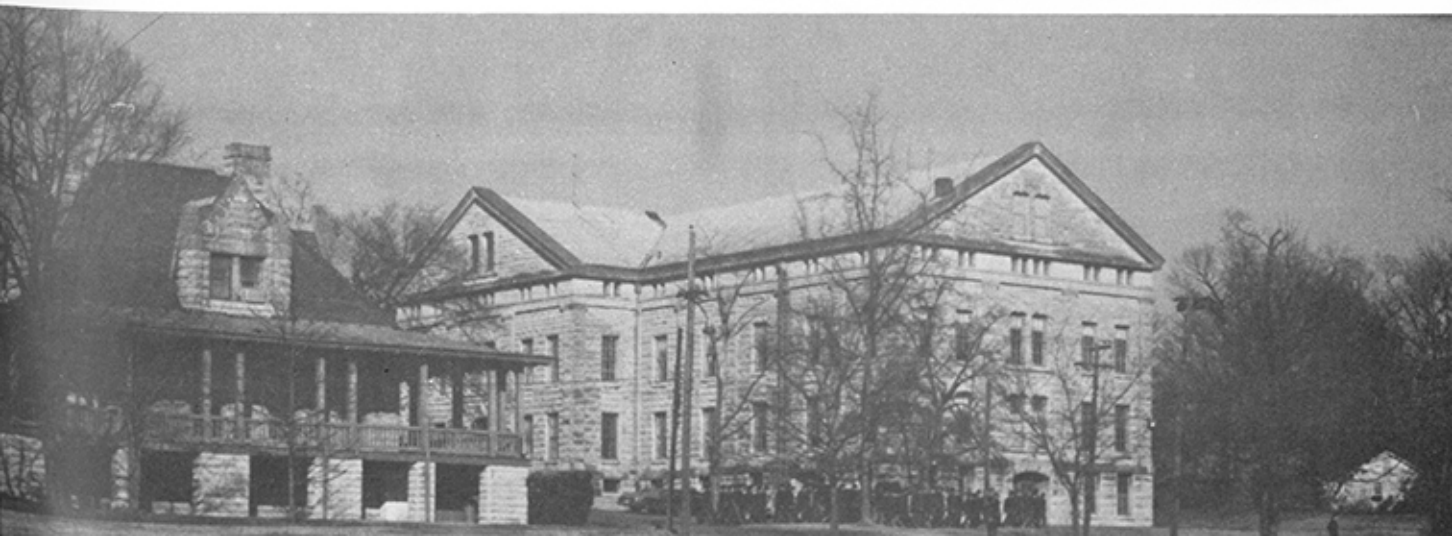
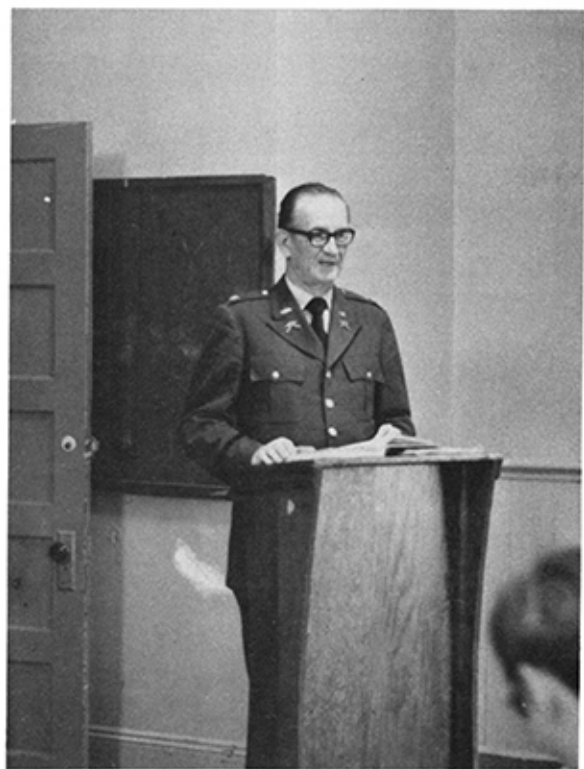

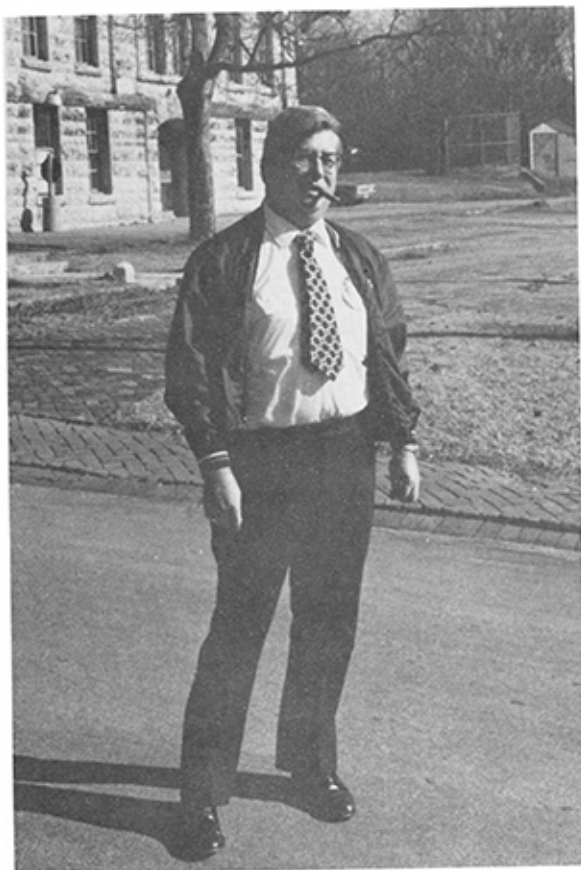
PRESIDENT AND HEADMASTER COLONEL E. BLYTHE HATCHER

ARMORY STAFF

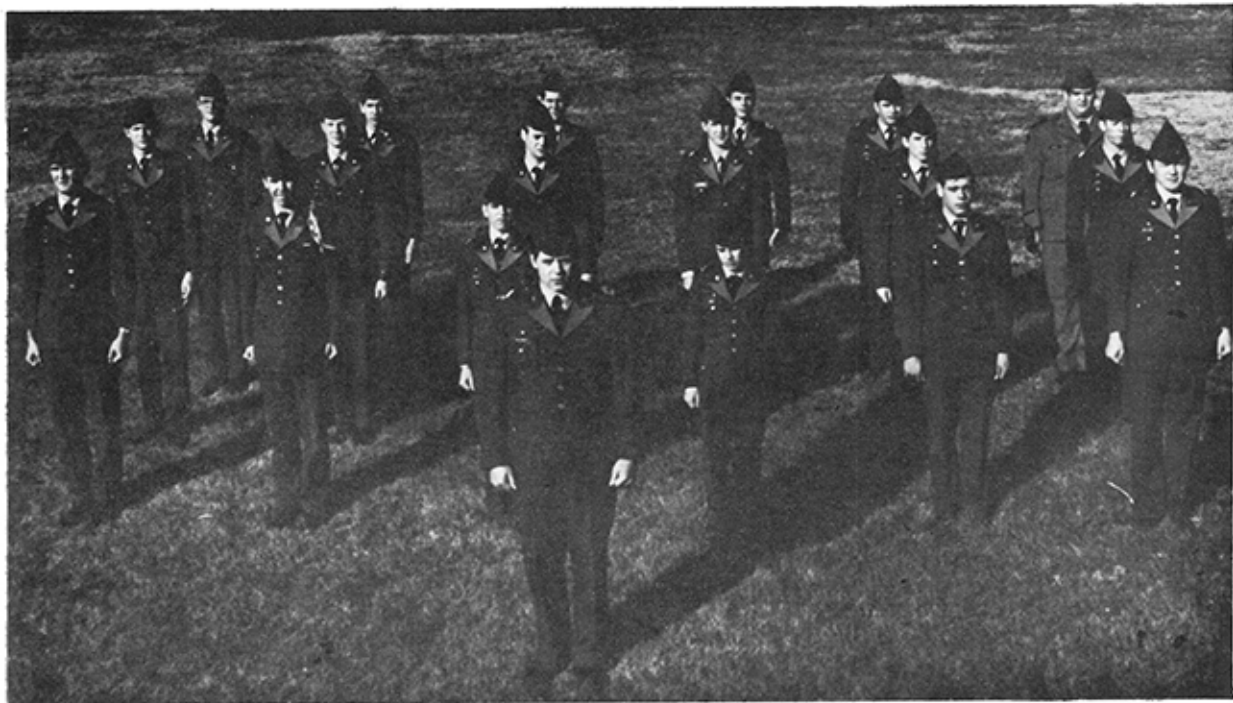

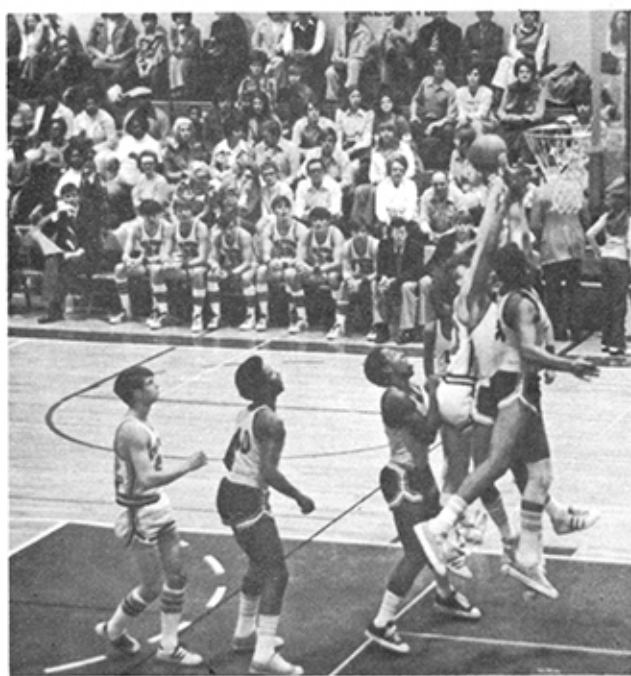

RECALL

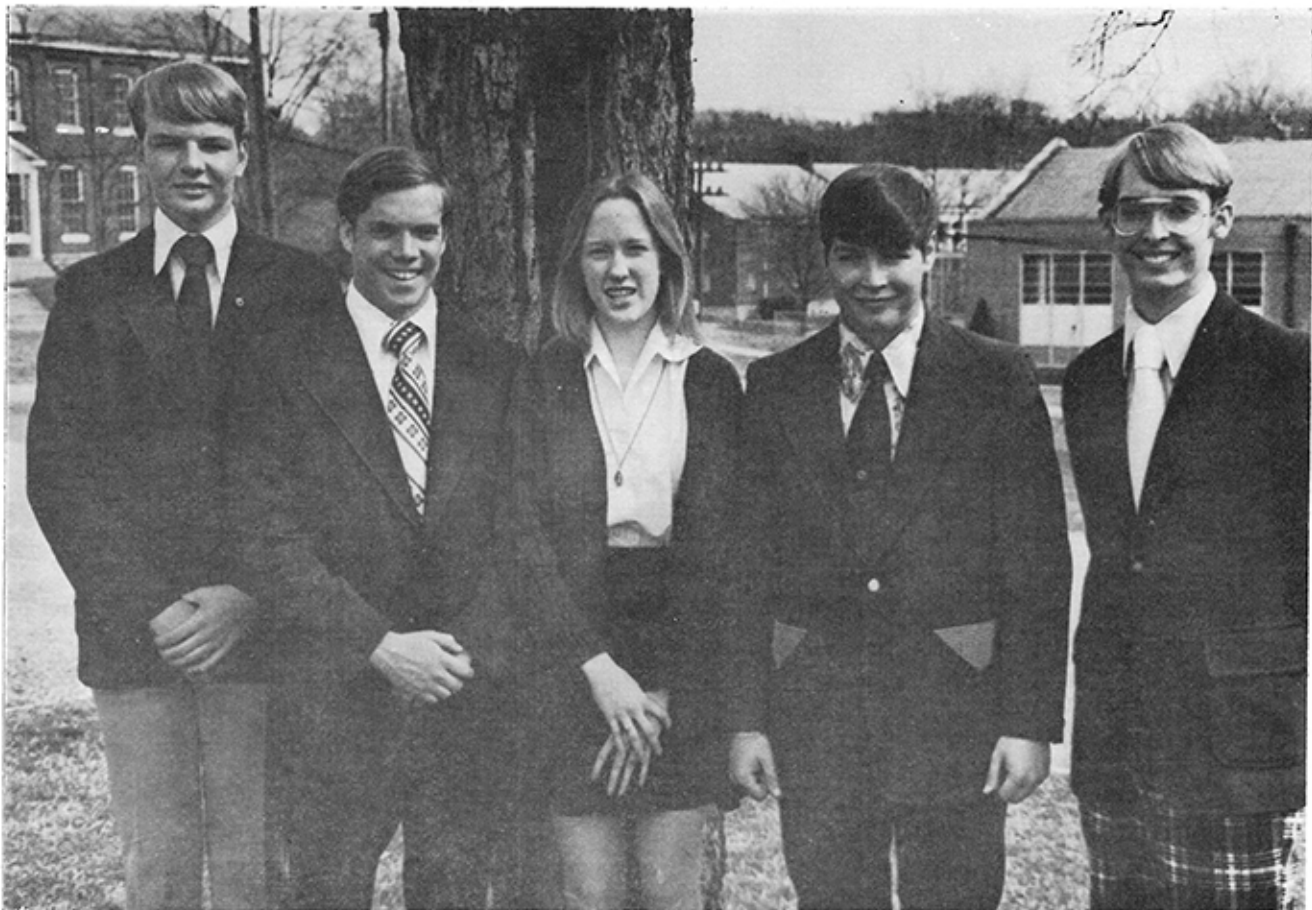
For the past few years, the CMA annual, RECALL, has been the object of many verbal attacks, some justified, others groundless. The small group who receive these attacks is the RECALL staff.
