



Academics



VALEDICTORIAN

Ralph Alvin Cover of Columbia, Tennessee, with an average of 98.12, achieved the highest academic honor attainable at Columbia Military Academy: that of being named valedictorian of the 1961 graduating class. During the four years he has attended C.M.A., Ralph has distinguished himself in many phases of school life. He won the class medals in his sophomore and junior years, the science medals in biologly and chemistry, and the medal in journalism. A member of the Efficiency Company one year and a winner of the Good Conduct Award three years, he has always been in the top ten per cent of his military class. He has attained the rank of Captain, Battle Group S-2. Ralph played varsity tennis during his senior year. He has been editor-in-chief of the Bugle Call for the past two years, being the first junior in the history of the Academy named to that position. He has served as a member of the RECALL staff for two years, this year as an associate editor. Ralph is a National Merit Scholarship finalist, was elected to the Academy's Hall of Fame, and was voted the one "Most Likely to Succeed" by his classmates.



SALUTATORIAN

James Rush Freeman, III, of Savannah, Tennessee, in being named salutatorian of the graduating class of 1961, has been awarded one of the highest scholastic distinctions conferred by Columbia Military Academy. In addition, in being appointed to the post of Battle Group Commander, he has earned the highest military honor attainable at C.M.A. His service in this capacity was so exemplary that he became the first cadet in the history of C.M.A. to attain the rank of Colonel. His scholastic standing and his rare leadership ability have combined to make him one of the most outstanding students in the school. In his freshman year Jimmy won the Class Medal and the General Science Medal; in his Sophomore year he won the Math Medal. In the military field, Jimmy was chosen "Superior Cadet" in his Military Science I and 2, and was awarded the Association of the United States Army Medal as the oustanding Junior in his Military Science 3; he was a member of Efficiency Company one year and commanded the Best Drilled Squad at Commencement. He earned the Good Conduct Award for two years. He served as Vice-President of his Freshman class, treasurer of the Y.M.C.A. in his Junior year, and was a member of the band and third baseman on the baseball team for three years. Jimmy was elected to the Hall of Fame and voted "Mr. C. M. A." by his classmates.




SCHOLARSHIP BADGE




