Col. Malcolm F. Gilchrist, Jr., B.S., M.A.





Gilchrist has served in a variety of Command and Staff positions which included Command of an Artillery Battalion during W.W. II; Assistant Chief of Staff, G-1, of U. S. Armed Forces in Korea; served in the Pentagon for four years as Secretary of the General Staff, U. S. Sixth U. S. Army; Chief of Plans U. S. Army Forces Far East, Eighth U. S. Army. In 1961, Col. Gilchrist joined the North American Air Defense Command as Assistant Deputy for Operations and Chief of Staff in charge of Plans and Operations, 28th NORAD Region, Hamilton Air Force Base, California. Col. Gilchrist has been President of Columbia Military Academy since June of 1962.







The Junior Civitans are closely connected with the Columbia Civitans. The faculty advisor is Major A. C. Howell, who is a member of the Columbia chapter.






Nick Owens and Bill Edwards both started as centers. Edwards moved from second string to press strongly as top rebounder and was a consistent scorer.

The Varsity Team finished the season with a 2-21 record. Major William B. Wade is coach of the group.









C. M. A.'s "B" team basketball has met with a little more successful season than has the Varsity.


After finishing up a very successful year, the Wrestling Team contends that seven cadets, in particular, definitely lended their best to aid the grapplers in all competition.

Coached by Major Laurence Murphy, the wrestling Team finished their season on February 17.




This year's Cross Country Team made a determined effort to take the Mid-South, but was hampered with a shortage of returning runners.

C. M. A.'s chapter of the National Honor Society was granted in 1961 and was solicited by Lt. Col. Eugene Towles, faculty advisor of the group.


