




Colonel Trimmer came to CMA in 1964, following his retirement from a twenty year stint in the army. Since that time he has served the school in a great many capacities, including the teaching of algebra, Director of Admissions, supervisor of the school's physical plant, and even serving as the prime organizer of the colorful new mounted color guard which performed during this year's football games.

After graduating from Dennison, Ohio as Valedictorian, he enrolled at Ohio State. He then received an appointment to West Point, graduating from there in June 1944. Thus, began the long journey of his military career.

During the Second World War, he served a tour in Germany and later served with a Peace Team at Tsinan, China. In 1948, he was assigned as Aide-de-Camp to the Commanding General of the Yokohama Commanding in Japan. In 1954, he was assigned to the G-3 Section, Headquarters, Far East Command, at Zama, Japan.

Returning to the States, he worked as Personnel Staff Officer, Deputy Chief of Staff, at the Pentagon. During his tour of duty there, he was responsible for policy and awards, Heraldry, flags and ceremonies, and customs of the Army.


After a years duty in Korea, he was assigned Battalion Commander at Fort Devon, Massachusetts. He served there until 1964, when he retired from the Army with twenty years of service behind him.

Colonel Trimmer is the father of three children. His oldest daughter is married and living in Beaverton, Oregon. He has a son in college, and his younger daughter is in grade school.

Colonel Trimmer enjoys horses, and loves reading American history. He also continues to pursue his first love—watching football.

Emphasis is on safety, according to N.R.A. and U.S. Army marksmanship rules.

















BASKETBALL

Although the 1971-72 basketball team was unable to compile a winning season, they did prove that a team with spirit and hustle is only seen in a team with pride.




Mr. CMA is the model of what all cadets should aspire to be. It is, to say the least, a truely great honor to be chosen Mr. CMA.



VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTORIAN


